Cemetery is heavily overgrown and easy to miss. This cemetery is highly endangered. It is not a map feature, and is located in a remote area on private property. The cemetery is heavily overgrown and neglected. A dilapidated barbed wire fenced partly encloses the cemetery, which contains three graves marked with stamped concrete headstones. All of the markers are damaged and fallen. There may be more, unmarked graves, but heavy vegetation obscures visibility. The cemetery is threatened by encroaching logging, which completely surrounds the cemetery.

This is a well maintained, fully fenced, active cemetery. It is a map feature and is located on a public road. There is a cemetery sign posted at intersection of CR 4600 and CR 4605.

At fork stay to the right and continue for another 1.5 miles. Turn left at PR 6720 and go to house at end of road. Cemetery is approximately 0.5 mile due west of house, on hilltop. This cemetery is located on private property, approximately 1.0 mile west of CR 2670. The cemetery is a map feature and is fully fenced. The cemetery contains unmarked graves and numerous fieldstone markers. There is a newer granite marker at the southwest corner of the cemetery. The inscription reads: Barclay In Memory of Anderson Edward 1807-1870s. Sarah Ann (Prather) 1815-1860s Veteran of the Battles of Bexar and San Jacinto. (Exact Location Unknown). Local informants believe the graves of Barclay and his wife are located at the center of the cemetery and are marked by a large cedar stump and two fieldstone footstones. The cedar stump is the only marker tree in this cemetery. The adjacent land owner regularly maintains the cemetery and is very concerned about its preservation. He stated that someone in the past had damaged and displaced many of the grave markers with tractor and bushhog. The cemetery is currently threatened by encroaching logging.

Turn right onto FM 3065 and go 4.5 miles south. Turn left onto CR 3130 and go 0.1 mile east. (CR 3130 is located just north of a house with distinctive copper-colored roof). Turn right onto a PR 7130 and go through gate. Just beyond the gate the road forks. Take the left fork and continue for 0.4 mile. At this point the road forks again. Stay to the right and follow the road uphill for 0.5 miles. The cemetery is located behind a private residence on the hilltop. The cemetery is fully fenced, but is heavily overgrown and neglected. The entrance is on the west side of cemetery. The cemetery contains the graves of John Bean, his wife, and four of their children. There may be unmarked graves as well. Three cast concrete headstones that mark the graves of the Bean Children are heavily eroded, and the inscriptions are no longer legible. John Bean's headstone and the headstone of his daughter are broken and displaced. During the survey, the property surrounding the cemetery was for sale.

When logging road comes to sharp bend, park and walk approx. 303 ft. northeast. This cemetery is highly endangered. It is not a map feature and is located in a remote area on private property. To access the cemetery, one must travel on narrow, winding logging roads that may be impassible at times. The cemetery is threatened by encroaching logging, hunting, and neglect. The cemetery is enclosed by a dilapidated barbed wire fence and is heavily overgrown. Cemetery features include formal granite and marble makers, locally cast concrete markers, and sandstone fieldstone markers. Many of the graves are only marked by cedar trees, which many have died and only the stumps remain. The locally cast concrete markers are heavily eroded and no longer legible. A cast iron ornamental fence encloses the Ben Davis Family plot.

Continue 0.3 mile to the end of this road and park. Three graves are located approx. 175 ft. south of road, on west bank of small creek. The three graves are located on a heavily wooded creek bank and are very difficult to find. The cemetery is not a map feature. It is not fenced, and there are no signs indicating a cemetery at this location. During the survey, several very large pines had fallen across the graves, hiding them from view. There are three granite headstones and at least two metal funeral markers. One headstone could not be read due to a large pine that had fallen across the stone. It is not a map feature and is located in a remote area on private property. To access the cemetery, one must travel on narrow, winding logging roads that may be impassible at times. The cemetery is surrounded by recent logging. It is not fenced and is heavily overgrown. Loggers have placed survey flagging around the perimeter of the cemetery to mark the approximate boundaries. Cemetery features include formal markers, fieldstone markers, and conch shell decorations.

A fourth, more recent grave is located under the shed-roof addition.
