# SUMMARY OF TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS – 19<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY

Jesus' Incarnation Secures Life, Forgiveness and Healing For Us The Lord does not require us to ascend to Him; in mercy He descends to us. (Genesis 28:10-17) The ladder in Jacob's dream was not for climbing; it was the means by which the Lord came to bless Jacob. This event finds its fulfillment in Christ Who descended from His throne to save and bless us. By His incarnation He is the eternal bridge between heaven and earth. "The Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins." (Matthew 9:1-8) The Lord was present in the flesh to absolve the paralytic. Jesus also healed and restored this man's body. "For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation." (Small Catechism) The Lord still has power on earth to forgive sins. In His Holy Absolution He raises up the new man (Ephesians 4:22-28) and bestows the healing medicine which will bring about our resurrection on the Last Day. Therefore we say with Jacob, "This is none other than the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven!" (Genesis 28:17) (lcms.org/lectionary-summaries)

#### READING FROM THE LUTHERAN CONFESSIONS

Summary: Today's Gospel reminds us the greatest good work of Christ is the forgiveness of sins, from which every other good work proceeds and to which they point. Receiving the forgiveness of sins in faith is what frees the Christian to do the good works given by God for us to do according to His will for the sake of our neighbor, that they too might believe and have life in His Name.

Our teachers are falsely accused of forbidding good works. But they have taught well what is pleasing to God in every station of life. Furthermore, we teach that it is necessary to do good works. This does not mean that we merit grace by doing good works, but because it is God's will. (Ephesians 2:10) It is only by faith, and nothing else, that forgiveness of sins is apprehended. The Holy Spirit is received through faith, hearts are renewed and given new affections, and then they are able to bring forth good works. Ambrose says: "Faith is the mother of a good will and doing what is right." Without the Holy Spirit people are full of ungodly desires. They are too weak to do works that are good in God's sight. (John 15:5) So when there is no faith or trust in God, all kinds of lusts and human intentions rule in the heart. (Genesis 6:5) This is why Christ says, "Apart from Me you can do nothing." (John 15:5) That is why the Church sings: "Lacking Your divine favor, there is nothing in man. Nothing in him is harmless." (Augsburg Confession, Article 20, Good Works)

And when Jesus saw their faith, He said to the paralytic, "Take heart, My son; your sins are forgiven." <sup>3</sup> And behold, some of the scribes said to themselves, "This man is blaspheming." <sup>4</sup> But Jesus, knowing their thoughts, said, "Why do you think evil in your hearts? <sup>5</sup> For which is easier, to say, 'Your sins are forgiven,' or to say, 'Rise and walk'? <sup>6</sup> But that you may know that the Son of Man has authority on earth to forgive sins" – he then said to the paralytic – "Rise, pick up your bed and go home." <sup>7</sup> And he rose and went home. <sup>8</sup> When the crowds saw it, they were afraid, and they glorified God, who had given such authority to men.

NICENE CREED (CONFESSION OF FAITH) [PAGE 22]

**SERMON: FORGIVEN TO FORGIVE - MATTHEW 9:1-8** 

"Take heart, My son; your sins are forgiven." (Mt. 9:2) Amen.

The grace of the Lord Jesus be with you all. Amen. Jesus our Savior is returning to His hometown of Nazareth. In the process, He's met by a paralyzed man. The man's companions have brought him to the Lord on a stretcher-bed so

that He may heal him. Jesus sees their faith – their belief in Him, that He'll restore the man's ability to walk. So Jesus heals the paralytic with the words, "Rise, pick up your bead and go home." (Mt. 9:6) But first He does the fellow even one better!

Word has spread that Jesus has been making many diseased, blind, deaf, infirm people whole again, well again. The lame man and his friends trust this word, so that they're more-than-confident that He'll help them in their need too.

Jesus surprises! Not content to only heal the man of his paralysis, He also pronounces Holy Absolution over him: *'Take heart, My son; your sins are forgiven.'' (Mt. 9:2)* He takes his sin away, pardoning him of it all!

The religious scribes are okay with Jesus healing the paralytic. Yet for the Lord to forgive the man his sins – that's a big no-no for them! The scribes believe that only God in heaven forgives sinners their sins, and that by the bloody sacrifices of bulls in the temple in Jerusalem. They won't stand for the forgiveness, pardon and peace of God for sinners in the greater sacrifice of His Son. You can just see their hearts raging at Jesus as He pardons the man of his trespasses.

In forgiving the man as He does, Jesus is accused of blasphemy or speaking in the place of God. You see, to the scribes, the Lord is a mere man – no one special or holy. Yet He reveals His authority as the Holy Son of God and also as a man sent by His heavenly Father to restore hurting sinners to their God. He does so by pronouncing all penitent transgressors of God's Law forgiven, reconciled to Him. And by healing the diseased and the lame of their maladies.

And so believe – as the scribes sure ought to have – that the Lord Jesus is the Forgiver of your sins, the Restorer of your soul, just as He's the Healer and Sustainer of your bodies and lives. For Jesus heals the paralytic to certify that He, as God, has all power and authority also as a man to forgive the trespasses of the sorrowful and contrite.

Another sure-sign of Jesus' deity is that He can read the scribes' thoughts. He knows very well that they're accusing and condemning Him in their hearts of being a blasphemer of God. He rebukes them for their unbelief and hard hearts against Him, saying, "Why do you think evil in your hearts?" (Mt. 9:4) They're guilty of denying Jesus the right to do the good, saving work that His Father has sent Him to do.

