From the Pastor

Summer Fun and Faith

It's already almost midsummer – and that means it's almost time for Vacation Bible School at Tree of Life! This is often one of my favorite times, as I get to know kids and their families both from the congregation and the wider community. I look forward to my first time helping lead VBS at our congregation!

"Twists and Turns" is the theme of this year's VBS, which will run July 24-28. The Bible lessons for the week follow the story of Jesus and the disciple Peter. Lifeway Christian Resources, which publishes the program, describes it as a "celebration of games of all kinds. From classic tabletop games to video games and more, kids will play their way through VBS while learning that Jesus guides them through all the twists and turns of their lives. They'll find that even when they mess up, it's never 'game over.'"

This year's VBS will be a bit different from the past few years, though similar to what Tree of Life originally offered for many years. Rather than an all-day camp, VBS will mostly take place in the evenings. Rather than charging a registration fee, we'll offer VBS for free to anyone who wants to come. And rather than going it alone, we'll be working with St. Paul's United Methodist Church in Odessa to offer one VBS for the whole community.

These are more changes than I'd usually want for my first year, so I want to briefly explain the reasoning behind them. The main goal with these adjustments is to make VBS as accessible and inviting as possible. Many young people today have a packed summer schedule of camps and programs. Likewise, many adults have work schedules that make volunteering a challenge. By holding VBS in the evenings, kids and families can still take part in other daytime activities, then come to VBS afterward. To make this as easy as possible, we'll be offering a free supper for the whole family at 5:30 p.m. Monday-Thursday. (But kids need not worry: On Friday, we will still meet all day for our usual trip to Killens Pond!)

There is also hope that an evening schedule will encourage more volunteers. A successful VBS takes a lot of people: folks to teach classes, help with games, do crafts, lead music, prepare food and serve general needs. In talking with some members, I got the sense that an all-day camp was becoming hard on their time and energy. So hopefully, more folks will be interested in volunteering, knowing it's just a few hours a day.

Cost is also a factor. If VBS is seen as an all-day childcare option, then a registration fee makes sense. But if we're trying to reach as many kids as pos-


sible, we don't want anyone to skip because they think they can't afford it. This year, everything will be free, except for Killens Pond (and even there, financial assistance is available).

By working with our neighboring church in Odessa, we also hope to make this VBS more fun and inviting. Many kids might already know each-other from school or other activities, so this way there's a better chance of seeing a friend at VBS. And by combining our finances and volunteers, it's possible that our two relatively small churches can offer a bigger VBS than we could do on our own.

All of this will be re-evaluated later. If it turns out that doing our own all-day VBS seems better for everyone, we can consider returning to that format. But my hope is that by working with our Christian kindred at St. Paul's and by focusing on an evening format, we can make this time of fun and faith accessible and exciting for even more people. So spread the word to any kids you know, and consider how you can help out with this wonderful ministry!

Hilltop Lutheran Neighborhood Center "Wild Feelings" and Great Success



In the closing days of the 2022-23 school year, students at the Hilltop Lutheran Neighborhood Center were concentrating on their math and STEM skills. Center Youth Services Coordinator, Teresa Allen, says students performed several chemistry experiments. "(One) experiment was called 'Bean in the bag.' During that experiment we placed two paper towels (one wet and one dry) into a zip-lock bag with 3-4 beans and watched what changed about the beans over a few days. The last experiment we tried was 'Fishing for ice' in which the students tried to pick up a piece of ice using string and table salt from a cup of water."

In addition, Teresa says students completed grade appropriate social emotional learning. "One activity...completed by our rockstar kindergarteners and first graders was called 'Wild Feelings' where they would choose a feeling to draw and write a sentence about it. An activity completed by our fabulous second and third graders was 'Feeling Faces' where they had to match each feeling with the correct picture of a face. Our outstanding fourth, fifth and sixth graders completed an activity called 'What's Max Feeling' where they used pictures from the story we read to describe the character Max's feelings."

Now, a couple of success stories. Thousands of children have passed through the doors of the Hilltop Lutheran Neighborhood Center over the decades. Among these are many children who

have grown up and made a positive mark on Society. One of those recent examples is Kiah Spinks, a summer camp participant for several years. According to former Executive Director, Jea Street, "in the early 1980's (Kiah) was one of a group of participants to go to Federal Court to see Theo Gregory prosecute the KKK. When we left the courthouse (one) day, she said she wanted to be a lawyer. On June 12, 2023 she was sworn in as a Judge in Manassas, Virginia." Congratulations, Judge Spinks!

Finally, numerous children, too numerous to count, have "graduated" from Hilltop over the last 60 plus years the center has been serving the Hilltop Community. All of those children are special, but this year there is one graduate who stands out. According to former Center Executive Director Street, "SaNiyah ...has been a student throughout her childhood. She began to receive scholarships for college in 7th grade. She graduated from Delcastle High (in June) with a 5.0 GPA. She is the great grand-daughter of Sylvia Kee. Ms. Kee (affectionately known to us as Ms. Chubby) was the Hilltop Cook for several decades, beginning in 1971." Congratulations, SaNiyah!
