
The **Night Baptist Women's Group** would like to thank everyone who helped with our November 30th

Music-related things you may possibly observe in 2017 at PBC:

1a. New Hymns with relative

themes. There are many things I love about the Baptist Hymnal we use. I think we can honestly say that we sing 50% of it within every few years, and that's pretty good. However, as a worship leader, there are some voids I wish to fill. For example, there are 20-something hymns that speak to receiving forgiveness from God, but only one (to my knowledge) about the necessity of forgiving each other. I could choose probably one hymn a week without repeating that says how God loves us. I would be hard-pressed to find one per season that encourages us to love one another (as God has loved us). There are hymns out there, and to balance our message through song, we need to sing them! I'm hoping for one such hymn per month, but it may be every other month.

1b. New Hymns to Old Tunes. Not all hymns will be completely new. There are lots of hymn lyrics set to meters that fit hymn tunes we already know. For example, did you know that besides "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee" - not only is that melody used for 2 other hymns in the Baptist Hymnal, but you

could also fit the lyrics from 31 other hymns to that tune. Try this just for fun. Sing "What a Friend We Have in Jesus" to the tune of "Joyful, Joyful, We Adore Thee". Just to be fair, flip it around with "What a Friend" the tune and "Joyful" as the words. We can introduce much new while still knowing what to sing.

- **2. Favorite Hymns** If I'm asking you to be adventurous with learning new hymns, I expect to also give you your favorites. I know from surveys what you really want to sing, and will do my best to get them into worship more often.
- **3. The Return of Hymn Medleys** There are many ways I reveal myself not to be a native North Carolinian, and one is that it's hard for me to maintain the discipline of a tradition. For whatever reason, hymn medleys fell by the wayside, and we only did one in 2016. Count on more in 2017.
- **4. The Return of 4th Sunday Doxologies** We're not a liturgical church that sings the Doxology every Sunday, but some of you have told me that you value at least an occasional experience. With the exception of special services, expect it on the 4th Sunday of each month once again.

What do all the above have in common? They are things you ALL get to do. The music ministry will also be planning goals and events for its groups throughout the year. Easter Music will begin rehearsal by the end of January, and we always welcome guest singers for our chorus. Stay tuned for details.
