# SUMMARY OF TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS – 25<sup>TH</sup> SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY

Faith Comes By Hearing the Word of Christ "The Kingdom of God is not coming with signs to be observed." (Luke 17:20) You must use your ears and not your eyes. For God's Kingdom in this world is one of faith, and faith comes by hearing the Word of Christ. The people of Israel, however, wanted to walk not by faith but by sight. When Moses delayed in coming down the mountain, they decided to make a visible god for themselves, the golden calf. (See Exodus 32:1) Upon such faithless and false worshipers God's judgment comes. Only on the Last Day will our faith be turned to sight. "For as the lightning comes from the east and shines as far as the west, so will be the coming of the Son of Man." (Matthew 24:27) The Lord Himself will descend from heaven with a shout, and He will gather His people to Himself, both the living and the dead. In a world in which our days are few and full of trouble (see Job 14:1), let us comfort one another with these words of the resurrection and the coming of our Lord Jesus. (lcms.org/lectionary-summaries)

#### READING FROM THE LUTHERAN CONFESSIONS

Summary: God's forgiveness and salvation is for all mankind, but it must be received by faith and appreciated, not ignored or rejected.

Our Churches teach that at the end of the world Christ will appear for judgment and will raise all the dead. He will give the godly and elect eternal life and everlasting joys, but He will condemn ungodly people and the devils to be tormented without end. (See Matthew 25:31-46) Our Churches condemn the Anabaptists, who think that there will be an end to the punishments of condemned men and devils. Our Churches condemn those who say that before the resurrection of the dead the godly shall take possession of the kingdom of the world, the ungodly being everywhere suppressed.

The entire Church confesses that eternal life is attained through mercy. Augustine says: "Woe to the life of man, however much it may be worthy of praise, if it be judged with mercy removed." And Cyprian says, "No one should flatter himself that he is innocent. By exalting himself he should certainly perish because he is instructed that he sins daily and is told to ask forgiveness daily for his sins." Even though we have good works, yet in these very works we need mercy. (Augsburg Confession, Article 5; Apology of the Augsburg Confession, Apology 17)

# SERMON: HOLD FAST TO THE ONE TRUE CHRIST, OVER-AND-AGAINST ALL PRETENDERS – MT. 24:15-28

"For as the lightning comes from the east and shines as far as the west, so will be the coming of the Son of Man." (Mt. 24:28) Amen.

Dear baptized in the Name of the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit. Amen. Our Gospel pericope for the second-to-last Sunday of the Church Year begins with striking words from our Lord: "So when you see the abomination of desolation spoken of by the Prophet Daniel, standing in the holy place (let the reader understand), then let those who are in Judea flee to the mountains." (Mt. 24:15) In saying this, Jesus is referencing the "abomination that causes desolation" (Dan. 12:11) foretold by the 6<sup>th</sup>-century BC Prophet Daniel. Daniel prophesied the coming defilement and desecration of the temple in Jerusalem at the hands of the pagan Seleucid king Antiochus Epiphanes IV, who ruled Israel as a tyrant in

the second-century BC. Antiochus profaned God's holy temple by setting up an altar to the pagan Greek god Zues. The wicked ruler slaughtered many Israelites, sold others into slavery and forced people to sacrifice to pagan gods. Antiochus even took the title Epiphanes – a title of divinity – claiming to be God Himself.

The Old Testament contains a number of prophecies that God would fulfill in the near-term future, and would go on to fulfill anew in the more distant future. Antiochus' vile rule was the near-term fulfilment of Daniel's prophecy. The long-term fulfilment of Daniel's words is also spoken of by Jesus: The destruction of the city of Jerusalem and its temple some forty years later in AD 70 by the Romans. The Lord points to the coming annihilation of Jerusalem as a precursor to His Final Coming and Judgment of all humanity. Just as God's temple was desecrated by Antiochus; just as Jerusalem and its temple would be destroyed in judgment, so too will the world and everyone in it be judged on the day God has appointed.

Jesus' words would go on to be fulfilled exactly as He speaks them. After Jewish zealots led an all-out revolt against the Roman Empire, Rome's legions besieged Jerusalem and breached its walls. Most of the city's inhabitants perished in the brutal siege. The temple itself was torn down stone-by-stone, fulfilling Jesus' words in Matthew 24:2: "Not one stone here will be left on another; every one will be toppled."

The Lord speaks as He does near the end of Matthew to warn His faithful people to "flee to the mountains" (Mt. 24:16) when warfare is about to consume them. His believers are to get out quickly – like running from a raging forest fire. They're not even to return to their homes and get provisions for their escape. They're to get out while they still can! In fact, right before the Roman legions encircled Jerusalem, the Christians in the city, recalling Jesus' words, fled the imminent onslaught. They were saved, in more ways than one, by the Word of Christ. Jesus is always very good at doing this!

As we hear Jesus in our Gospel lesson, we note how seamlessly He switches from first-century Jerusalem's judgment and destruction to the Final Judgment, destruction and end of the world. One second He's speaking about how His early Christian followers had better get out of Dodge quickly and run for the hills. The next second He's speaking about the coming end of the world. "For then there will be great tribulation, such as has not been from the beginning of the world until now, no, and never will be." (Mt. 24:21)

A good way to understand Jesus' words here is to see them as you'd see words through the magnifying lenses of bifocal glasses. Jesus' warning of impending doom for godless, faithless Jerusalem is to be read with the lower, close-up half of the eyeglass lens. With this lens you see that Jesus' words of judgment over Jerusalem and His urging God's people to flee from its destruction was very sound advice indeed! This is important because we see that God is very serious about judging unbelievers – those who reject and hate Him and His Son. God has already brought His judgment to bear – in the world-wide flood in Genesis, in the Babylonian destruction of Jerusalem and its temple in 587 BC, and of course in the last Roman destruction of Jerusalem and the temple in AD 70. It's also important for us to see how Jesus has already delivered His beloved Christians from certain destruction by giving them wise counsel to leave Jerusalem before it's too late.

