3 Important Ways We Need To Find Our Level

Years ago I had a pastor, one who curiously links me to this area. Rev. David Morrow was the pastor at First Baptist Church, Red Springs, before he felt called to Old Town Baptist just down the road.

A few years later Rev. Morrow was invited back to FBC Red Springs to preach at a revival service. My family was glad to make the short drive to Red Springs to see and hear our friend. I remember a curious phrase Rev. Morrow used in



his sermon that night.

He said a good sermon should find its level in the same way a good stool does, with three strong legs. He reflected the homiletic style of his day, but I'll never forget that phrase. I'm not preaching in this article, but my point

needs three strong legs to find its level.

To wit: as our church faces its current challenges we need not deceive ourselves to hope in simple answers or solutions. It will take faith, perseverance and strength to find our level, and I see the three strong legs on which we must stand: faithful stewardship, renewed generosity, and commitment to outreach.

For more than a decade now, while the budgets of PBC have trended downwards the simplest solution has been to cut, cut, cut. Programs have been cut, budgets too, and even personnel. To what end? None; not one year has the "cut" mentality stemmed the tide of decline. What has not been tried, so far as I can see, is a reevaluation of our programs and activities in light of our vision. "What vision?" you ask. Exactly. **The deacons and I are currently working very hard to discern a God-sized vision for PBC** and we must be prepared as a church to align our budget in faithful stewardship of that vision.

Renewed generosity is also critical to our time. A few years ago I jumped out of a plane and landed with a sorely bruised backside. Many people think that image describes generosity, but the opposite is true. The blessings from generosity to faith are beyond description. We think we can't live without "it", but if

we understood what we gained through generosity we would know truly what is indispensable. **I** encourage each of you ask yourself if your giving is equal to the blessings in life you feel, or if you are afraid to give more because of what you'll "lose". Either way, I want more for you, and I know how you can receive it.

Finally, and this is the leg that no one seems to be thinking about, we must have a commitment to **outreach.** Two years ago I preached a New Year's sermon on the power of "one". I challenged each of you to invite one person to church during that year. Many of you simply did not, but now the time can wait no longer. Some churches struggle and other churches fail because church people fail to reach out to friends and neighbors. If we grow by twelve people this year, one person per month, it will make a world of difference in us. If we grow by 24 people this year, two per month, we will make magazine covers as one of the fastest growing churches anywhere. Invite people to church. This is a job for all of us; no one person or subset of us can do it. It will take all of us. And do not reach out so "they" can save "us". Reach out, invite, so "we" can together grow in "Him".

We now have three strong legs for our stool: faithful stewardship, renewed generosity, and commitment to outreach. With each of these efforts strong our church will stand strong. If but one of them fails our church will continue to struggle in old and new ways. I have nothing but faith we will rise to these faithful challenges. I know your hearts, your love for God, and now I believe we will together do the amazing. Will you believe, and behave, with me?


everyone to donate \$5 to help offset the cost of food. The Youth will be cooking the meal for the church.
