





The annual combined Watch Night Service for Grafton Baptist Church and Rising sun Baptist Church was held December 31, 2013 at Grafton Baptist Church.


Rev. David Spratley, Pastor of Rising Sun Baptist Church, along with his choir and congregation rendered the service.


At Sister Robinson's home we sang traditional carols, read scripture and had prayer. It was a very uplifting service.
