SERMON TEXT- Luke 2:1-20

¹In those days a decree went out from Emperor Augustus that all the world should be registered. ²This was the first registration & was taken while Quirinius was governor of Syria. ³ All went to their own towns to be registered. ⁴ Joseph also went from the town of Nazareth in Galilee to Judea, to the city of David called Bethlehem, because he was descended from the house & family of David. 5 He went to be registered with Mary, to whom he was engaged & who was expecting a child. ⁶ While they were there, the time came for her to deliver her child. ⁷ And she gave birth to her firstborn son & wrapped him in bands of cloth, & laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn. 8 In that region there were shepherds living in the fields, keeping watch over their flock by night. ⁹Then an angel of the Lord stood before them, & the glory of the Lord shone around them, & they were terrified. ¹⁰But the angel said to them, "Do not be afraid; for see—I am bringing you good news of great joy for all the people: 11 to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is the Messiah, the Lord. 12 This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth & lying in a manger." 13 And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host, praising God & saying, ¹⁴"Glory to God in the highest heaven, & on earth peace among those whom he favors!" 15 When the angels had left them & gone into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go now to Bethlehem & see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." 16 So they went with haste & found Mary & Joseph, & the child lying in the manger. ¹⁷When they saw this, they made known what had been told them about this child; ¹⁸ and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds told them. 19 But Mary treasured all these words & pondered them in her heart. ²⁰ The shepherds returned, glorifying & praising God for all they had heard & seen, as it had been told them.

- 1. Review Matthew 1:8-21, 2:13-23 (cf. 13:53-58; Mark 6:3). Be sure to read your Bible's study notes, too. What do you learn about St. Joseph? What did the patriarch Joseph have to do with Egypt & how is he a model for Joseph & Jesus? Skim Genesis 37-50, esp. 45:4-8
- 2. Why might God send the angels to poor shepherds & not the powerful elite? See 2 Samuel 7:8, 16; Isaiah 61:1-3a; Jeremiah 23:1-6; Matthew 5:1-12, 11:25; John 1:29, 35-36, (10:11, 14-15); 2 Corinthians 4:3-4

- 3. The fulfillment of the Christmas promises points to the coming fulfillment of Jesus' return (*Titus 2:13*). How can you be ready for action like St. Jospeh in body & spirit, heart & mind?

- 6. Many folks find great comfort & encouragement attending Easter & Christmas worship (& family events) despite their absence the remainder of the year; how can you be a gracious, grateful host & not a guilt tripper?
