The Spreading Light of Epiphany

Dear Servants of Christ.

Welcome to Epiphany, the season of spreading light. The birth of Christ, our Light, was celebrated on Christmas. And the bright news of the Christ's birth now radiates out to all the world. The wise men were among the first to recognize the spreading Light of Christ. "We saw his star in the east and have come to worship him," they declared (Matthew 2:2). Since that time, people from the four corners of the globe have been touched by Christ's spreading Light in all its dazzling and varied glory. This Light reveals Christ's gracious gifts of divine presence, forgiveness from sin, and everlasting life. Where exactly can the Lord's radiating Light be seen today?

The Light of Christ spreads out through the Scriptures. "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet and light for my path," we read ((Psalm 119:105). The story of our salvation, culminating in the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ, is brought to light each time people read the Gospels of Matthew, Mark, Luke and John. Highlight in your own Bible those passages that have enlightened you in your walk with Christ, and then make an effort to share those verses with friends and family. Consider giving or lending a Bible to someone who does not yet know Christ.

The Light of Christ spreads out through missionaries. Many men and women have heeded the directive of Jesus to "make disciples of all nations" and gone to places near and far where people have not yet been exposed to the Light of Christ (Matthew 28:19). Find out the addresses of missionaries whom your church supports. Write letters of encouragement to them to "keep spreading the Light of Christ." Make donations to them to brighten their day and support their work.

<u>The Light of Christ spreads out through us</u>. The wise men responded in the Light of Christ by bowing down to worship Him. They presented Him with the gifts of gold,

frankincense and myrrh (Matthew 2:11). Gladly attend worship services in your church and generously give of your time, talents and treasures in love and service to the Lord. In your church and in your community this Epiphany season, let the Light of Christ beam forth with powerful force.

<u>Traveling Light</u> (a Bible study on the 23rd Psalm) continues on Sunday morning at 10:20. Sessions for January are:



Friends of Madagascar Mission: Celebrating the Gift of Mission

It was a GIFT to visit Madagascar from August 24-September 7. During the visit the goals were to consult with the leaders of the Malagasy Lutheran Church and the leaders of the programs that Friends of Madagascar Mission (FOMM) supports.

We also held an Evangelist Training Event in Antsirabe, Madagascar. Some of the participants traveled for 3 1/2 days in overcrowded "bush taxis" to arrive at Antsirabe. One of the evangelists, a woman, shared with us that in addition to the travel time to Antisirabe, she had to walk for ten hours from her home to catch the "bush taxi." This account shows the commitment of the evangelists to their work.

What a GIFT it was to be together, about 50 people, and celebrate our mission in Christ! Friends of Madagascar Mission paid for the transportation, lodging and food for all participants. This was a good investment because it is important to have "face to face" dialogue. During each consultation we signed a "Covenant Relationship Agreement" to establish our working relationship. This newsletter has two purposes: 1) To give a summary of our recent mission trip, and 2) To encourage you to support Friends of Madagascar Mission (FOMM) projects.
