jím's journal

It's hard to believe that I will be making my third report to the NKBA fall meeting. As your lead follower, my desire has been and is to follow Jesus on HIS mission and exhort our churches toward the same. Our mission statement indicates "The NKBA is an association of churches uniting together to accomplish the life-changing, world-changing mission of Jesus." The NKBA as a partner with the local churches to assist and re-



source the God-given vision for the local church. We exist to EMPOWER churches to accomplish our mission to "make disciples" (Matthew 28:19), and "to seek and to save the lost" (Luke 19:10).

Organizationally the NKBA is mission driven, church-driven, priority-based, resourcefocused and catalytic. The mission before us remains daunting. Demographics show that over 577,000 people live within a ten-mile radius of your NKBA office. The North American Mission Board (NAMB) statistics indicate that 68% of Boone County, 75% of Campbell County, and 85% of Kenton County are un-churched/de-churched/un-reached/spiritually LOST. 90-95% of all students age 12-24 in KY are also identified as unreached/unchurched.

In 2013 20 churches in the NKBA recorded ZERO baptisms. In 2014, 18 of our churches recorded ZERO baptisms. There is much work to be done and we simply cannot keep doing things the way we have been doing them and expecting a different result. The lostness of our community is crying out for a different result! Our country and its current moral state are a result of the lack of impact by our churches. The purpose of the church is to "make disciples" which begins with a first step in baptism and additional steps of actively following Christ in a transformed life that is exemplified in the ways we live, love, and serve in our world. What will it take to get our attention?

Recently Marjorie Hopkins (widow of Lee Hopkins) discovered some old annuals from the Campbell County Baptist Association (which is now the NKBA). In one annual (August 19-20, 1903) W.C. Connley made this statement: "The cause of the Lord has not prospered in (name of town) as it should. The Baptists seem to be cold and indifferent about the Lord's work. They do not seem to realize that men are going to Hell from (town). Satan seems to be carrying every strong hold and the children of the living God seem to be willing that he should. Pray that they would waken to the needs of (town)."

Pray for our all our Northern Kentucky Baptist Churches as we consider how we can best impact our community with the transforming power of the Gospel. Our mission remains the same. Our methods must change. We must plant new churches. We must help revive churches that are dying. We must pray like we've never prayed...given like we've never given...and work like we've never worked! Saint Augustine said it best, "Pray as though everything depended on God. Work as though everything depended on you." How effectively we are able to understand and act will determine our impact as followers of Christ on a LOST culture. Pray that God will stir the hearts of our leaders and our churches that they reflect the broken heart of our God.
