The Puzzles We Are



It's early Easter Monday morning and I'm sitting at my computer reflecting on the whole Easter experience. It seems like a tsunami of emotions. I have a recurring image in my mind I cannot escape, so maybe God is telling me to share it with you. I'll listen.

The first image is a puzzle, literally. Some of you may know I like puzzles, specifically old Springbok puzzles from the 60's. It was a golden age for puzzles that has never been matched, so I occasionally purchase one from Ebay.

A number of years ago I purchased a very collectable one. It's red. That's all, red, and round. The rows are concentric circles, and devilishly hard. Kim and I began this puzzle about four years ago. It took a while to get the border, which should give you an indication of the severity of the puzzle. From there things have gone downhill. We worked with vigor for a while, if looking and failing can be called working.

The puzzle is so hard I made a puzzle keeper out of a carpet center roll and a ton of felt. We put the puzzle on the keeper and now we roll it out when we feel defeatist. Four years on now we have completed the second circle row and have about the third one halfway finished. Lest you think we are slackers I will let **ANYone** come **ANYtime** and take a go at it. You too will see the abundant joy in *getting one or two pieces done in an hour.* Truly.

Where do you find yourself in the Easter story? We have many characters from which to choose; *they look like the expanse of humanity.* There are the disciples, all twelve of them: hardheaded, dense, selfish, confused, lazy, etc. There is the crowd: fickle and easily swayed. There are the opponents of Jesus: determined, committed, yet slightly skewed. There are the power brokers, and there are the lovers, primarily the Mary's.

If only life were so simply discernable (round pegs in round holes, square pegs in square holes) we might have perfected community and faith in geometry class. The minute we try to put ourselves in a round hole we turn square, or

triangle, or octagonal. *Our efforts are worse when we try to peg other persons.* Any effort to select a character in the Easter story to play our part is a failing effort. **We play our own part**.

Which brings me back to the puzzle, my red one. I make it through the Easter season every year and the joy of acceptance and forgiveness and connection fade in a few days. Pretty quickly I'm back to being a mess, an ever changing piece, a dastardly difficult puzzle for even God. How about you?

My puzzle reminds me that God never puts us in a corner. God never forgets about us. God never leaves us untouched for a week, month or year because of our challenge. God is constantly at work on us, never consigning us to the land of forgotten, neglected, abused, or lost. I may lose patience with my puzzle, but God never loses patience with me, or you.

That's the image of Easter that sticks with me these years. *God reached into a world beset by neglect, forgetfulness, abuse and loss and began a new work in Jesus*. Though we may never be completed that is because of our own challenges. Our redemptive Savior sees the beautiful end product in us and works in mysterious ways to see us through to completion. It is not our challenge that matters; God's commitment is the story.

I have in mind a puzzle; God has in mind a picture. Christ is risen; Christ is risen indeed. That's not just the story; that's the picture. Those are my Easter "take-aways". I hope you had a great experience of the resurrection, too.

Like the voice that shouts into the canyon seeking an echo, is there one to be heard here? Connect with me and let me know what you think. It matters to me!


Youth Yard and Bake Sale Fundraiser
