SUMMARY OF TODAY'S SCRIPTURE READINGS – 24^{TH} SUNDAY AFTER TRINITY

The Strength of the Lord is Our Salvation from Sin, Death and Darkness A shroud of darkness engulfs us. Sin, death and disease threaten to sever us from life's fullest measure. Without new life in Christ Jesus, there would be no light to dissipate, dispel or curb grief and sadness. But Jesus has qualified us "to share in the inheritance of the saints of light" delivering us from the dark domain. (Colossians 1:9-14) "I have put My words in your mouth and covered you in the shadow of My hand. You are my people." (Isaiah 51:9-16) The presence of Christ, in Word, wine, bread and water confronts our sinful nature with forgiveness. In the Sacraments, God claims us as His very own children, creating and sustaining our faith in Christ. So in Him, we humbly receive the words, "your faith has made you well." (Matthew 9:18-26) On the Last Day God will surely awaken us also from slumber in resurrection glory. (lcms.org/lectionary-summaries)

READING FROM THE LUTHERAN CONFESSIONS

Summary: The miracles of Jesus recorded by the Evangelists in the four Gospel accounts are evidence that testify to the saving truth that He - Who would also suffer and die for us on the cross, is at the same time both God and man.

God's Son from eternity has been a particular, distinct, entirely divine person. He is true, essential, perfect God with the Father and the Holy Spirit. In the fullness of time He received also the human nature into the unity of His person. He did not do this in such a way that there now are two persons or two Christs. Christ Jesus is now in one person at the same time true, eternal God, born of the Father from eternity, and a true man, born of the most blessed virgin Mary. In this one undivided person of Christ, there are two distinct natures: the divine, which is from eternity, and the human, which in time was received into the unity of the person of God's Son. Each one abides in its nature and essence in the person of Christ to all eternity. He did all His miracles by the power of this personal union. For example, at the wedding at Cana of Galilee (John 2:1-11), when He was twelve years old, among the learned (Luke 2:42-50), in the garden, when with a word He cast His enemies to the ground (John 18:6), and in death, when He died not simply as any other man, but in and with His death conquered sin, death, devil, hell and eternal damnation. (Colossians 2:13-15) The human nature alone would not have been able to do these miracles if it had not been personally united and had communion with the divine nature. (Book of Concord; Formula of Concord: Solid Declaration, Art. 8)

And instantly the woman was made well. ²³ And when Jesus came to the ruler's house and saw the flute players and the crowd making a commotion, ²⁴ He said, "Go away, for the girl is not dead but sleeping." And they laughed at Him. ²⁵ But when the crowd had been put outside, He went in and took her by the hand, and the girl arose.

HYMN OF THE DAY: ↓ 592:1-3; 5-6

SERMON: YOUR NEED FOR JESUS IS VERY GREAT INDEED! MATTHEW 9:18-25

Jesus said, 'Take heart, your faith has made you well." (Mt. 9:22) Amen.

Dear baptized in the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit. Amen. How much do you need Jesus? A religious ruler of the local synagogue comes to the Lord Jesus, kneels before Him and pleads for Him to come and restore his daughter to life again since she has died. St. Mark's account of this narrative calls the man Jairus: the head of the area-house of worship. Jairus needs Jesus to the maximum since death has devasting him and his family.

How much do you need Jesus? Just like Jairus, a woman with a chronic disorder approaches Jesus. Unlike the synagogue ruler, she – wishing to remain anonymous with her condition – believes that if she only touches the hem of Jesus' garment, she'll be made well again – her bleeding gone for good! She needs Jesus for healing and restoration. This hurting woman shares the faith of grief-stricken Jairus that God's Son can do what she needs Him to do for her.

