

Making Sense of the Rumblings



Breakfast and lunch for me are pretty boring events. I eat the exact same breakfast 19 out of 20 days, and my lunch routine is very limited, extremely limited. What I want out of breakfast and lunch is sufficient nutrition without thought. The only meal I intend to offer thought is supper.

During my thoughtless lunch today I

listened, as I usually do, to "Here and Now", an NPR news show on the radio. Most days I am introduced to at least one interesting story. Today was no different.

It seems that in Moodus, Connecticut there has been a local phenomenon that has lasted much longer than a century. In this small town in the middle of the state frequent noises have been heard that have baffled local people and scientists for hundreds of years. Recently, however, science seems to have solved the mystery.

Noises that have ranged from rumblings to rattlings to squeaks to who knows what else have actually been the audible reflection of near surface, extremely minor earthquakes. The earthquakes aren't big enough to shake things, but none-the-less create sound waves that have mystified locals forever.

The rumblings of Easter have mystified people for thousands of years.

Jesus, the amazing man from Nazareth, enters into Jerusalem on a donkey while crowds sing his praises and shower him with palm leaves. It reminds them of David, the conquering King. Rumble.

Jesus enters into the temple only to find it desecrated with greed. Angry, he trashes the place and turns the system on its head. Rattle.

Jesus leads his followers in a Passover meal, breaking with tradition to call the bread his broken body, and the wine his spilled blood, both offered willingly for his followers. Bang.

Jesus is arrested, rushed to judgment, and sentenced to die by crucifixion. After a day of horrific treatment, from the cross he asks God to forgive his tormentors. Rumble, rumble.

On the third morning, the one that verified death, Jesus' tomb was found to be empty. Angels, and then Jesus, testified of his resurrection to the ladies seeking him. Bang!

We hear these rumblings, rattlings, squeaks and bangs at Easter and we struggle to make sense of them. We think they teach us that God loves us, but how much? We think they teach us that Jesus was fully God just as he was fully human, but how so? We think they teach us that this life is important but not all there is, but how can it be? We think we know so much, but the rumblings remind us there is so much still unknown.

The residents of Moodus express disappointment with the answers science has brought. Tourists don't come to town to see an earthquake; they were fascinated by the mystery. When the mystery of the rumblings was solved, so too was the attraction negated.

As we journey through Holy Week, may we be less concerned with solving the mystery of the rumblings, and more appreciative of the message in the mystery. And may our fascination with the mysteries of God draw people far and near to the God who is both known and unknown.
