Hey God, Can You HEAR Me??????

Dear Servants,

You are listening to the news and you learn that the Supreme Court is going to "hear" thus-and-so case. You know that the Court "hearing" a case has little to do with an auditory capability. "Hearing" a case means that a legal case is going to be studied by nine justices. The "hearing" will include studying the proceedings of the original trial, following the trail of the decision at that original trial through the appeals process, then comparing the carefully studied facts and procedures of that case against the Constitution and precedents of previous decisions. The tedious process will involve the research and minds of many Court aides as well as the discussion among and arguments by the nine justices. What will NOT be "heard" by the Courts are the opinions, wishes, expectations, and demands of the American public. Voters who want liberal or conservative justices, voters who want a court that has a liberal or conservative majority, are often dismayed. even outraged, when "their' liberal or conservative justices don't render the expected decision. What the voters so often forget is that a justice, once appointed, focuses on Lady Justice. And if you remember her image, she is blind-folded. And although we can't see them, perhaps she even has plugs in her ears! Each case "heard" by the Court seeks a decision that is lawful, respectful, focused on the merits of that particular case. Though imperfect, American rely on the wisdom, knowledge, prudence of the nine Court appointees.



Now, before you toss this page aside with a "thanks very much but I'm not looking for a Court review" sigh, let me connect this to prayer. Prayer. We hear about it so much; for many Christians, prayer has been a part of their lives for as long as they can remember. But as I listened to decisions of the Court for 2020-202I session and the outrage and dismay expressed by both major political parties, I couldn't help but think of prayer and our attitude, at times, towards God.

We believe what Psalm 66:19 says, "For truly God has listened, He has attended to the voice of my prayer." Sometimes our "interpretation" of this verse is a) God loves us (too many Bible verse to quote); b) God cares for us (He has even numbered the hairs on our head): c) God says to ask anything and He will give it to us; d) THEREFORE since <u>I</u> have *chosen* to believe in Him, when I pray to Him, I will get what I want, when I want it, at the time and in the place where needed. IF I DON"T, has God heard my prayer? Is He really listening to me?

God does listen, He does hear, He does answer. But let's take a quick review of the facts. The Supreme Court is the ultimate court of the land; there is no place else to go, no higher group to render a verdict. But as "supreme" as our nation's court, our God is THE supreme ruler of the universe. He created and sustains/maintains His world. He created us in His image (no higher compliment). Unlike our earthly courts, God's wisdom is perfect; His knowledge is perfect; His power is perfect; His presence is from everlasting to everlasting (no term limits, no death limits for Him). And above all, His love is perfect. "I have loved with you an everlasting love" (Jeremiah



31:3); "I know the plans I have for you...plans to prosper you, to give you hope and a future" (Jeremiah 29:11). So let's remind ourselves that because God is perfect in all ways, He will provide what He knows we need . *and* withhold what we don't. Isaiah 55:9: "As the heavens are higher than

the earth, so are my thoughts and ways higher than yours." We did NOT choose God so He could do our bidding; He chose us (John 15:16) that we might serve and glorify Him.

So, when we turn our eyes to heaven and shake our heads and yell, "Hey God, can you HEAR me?" be assured that He does. Be assured that He only wants the best for you . . . and the best is a personal relationship with Him, to love Him and serve Him, and to spend eternity with Him. Whether God's answer to prayer is "yes", "no", "wait", "here's the alternative", be assured that it is the perfect decision from the Court of Heaven.

Do you hear what I hear? It's the voice of


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your loving Father answering your prayer.

8. A Church body with the financial strength to support its Godgiven Vision. Immediate Goal: a balanced budget that fully supports the Vision Priorities 2022. Develop a Vision to inspire and expand financial support; reduce and refocus current spending allocations

wherever possible; challenge congregations and Mission Districts to increase their financial support b 1% per year for 4 years; consider a "Ten-Year Anniversary Appeal: in 2020 (thankoffering).


<u>Review</u> the enclosed giving grid. Does your financial giving reflect first fruits giving? Is Christ and the Church first in your budget?
