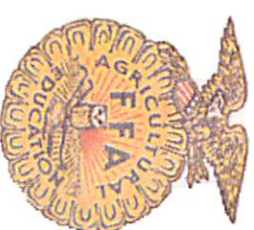

Buy Back Options: After original purchase, if Brother's Custom Processing agrees to buy back your animal at the **current** market price for live weight, you pay only the difference between your bid and the market price. Please note that you are responsible for full purchase price the night of the sale. Buy back arrangements are to be made later. Below is an example of how the buy back amount is calculated:

Random quality inspections may be performed on any carcass. These carcasses cannot be released until the inspection process has been completed. This may create a slight delay in you receiving your packaged meat.

Please make your check payable to Junior Livestock Sale. Visa, Master Card and Discover are also accepted.

Conditions and Helpful Tips for the Moffat County Junior Livestock Sale

1. We would like to thank you for your support of the youth and the 4-H and FFA programs.
2. Large animals are sold by the pound. To determine the total price of your purchase, take the price bid by pound multiplied by the animal's listed weight.
 - a. Example: You bid \$3.50 on a 1300 lb. steer. Take $1300 \times \$3.50 = \$4,550.00$ is your total purchase price.
3. Small animals are sold by the unit. So the price you bid is the total purchase cost.
4. Buyers will be required to obtain a number in order to purchase at the Sale. Numbers can be picked up at the clerks table at the West entrance of the Livestock Barn the evening of the sale.
5. Once the auctioneer has named you as the buyer of the lot, you should hand one of the **BUYER CARDS** to the ring men with the following information:
 - a. **Name(s) clearly printed of every buyer involved in the purchase.**
 - b. **A box checked with your intentions for your purchase (see #6).**
 - c. **Contact Information**
6. After your purchase, you have to make a choice of what you would like to do with your purchase, some of your options include:
 - a. Have your animal harvested and processed at one of our local facilities.
 - i. *Please indicate which processor you would like us to send your animal to.*
 - ii. We will make all the arrangements necessary to get your animal to your chosen processor.
 - iii. You will need to contact the processor with your directions for processing.
 - iv. Once your animal has been packaged, you will be contacted and will be required to pick-up your meat and pay for the processing.
 - b. Donate your animal to charities or other organizations.
 - i. Senior Centers, Horizons, etc.
 - ii. Donated animals must be harvested at a USDA inspected plant and may be responsible for processing costs.
 - c. Sell your animal back to those offering Buy-Back services at set market prices.
 - i. This is done directly between you and the individual offering the service.
 - ii. You are responsible for paying the full bill at the sale, then making the deal with the individual offering the Buy-Back service.
7. After each purchase, we would like for you to get your picture taken with your animal and the youth that you have supported.
 - a. Pictures are taken directly behind the announcer's stand to the East. The easiest way to this area is through the North side of the sale ring; look for the sign "Buyers Photo."
8. **Prior to leaving for the evening, you MUST check-out.** The check-out center is located near the West entrance of the barn. At this time, you will be asked to verify your purchases and ensure that the proper arrangements have been made for your purchase. We would like for you to pay at this time. If you are unable to, you must make arrangements to get payment made ASAP.
9. Enjoy the sale, have a good time, converse with neighbors and most importantly be **safe** in your **trip home!**
10. The Moffat County Jr. Livestock Sale Foundation is not liable for any personal loss or injury.
11. We encourage practicing social distancing and the use of face coverings. Please know you are attending the sale at your own risk and are responsible for your own safety and possible exposures. Moffat County Jr. Livestock Sale Foundation will not be liable for any accidents or possible exposure.

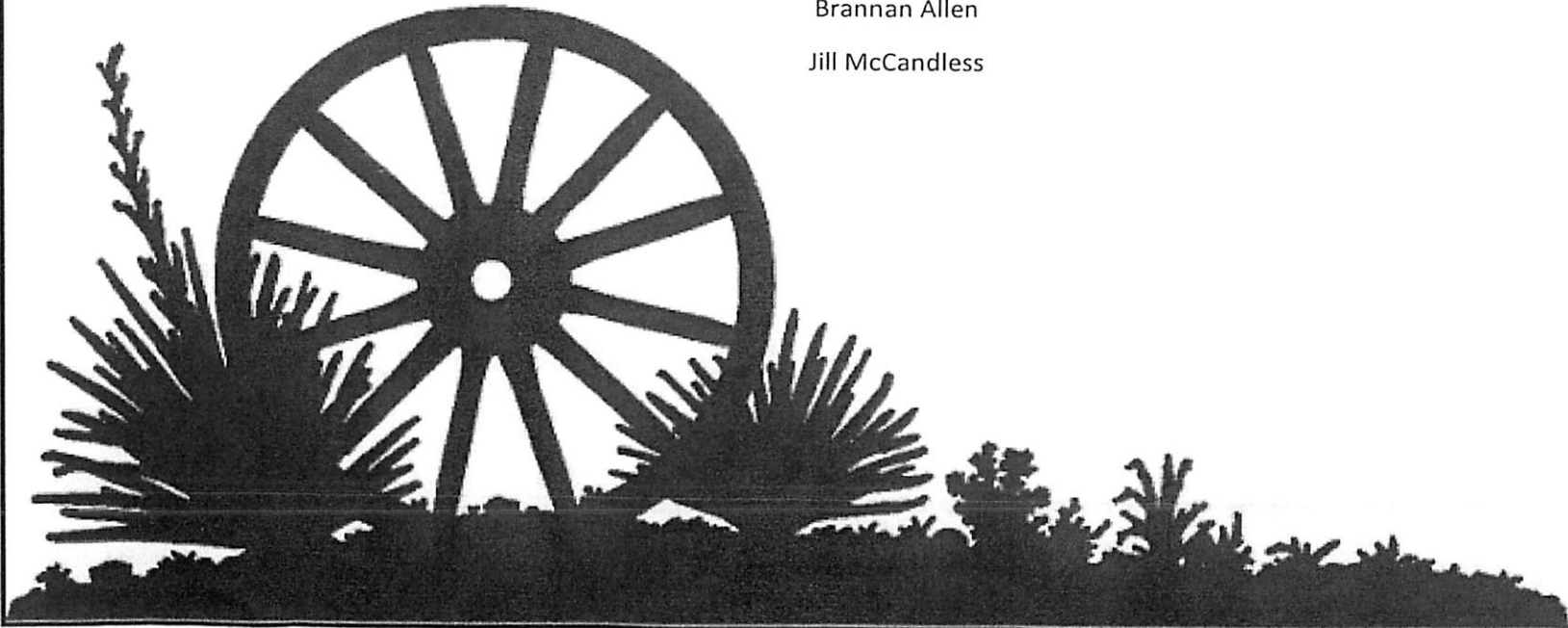
