**Day 2:** Based on Romans 7:7-13, what is the role of the law? Focus on verses 7 and 13.

Why is it important that 'sin be recognized as sin?'

**Day 3:** Even though this is a difficult passage to fully comprehend, at least one clear message comes through: that law has no power to set us free from sin. Rather, Paul says, it is the very knowledge/presence of law that 'sin' uses to 'stir up' our desire to committ the very offence the law speaks againt. A simple illustration is that if you tell a child not to eat the cookies, you just stirred up a desire within them to do just that! How have you seen this dyamic at work in your own life?

In his message, Pastor Ethan talked about the difference between 'achieving' (living by law), and 'receiving' (living by grace). Thinking of this, along with the question above, how do you see God working to set you free (in your daily experience) from the trap of sin? What does it look like to 'receive' all we truly need from God, each day?