How much do you need Jesus? Jairus has no doubt heard reports of Jesus fulfilling the Old Testament prophecies about God's Messiah – what all the Deliverer of Israel would do when He came to His people. Jairus likely even witnessed Jesus heal people in miraculous fashion, as when He healed a paralyzed man and forgave him his sins in the previous chapter of Matthew. Now this religious ruler needs Jesus to be Messiah for him and his daughter, to deliver her from death. If not for Jesus, Jairus would have no other option but to await his own death before being reunited with his daughter again in the resurrection. Like King David said of his dead son, all Jairus could say of his deceased daughter if Jesus were not there is: *"I will go to [her], but [she] will not return to me." (2 Sam. 12:23)* But Jesus is there!

Jesus and Jairus make for the ruler's house, and as a sign to us all, Jesus is needed more – always more! First by Jairus, then by the hemorrhaging woman and by so many more besides! You and me too! As for this poor woman, she's been bleeding internally for twelve years. Cruel death has ripped Jairus' daughter from his arms. A chronic bleeding disorder has cut the woman off form her community since it has made her ceremonially-unclean before God and man. So a suffering woman and a grieving father need Jesus more-than-ever since the bleeding just won't stop and a daughter just wont wake up again on her own.

In one form or another, this woman's reality is also our own. Jesus also enters our reality when He arrives with Jairus at the synagogue ruler's house. The grim tune fluted out and the wailing voices aren't strange to our ears, though we hear such sounds in a different way: at a funeral visitation, at a service of Christian burial, at the graveside committal and at other places where people mourn. It's the sound of death callously interrupting life, brutally ending it! 12-year-olds aren't supposed to die. Neither are 22-year-olds or 46-year-olds or 72-year-olds. Not even 99-year-olds! And yet this little girl is stone-dead because "sin came into the world through one man, and death through sin, and so death spread to all people because all sinned." (Rom. 5:12)

Jesus kicks up quite the fuss when He announces to all mourners gathered, "Go away, for the girl is not dead but sleeping." (Mt. 9:24) He's not speaking fugitively, but literally. She really is sleeping the sleep of death, from which she'll shortly be awakened. If you who believe in Jesus Christ by God's saving gift of faith should fall asleep in Jesus, perishing on the earth before His return again, then rest assured that He'll wake you too, raising your stone-dead body to life again just as He raised the girl's body to life! Jesus shoes away all the weepers since they're totally out-of-place there. Their presence and their wailing and blaring is like the women coming to Jesus' empty tomb for all the wrong reasons: to anoint His corpse with spices and to further mourn His death. God repurposes their visit to Jesus' grave, making them the first eye-witnesses of His resurrection – those who'll joyfully share the good news that Christ is risen!

For their part, the gaggle of mourners push back at Jesus, mocking Him for depriving them of their duty to spread the tragic news of a death in the community. Normally, they'd be right. It'd be like any of us going to a visitation of a deceased relative or friend and telling everyone there to get up and go home – visitation's over; no need to mourn anymore. What do you think peoples' reaction would be if one of us ever did that?

Know also that these folks are aware of Jesus' ability to heal the sick. But now that the girl's dead, what more can He do? they're no doubt thinking. Jairus and his wife need others to mourn with; the weeping crew is there to meet that need. Yet Jairus and his family have a greater need, and only Jesus can and will meet that need!

The world around us is just like the weeping troupe outside Jairus' house, thinking they're meaningful, they're needed, but that Jesus isn't needed in a situation like this. To them, what good can the Lord really provide in the face of suffering, death, sadness? There's always the desire on the part of sinful man to put a limit on the Lord Jesus – what He can and can't do. To many people nowadays, there's little thought of what Christ can do because they think He's still dead. Just like the mourners believe the little girl will be dead until the general resurrection at the end of the world.

Yet Jairus believes differently, as does the hemorrhaging woman, which is the key to our text today. The strength of Jairus' faith in Jesus to raise the dead to life again is a credit to God's saving grace. The strength of the woman's faith in Jesus to heal her of a disorder that everyone else would tell her – "Just deal with it." – is a credit to God's mercy and love for hurting sinners who cry out to Him in their great need! These two godly people don't have to put up with death and disorder – not when Jesus is there!

