

KNOW What To Do . . .

If your sewer backs up, you notice a strong sewer odor or see water and debris spilling out of a cleanout:

Please help us protect our environment. If you notice any of the above **Call Us FIRST** at (408) 253-7071 and stop using water in your home. We will dispatch a CuSD inspector out to your site to assess the situation and determine where the backup problem is occurring. If the blockage is within CuSD's main line then we will clear it out for you at no additional charge. For after hours sewer issues call (408) 299-2507.

Before you dig:

If you or a hired contractor are planning on digging for any reason call 811 **BEFORE** you pick up a shovel so that all underground pipes can be marked. In the event a pipeline is hit or you smell gas, move away from the escaping gas and immediately call 911.

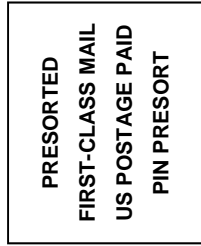
Before you begin any sewer construction:

CuSD is a Special District separate from the City of Cupertino. Our Operations Code is specific to sanitary sewer requirements and regulations. In order to ensure proper sewer installation please contact our office before you begin any sewer construction. (408) 253-7071.

If someone knocks on your door:

We care about your safety. Never open your door to a stranger. Always ask the person to identify themselves and show proper ID. All District sewer service is done outside the home and our CuSD inspectors will never enter your home or backyard without permission from an adult. To find out if we are doing work in your area call our office at (408) 253-7071.

If someone knocks on your door and fails to provide proper ID or is acting suspicious, or if you see a suspicious vehicle in your neighborhood immediately report it to the Sheriff's office at (408) 299-2311.

Our Mission:

To protect the public health and environment. To provide for safe and cost-efficient collection of sewage waste. To provide for effective conveyance to the Treatment Plant.

We are pleased to present this Annual Report of the Cupertino Sanitary District (CuSD) recognizing almost 60 years of service to over 23,000 customers within the communities of Cupertino, portions of Saratoga, Sunnyvale, Los Altos and unincorporated areas within Santa Clara County.

CuSD covers approximately 15 square miles, serving a population of over 50,000 people with more than 23,000 residential and business units. The District owns and manages over 1 million lineal feet of sewer mains, 0.5 million lineal feet of sewer laterals, 17 pump stations, 4000 manholes and flushing inlets, and one equipment storage facility. CuSD conveys nearly 5 million gallons of waste-water daily from our customers for treatment at the San Jose/Santa Clara Regional Wastewater Facility.

CuSD's collection system, much of which is more than 50 years old, has been maintained proactively with regular cleaning and development of a Capital Improvement Program (CIP) aimed at improving efficiency as well as extending its useful service life.

Notable Accomplishments in 2012-2013:

1. Serviced 165 miles of sewer mains
2. Serviced 5 miles of sewer laterals
3. Completed 1,000 feet of repairs
4. Completed District Flow Monitoring

NO FATS, OILS, AND GREASE (F.O.G.) -

Up to 85% of the sewer overflows are linked to F.O.G.

TRASH IT, DON'T FLUSH IT -

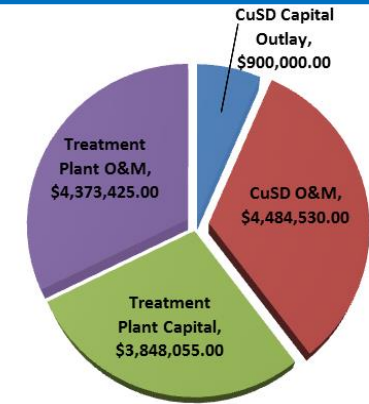
What you flush does matter. Do your part to protect water quality. Only flush toilet paper and human waste.
