### It's for Your Own Good

Covid cases are on the rise again. The government and some health officials have said that the coronavirus delta variant is more contagious and deadlier. In addition, the statistics that are being published would seem to indicate that the overwhelming majority of new hospitalizations involve those who have not received a Covid vaccine.

Just this week the Centers for Disease Control (CDC) announced that even those who had received a vaccine were at risk for contracting and spreading the delta variant. There has been no real statistical data collected on this, however. That is simply the current direction of the political winds.

As a result of the recent new spread of Covid, the government has reversed course and demanded that the public begin wearing facemasks again. Both the White House and Congress have mandated facemasks while in those respective buildings. The CDC is also maneuvering to reinstitute a nationwide mandate requiring facemasks.

Recently, a group of parents in Alachua County, protesting the requirement for facemasks in the Alachua School District, contracted with the University of Florida Mass Spectrometry Research and Education Center to test the levels and types of ambient bacteria on facemasks.

The six masks tested had been worn by children in school for approximately eight hours prior to being tested. The UF lab determined that five out of the six masks tested were contaminated with dangerous bacteria, parasites, and fungi, including diphtheria, pneumonia, and meningitis.

In the meantime, the government has launched a campaign demonizing anyone refusing to be vaccinated. Many have refused on the grounds that none of the vaccines have yet been tested for long-range complications. Also, there have been several instances of juvenile deaths as a complication of a vaccine. Nevertheless, numerous countries and many liberal thinkers throughout the world are demanding that everyone receive a vaccine. Our own federal government is among those demanding nationwide vaccinations.

Just this week it was announced that the federal government is considering requiring a vaccine passport for travelers. Others across the nation and within the government, especially Congress, have started advocating for a vaccine passport in order to attend a crowded venue, enter a grocery store, or shop anywhere crowds might gather. Anyone refusing the vaccine or vaccine passport would be denied service.

That alone should be

ample cause for alarm for any well-informed Christian. Revelation 13:16-17 tells us that during the Tribulation no one will be able to conduct business unless he has the mark of the beast. Many have said that the Tribulation will be a cashless society, but that is not what the passage says. It merely indicates that no transaction will occur unless the individual has the mark.

What better way to convince the public to receive the mark of the beast than a pandemic? If you refuse to be vaccinated, you become an enemy of the state. Your family, friends, and neighbors will turn against you. Since carrying a vaccine card will be cumbersome, it is only natural that the government will develop a technology identifying an individual as safe—hence some kind of identifying mark. With the Church having already been raptured by then, those who reject Christ will be in control, and instituting the mark of the beast will be easy and even welcomed by the public.

For now, whether you receive a vaccine or wear a mask is a matter of personal conscience. The vaccines may or may not work. Time will tell. However, the move toward mandatory compliance with such things as a vaccine passport is dangerous. Receiving the mark of the beast is an eternal death sentence (Revelation 14:9-11).