We peer through the far-into-the-future, upper half of the eyeglass to understand Jesus' words on what's yet to come for us. Now we – just like our fellow Christians before Jerusalem's destruction – are to carefully hear Jesus' words and heed His warning. A final, world-wide day of reckoning – far more severe than all previous judgments – is coming. Always be ready, on your guard, watchful for it!

One aspect of the coming judgment is the appearance of false messiahs beforehand "who will arise and...lead many astray; if possible even the elect:" (Mt. 24:24) us. These false christs are sent by the devil of hell to draw our eyes and ears, hearts and minds away from our Lord Himself unto they themselves. They strive with all their might to convince us to set our hearts on them and this world – not on the one true Christ and the new heaven and earth to come.

False christs and prophets are everyone who'd want to come between you and your Savior, cutting you clean off from Him. They'd have you believe differently than Jesus has you believe as His Christians – and live differently than He has you live as His saints. "Do not let your hearts be troubled," Jesus says to you. "Believe in God; believe also in Me." (In. 14:1) False messiahs would have you trust in them, in yourself, in other people – anyone but Jesus alone.

"Be holy, for I, the Lord your God, am holy," (Lev. 19:2) He says to you. Look to your baptizing God Who splashes His very own holiness into you; Who speaks His own righteousness upon you, making it yours too. See your precious Savior Who feeds you His own purity in His body and blood! So that you live holy, God-pleasing lives to His glory. So do so! "Live by faith alone in the Son of God, Who loved [you] and gave His life for [you.]" (Gal. 2:20) "Keep your conduct

among the unbelieving Gentiles honorable" (1 Pet. 2:12) and "lead a chaste and decent life in what [you] say and do." (Small Catechism: Explanation of the 6<sup>th</sup> Commandment) For the false christs and prophets you're to beware of will tug at you at every turn to live for this world heavily and yourself bigly – to gratify the desires of your sinful flesh.

Our Savior warns us to "beware of false prophets" (Mt. 7:15) and to keep far from them because, by our nature, we're vulnerable to their efforts to draw us away from God. They'd have us find our ultimate value and meaning in this life, in the world around us and its ways. False christs teach us that we really have no need to believe in Jesus as Savior; that there's really no sin and evil in us to be saved from; no fallen, dead world to be saved out of. "Your Church membership and attendance is a waste of your time," you're told point-blank. "Stay home! Worship whom you will; what you will there," you're advised by them. "Who cares about Jesus' Word and His body and blood when you have many other fine words to listen to, and a lot of great food you can eat and drink you can drink?" false christs blare at you. But every word of theirs is meant to doom you. So have nothing to do with them – ever!

Shame on us when we hear false christs and take what they say to heart! We lose out whenever we hear and follow other voices than the voice of our Good Shepherd. Jesus calls us to faith, to trust in Him and His Father alone for life and salvation. (See Jn. 14:1) We slip up and put our trust in ourselves and others. Only God has delivered us from judgment. He tells us to come out from among unbelievers in this godless generation, and to be separate from them and their wicked ways. He instructs us to "touch no unclean thing, and [He] will receive [us]." (2 Cor. 6:17) We must heed His words and "return to [Him] with all [our] heart, with fasting, with weeping and with mourning [over our sins and unfaithfulness], for He is gracious and merciful, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love." (Joel 2:13-14)

Beloved in the Lord, to overcome all false christs is to abide in the Word of Christ in His Church and in your home. It's like Jesus says to you: "If you abide [or have life] in My Word, you are truly My disciples, and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." (John 8:31) Seek your Savior where He's always to be found, where He comes to you! Seek Him in His Word, since by it you're prepared to rightly receive Him when He finally comes for you like "lighting comes from the east and shines as far as the west." (Mt. 24:27) When you see buzzards feeding on the road ahead of you, you know there's a dead animal there. In the same way, you'll recognize Jesus' Final Coming for you, and rejoice greatly in it!

So flee from false christs; from the love of this life; from the love of self more than the love of others, of God. Yes, flee from the coming wrath and judgment by not conforming yourself – your beliefs and ways – to this wicked world, so that you're not judged and destroyed along with it. Escaping is never bad when you're escaping from what's bad. So flee from; "hate what is evil; cling to what is good." (Rom. 12:9) Run into the arms of Jesus! He's Godwith-you, always.

Christ Jesus' crucifixion is what really delivered His Christians from Jerusalem's desolation. His sacrificial death and mighty resurrection gave people the faith to believe His warning to flee the city when disaster was about to strike. The same goes for you! Christ your Savior has atoned for all your sin and desolation in His body on the tree. Your Final Judgment has already taken place – on Good Friday – as God's wrath against you was taken by His Son instead for you. Yes, Jesus took the full blast of God's judgment and woe for you by dying for you. God is today, tomorrow and forever well-pleased with you in Jesus! He highly favors you in His Son! Cherish this; cherish Him always! Amen. The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.
