<u>A Great Gift for You This Christmas</u>

A few years ago an Australian nurse, **Bonnie Ware**, published an article on her web site listing the <u>top five regrets of dying persons</u>. She has this awareness because she worked for years as a palliative care nurse, a caring angel helping persons die peacefully. In her work she encountered the last thoughts, joys and regrets of many persons, and she saw a pattern.

In order from most common to slightly lesser common, the top five regrets of her many patients were:

- 1. I wish I'd had the courage to live a life true to myself, not the life other persons expected of me.
- 2. I wish I didn't work so hard.
- 3. I wish I'd had the courage to express my feelings.
- 4. I wish I had stayed in touch with my friends.
- 5. I wish I had let myself be happier.

When we look backwards at our lives, many of us have thoughts of "do overs", but few of

us give thought to the time we have left to "*do over*". We imagine ourselves stuck in some circumstance, or feel thoughts of defeat. The "*do overs*" haunt us.

God no doubt had thoughts of "**do overs**". Look at the mess of humanity from the time of creation. <u>Could we, as a creation, have done</u> <u>much worse following and honoring God?</u> Not likely. Priests, prophets, judges, kings, leaders, stories... God tried them all to keep us on the straight and narrow, yet sheep we are we strayed.

God, being a bit smarter than you and me, fashioned the ultimate "*do over*" by interacting with humanity in the person of Jesus, the Christ. In a fully human experience, God was "**born**" in a lowly human experience that connected God for eternity with least, lost, lowly and forgotten. Even so, this gift of God is a gift to us all, for all who will receive him.

The best gifts I've ever received are ones that helped me, improved me, entertained me, or afforded me some opportunity. I could easily expand on each of these blessings and how the gift of God meets them all, but I ask you to focus on the last one, the opportunity one. **What opportunity does the gift of God in Christ this Christmas give you this year**? Sure, you can say the simplistic answer, "**Salvation**!", or "**Eternal life**!" but do you remember that Jesus was far less focused on the eternal than he was on the now? What opportunity to you have now?

Referring again to the list, in the time you have left of life (and I pray it is many years!), how can you courageously live the life God uniquely created for you? How can you work less hard for salvation and more joyfully in faith? How can you faithfully express your feelings of love for God and neighbor? How can you create new spiritual relationships every day? And how can you rest in the joy and love that is God?

I remind you of the gift of Christ this year. <u>What will his gift be in you?</u> I pray it will be the gift of better, more fulfilling, less regretful years in your faith journey. Isn't that what God wants for you? I think it is.