How much do you need Jesus? Your need for Him is directly proportional to how fallen and sinful you are. If you're just a minor sinner, a slight or occasional breaker of God's Law, who has only offended Him moderately, then you need Jesus relatively little. Heck, then you hardly need God's Church at all! If you're a more serious sinner, but still a pretty good person, then you need Jesus more. Maybe you need Church some of the time, say about a third-of-the-year or so. But if you're a true, guilty-as-can-be sinner, wretched as all-get-out, then you couldn't possibly need Jesus any more than you do! Then you need His Church every Sunday that ends in Y! It's written: "No one is righteous, no, not even one! No one understand; no one seeks after God. All have turned aside; together [we] have become corrupt; no one does good, not even one." (Rom. 3:10-12) Apart from Christ and His Church, you're dead, not alive. Apart from Jesus, the woman must live with her bleeding without any remedy. Apart from Christ, Jairus must live with his daughter's death as the victor over life. But with Jesus there's healing, restoration, life, peace forever with God for the woman, for Jairus, for you and for all believers in Christ!

In all our need, do we stand with the synagogue ruler, who went to his home with Jesus in order for the Lord to save his daughter? Or do we stand with the world and say that this girl – along with all who are dead today – are dead and gone forever? When Jairus knew that it was too late for Jesus to heal his daughter of her illness, he trusted that the Son of God could wake her from death. Jesus is always needed! When so many years of hemorrhaging and being an outcast in her community convinced the woman that her situation was hopeless apart from God's help, she brought her need to the only One Who could help her. Jesus is always needed!

Jesus invites you to cast your crushing sin burdens, your griefs and heartaches on Him. The woman certainly has no rational reason to expect that anything good can come from touching Jesus' garment. No matter! She trusts in Him to do good to her and save her. She believes that this is why He's come into the world! Don't doubt the Lord since you have the same faith as she does. If this woman hadn't trusted in the Lord and hadn't cared to touch His garment in faith, then no good would've come to her from God. Look to Jesus for all your needs!

In your confession of sin, in your heartfelt, God-given desire to approach His throne of grace, so that you receive mercy and find grace to help you in time of need *(see Heb. 4:16),* you find yourself right at the moment when Jesus' garment is touched and when He raises a child to life again. You see a world around you that's as dead as the little girl, and wants to take you and everyone you love down with it! You're aware of how you've doubted God. You know you haven't brought all your needs to Him in prayer and trust. But you also know that One greater than you became less than you – Servant and Savior of all – giving His holy, precious life unto death for you as God Who is man! You know that Christ Jesus has taken all your sin, your death and your judgment upon Himself for you!

Do not waver but believe! "Trust in the Lord with all your heart." (Prov. 3:5) Jesus shows the exact same loving care for you and your loved ones that He showed to the hemorrhaging woman. He helps you to bear your daily burdens so that they won't consume you. You're no more self-sufficient than this woman was. So your Lord takes very good care of you. You have no way to meet the needs which only your gracious God can meet for you: forgiveness of sins, having a clean conscience, being justified by faith alone in Jesus Christ, living a good life before God and man, falling asleep in Jesus, being bodily raised from the dead on the Last Day. How you need Jesus!

God doesn't always heal us of everything which ails us as chronic illnesses and disorders may very well stay with us for the rest of our lives. And the dead aren't raised nowadays since Jesus isn't here waking the dead from their slumber – yet. We could easily become discouraged and forlorn, bemoaning that the woman, Jairus and his daughter had it better than we do now. Maybe, yet we have no less of a need for Jesus than they did. Thank God that He's no less for us as our beloved Savior than He was for the woman, Jairus and his family.

If you or a loved one have a chronic illness or a bodily defect, God may not relieve you of it in this life. But He will for certain in the next! In the meantime, cast all your needs, cares, anxieties upon Him, for He cares for you! (See 1 Pet. 5:7)

How much do you need Jesus? Dear saints of God, you know how much! Amen. The peace of God, which passes all understanding, keep your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus. Amen.
