- It's the 40 day period of repentance and renewal preceding Easter.
- Derived from the Middle English word for "springtime," Lent begins with Ash Wednesday and ends Easter Sunday.
- The final week of Lent—Holy Week commemorates Christ's last week of life on earth: triumphal entry, instituting the Lord's Supper, His arrest, trial and crucifixion.

Christ lived and died to redeem the world from sin. Because of Christ's death and resurrection, our lives can be renewed. We can renounce sin and begin to live for God. The Lenten period allows us time to recall the Easter story and focus on its meaning.



Water Mission is our Lenten outreach focus. Ion addition to the 2023 budgeted line item, all mid-week offerings will be directed to Water Mission. Lenten offering envelopes will be in the Sunday bulletin, beginning February26. Monies placed in these envelopes will be added to the mid-week offering. 
Here are just some of the areas your generosity helped support in 2022:
