Because a growing number of employers are asking job applicants for high school transcripts, the Arkansas Scholars seal could improve your chances for employment.

Note for Parents: As parents, you want a bright future for your children. Then you want them to do their best in school. Your support is the most important factor in your student's education. Encourage them to make good grades, take challenging courses, and attend school regularly. By doing this, you can send a positive message about the value of education.



REQUIREMENTS FOR BECOMING AN ARKANSAS SCHOLAR

If you follow the four criteria listed below in grades 9-12, you will achieve Arkansas Scholars status at the end of your senior year. In addition to the recognition, you will have prepared yourself for more educational opportunities or a better job. You will have positioned yourself to be successful in life.

- Earn semester grades of “C” or above in all courses
- Achieve 95% or better attendance record (averaged over four years)
- Complete the balance of the state mandated high school graduation requirements (Smart Core)
- Finish high school in 8 consecutive semesters
