Dear Servant of Christ,



In the January/February issue of *Connections* magazine, there is a devotion by David Nuottila, "No Other Gods." I found the following excerpts to be meaningful to me. Hopefully, they will be for you also.

"In a handbook on Luther's *Small Catechism*, Dr. James. A. Nestigen begins his commentary with this brief sentence: 'God has made a decision about you.' This brief remark sets the tone for a lifetime of worship and prayer, a lifetime of learning and a lifetime of faith. The decision God has made comes to us in the form of a commandment: 'I AM the Lord your God . . . You shall have no other gods before me.' (Exodus 20:2-3)"

"God delivered this commandment (along with nine others) to His people, the Israelites, on Mt. Sinai. He did this after He delivered them from over 400 years of slavery in Egypt. On that mountain, God announced that the Israelites were His cherished people, that He and He alone had delivered them from slavery, not all the gods of Egypt. Therefore, He and He alone was worthy of their worship."

"In his Large Catechism," Martin Luther teaches Christians what it means to have a god. To have a god means to having one from whom we may 'expect all good and in which we are to take refuge in all distress.' Luther correctly points out that 'whatever you set your heart on and put your trust in is truly your god.' Sadly, because of our sinful nature, we too often rely on our own ability to deliver ourselves from distress."

"No thing, no idol, no object the consequence of our sin. Only the love of God in Christ the power to deliver sinners God's Word is sure. 'I AM have no other gods.""






