Jesus Is Coming!

As a result of recent events with the coronavirus, speculation abounds over how this will impact life for the future. Many have expressed concern over how this will impact our liberties. It amazes me that the president and many state governors have successfully placed us under house arrest and many of us out of work, eliminated the right to peaceably assemble, restricted freedom of religion and the right to travel, and in some areas have eliminated the right to protest the government. The police, instead of upholding the Constitution, have arrested many of those who insisted on exercising their rights. Our freedoms have been taken, and no one fired a shot in defense. Is our health worth the price?

However, another important question that we need to ask is What are the biblical ramifications of this pandemic? Does any of this fulfill prophecy? It does not appear that any specific prophecy has been fulfilled by current events, but the stage has been set for the beginning of the Tribulation.

During the Tribulation no one will be able to conduct business without the mark of the beast (Rev. 13:17). The Bible does not say that we will become a cashless society, but the requirement for the mark of the beast certainly makes the elimination of money a reasonable conclusion.

A fourth of the world's population will die due to war and disease (Rev. 6:8). Another third will be killed by an invading army out of the east (Rev. 9:14-18). There is ample evidence to indicate that such an invading army might well originate in China.

Also, during the Tribulation the world will be led by the antichrist, who will be voluntarily placed in power by the nations of the world (Dan. 11:21, Rev. 6:2). This dynamic world leader will take control immediately following the rapture of the church, possibly in order to provide the world with stability on the heels of the sudden disappearance of millions of people (2 Thess. 2:3-9).

Compare these events of the Tribulation to what has been happening today. The government and the media has convinced everyone that the coronavirus is dangerous and that we must give up our civil liberties in order to combat it.

Several officials have also stated that there is a significant possibility that this virus will return with even greater lethality. Immunity may be temporary and the next pandemic will be far worse. We have already seen most people willingly give up their freedom in order to stay healthy. On the heels of

the rapture when millions will have suddenly disappeared, is it possible that the media will convince the world that the pandemic has returned with even greater devastation? How would anyone know what happened to the missing people since they will be under house arrest again?

Suddenly, a dynamic world leader, possibly someone from the World Health Organization, will emerge with promises of safety and good health. The nations of the world will gladly hand over their sovereignty to him in return for a guarantee of a solution to the pandemic.