For Jesus, forgiving sinners their trespasses and healing them of their diseases always goes hand-in-hand. Trust that He always combines the forgiveness of sins and the gift of faith with the gift of healing and restoration. The needy are always taken care of twice-over, and so fully by their Savior!

From our vantage point, it'd certainly be easier to forgive another person his wrongdoings than to heal him of his infirmity – if we could even do that. Yet with God "all things are possible." (Mt. 19:26) So it's no harder for the almighty Son of God to pardon a person's iniquities than it is for Him to heal a persons' disease or infirmity.

How different are we from this paralytic? Just like him, we were all "conceived and born sinful and [were] under the power of the devil until [Jesus] claim[ed] us as His own. We [would've been] lost forever unless delivered from sin, death and everlasting condemnation." (Rite of Holy Baptism) So we need the pardoning mercy of our Lord no less than this man who couldn't walk. We need peace to be made between God and us by the pierced, outstretched hands of our blessed Savior.

Face it, we don't like being needy. We want to take care of ourselves. In many ways we're self-sufficient in our lives. Yet God's everlasting arms are always beneath us. He's ultimately sustaining us from day-to-day. Our Lord Jesus is like a trauma surgeon who examines a person with a fractured arm and a gaping, gushing wound. First the surgeon attends to the wound, plugging and suturing it, then bandaging it so that it heals. Then he stabilizes the arm and puts it in a cast to heal. The paralytic's sin-guilt is his biggest problem by far. So is yours your greatest threat of all. So Christ your Savior deals first-and-foremost with what's most harmful to you: a bad conscience. "He forgives all your iniquities." And then, having made peace between His Father and you by the blood of His cross, "He heals all your diseases." (Ps. 103:3)

We don't like to see eye-to-eye with God on this. We grow numb to the wrong we do; to our guilt which rises like a destructive flood, thinking, as we do, that it's no so very bad after all. Or we just don't care that we've spited God to His face with our treachery, having done what's evil in His sight. (See Ps. 51:4) We disregard the fact that our sins will definitely be our downfall and destruction if we let them. It's then that we must hear and heed the wake-up call of God's Word especially! "Repent and turn from all your transgressions, or your iniquity will be your ruin." (Ez. 18:30)

Praise God Who sent His only Son to save you and many from your numerous unfaithful acts, words and thoughts that cut you off from Him! Glory be to God Who leads us all to see just how terrible our sins really are, so that

"we may learn to be horrified by [them], and to regard them as very serious." (Small Catechism: Christian Questions with Their Answers: 16) So that we run quickly into the merciful arms of our dear Lord. "For all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, and are justified by His grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus." (Rom. 3:23-24)

As the eternal Son of God Who became man in time, Jesus has all power and authority to forgive sins and heal diseases. So repent of all your sins as did the paralytic. Share in his remorse and in his great need for Jesus to come help, forgive, save you. For you believe, don't you, that you finally have no help and no hope apart from your Savior. Yes, by God's grace you do believe that "the Lord is [your] strength and [your] song; He has become [your] salvation!" (Ps. 118:14)

Thanks be to Jesus, a paralytic is paralyzed no longer. He's a lost, troubled sinner no more, since Jesus as perfect God and perfect man says, "Take heart, My son; your sins are forgiven." (Mt. 9:2) And "rise, pick up your bed and go home." (Mt. 9:6) The suffering and death that Christ hadn't yet endured, His sacred blood which He hadn't yet even spilled, covered and washed this paralytic's sins and his paralysis away. That's the power and glory of Jesus' holy, sacrificial suffering and death, covering the sins of penitent believers of all times, in all places! Yes, the blood of Jesus cleanses us from all sin, just as it cleansed the paralytic from all his sin. (See 1 Jn. 1:7)

The reaction of the onlookers to Jesus forgiving and healing the paralytic teaches us that God desires to forgive sins through His people. It's remarkable how the people fear and glorify God, "Who [has] given such authority [to forgive sins] to men." To-be-sure, God is indeed the One Who forgives all the sins of penitent sinners – you included! But He hasn't reserved this right for Himself only.

First, He gave it to His Son in the flesh, so that as a man, the Lord Jesus takes away the sin of the world – your sin and mine. God the Father hardly stops with His Son! He also gives the right to pardon sin to us, His Church on earth. Yes, in his un-surpassing love and mercy toward us, His true saints, He speaks full pardon and peace to us through His called-and-ordained pastors, who declare to us from heaven: "I forgive you all your sins in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost." (Holy liturgy) For hasn't Christ commanded His dear Church: "Whatever you loose [or forgive] on earth shall be loosed in heaven?" (Matthew 16:19) He has! Hasn't He instructed His holy apostles, and us, His people today: "If you forgive the sins or any, they are forgiven them?" (John 20:23) You know He has; you bet He has!

As you are certainly members of God in Christ Jesus, as you're the royal priesthood of all believers, the Lord your God blesses you in faith and love to forgive those who trespass against you. This is your calling and duty in the Lord. "Be kind to one another, tender-hearted, forgiving each other, just as God in Christ also has forgiven you." (Eph. 4:32) "As you have been forgiven so also are you to forgive." (Col. 3:13)

So Jesus says to you as well as through you, "Friend, your sins are forgiven." (Lk. 5:20) "Therefore I tell you, [your] sins, which are many, are forgiven." (Lk. 7:47) "Your faith has saved you, go in peace." (Lk. 7:50)

Jesus is returning home when He forgives and heals a man in desperate need. Your Savior atoned for or made perfect, holy sacrificial payment for your sin and that of the whole world, that whoever believes in Him, His saving work and His pardoning Word will not perish but have eternal life! So go to your home today at peace with God and in the joy of Jesus – forever! Amen. The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.
