Dear Families,

As you are well aware, the coronavirus has made its way to Australian shores and although the spread of the virus has been relatively contained so far it is a good time to discuss personal hygiene and the ways we can reduce the spread of all air borne virus' such as colds and flu. The Dept of Education has been updating schools regularly with the latest advice from health organisations and the commonwealth government. At this stage, there continues to be travel restrictions to and from certain countries including China, Korea, Iran and Italy. Only Australian citizens or permanent residents (or dependents of) will be allowed to enter Australia from these countries. We may have families in our region and school community who could be affected by these restrictions. If you know someone who has been affected please offer them support as this is a difficult time for many. The Dept of Education has requested that all overseas and interstate camps and excursions be postponed for the immediate future. If you or a family member have come into contact with someone who has the virus or become unwell I strongly advise you to visit a doctor as soon as possible. The most common symptoms are a raised temperature, sore throat and/or a cough. Coronavirus or COVID-19 as it is being called is an airborne virus and cannot be treated with antibiotics.

Everyone can protect against infections such as COVID-19 by practising good hand and respiratory hygiene.

Here are some tips that we all can follow:

1. Cover your mouth and nose when coughing and sneezing with a tissue, or cough into your elbow.

2. Dispose of the tissue into a bin and then wash your hands immediately afterwards.

3. Wash your hands regularly using soap and water, including after using the toilet, and before eating. Please refer to the Department's coronavirus web page for the latest advice and information.


