Dear Parents and Carers,

This seems to be a very short week indeed with yesterday being a public holiday for the Melbourne Cup. This week we will be welcoming our 2024 Prep students for their first transition session to our school, and we are all excited to meet them and welcome them to school. As a welcome to our new families (and a thank you to our existing families) I have organised Anywhere Expresso to be onsite from 8:30-9:30am to provide a welcome coffee free of charge to parents. Please come along to school, grab a coffee and come to the eating area to welcome new parents and have a chat.

I have received a phone call from the East Gippsland Shire Council regarding parking around the school. I have included a copy of the school's Head lice policy with this newsletter. From time to time, head lice can become a problem in schools due to students being in close proximity to each other. This often occurs in junior classes as students of this age are more likely to come into closer contact. Please ensure that your child's hair is tied back if it is long enough to do so and check hair regularly for live lice and/or eggs. There are many quick and easy treatments available in supermarkets for head lice or please contact the office if you need assistance. Please remember to treat all members of the household including adults if lice are found as they can spread very quickly.

We have a couple of major events coming up with the Art Show on Wednesday 15th November starting at 6:30pm. This year will feature the tea towel art as well as other examples of student's art. There will be a family art activity as well as time to browse the galleries in each classroom. Thank you to Miss Tracey Buckwell as she has been working hard to make this an exciting evening for the whole school community.

HEAD LICE

POLICY

Rationale:

Head lice (pediculosis) are tiny insects that live on the human scalp where they feed and breed.
 While they do not carry or transmit disease, they are a cause of head itch and scratching, which may lead to infection and swollen lymph glands; therefore, they need to be controlled.

Aims:

- To respond to reports of head lice quickly and effectively.
- To ensure effective processes for treating head lice are well known and consistently followed.
- · To ensure that parents and guardians are well informed about head lice and their treatment.

Implementation:

- Anyone can catch head lice. Head lice cannot fly, hop or jump. They spread from person to person by head to head contact.
- While it is parents who have the primary responsibility for the detection and treatment of head lice on their children, the school will assist by offering up-to-date information and by alerting parents of lice when detected.
- All children may be visually checked for evidence of headlice and parents notified if evidence is found.
- Schools are not required to conduct visual head lice checks but in the event that they decide to, parental consent is required if the student is physically examined. This consent will be given using a pink permissions form provided at the time of enrolment and can be updated each year.
- All children inspected will be provided with a confidential report indicating to parents the results
 of the inspection (see the Form attached), as well as advice on the latest information regarding
 head lice.
- Consistent with Public Health and Wellbeing Regulations 2019, the principal will ensure that the
 parents of any child found to have live lice are informed that their child is to be excluded from
 attending school until appropriate treatment has commenced.
- The Health Nurse will also provide parents of children found to have live lice or eggs with information about head lice treatment and prevention.
- If a parent has reported a case of head lice to the school a notification will go home to all students in the class to inform parents and ask them to check all students.

Newsletter article: Schools in Category 3 on the Bushfire At-Risk Register and the Category 4 list.

School preparations for the bushfire season

Each year, to prepare for bushfires and grassfires, schools and early childhood services complete a range of activities.

The Department of Education runs an annual fire risk assessment of schools and early childhood services. They are allocated a category of risk (categories 0 to 4) and are published on the Bushfire At-Risk Register (BARR).



All schools and early childhood services listed on the BARR and Category 4 list will also close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district.

When the Bureau of Meteorology provides public fire danger rating forecasts or fire weather warnings, they use fire weather district areas. In Victoria, there are 9 fire weather districts, which are based on Local Government Area boundaries. Our school is in the **East Gippsland district**.

As part of preparing our school for the fire season, we have updated and completed our Emergency Management Plan and are up to date with maintenance works to assist in preparing our grounds and buildings.

What does this mean for our school?

Our school has been identified as being at risk of bushfire or grassfire and is a Category 4 school.

Our school will close on a day forecasted as Catastrophic fire danger rating in East Gippsland fire district.

What is the department's policy?

The department's <u>Bushfire and Grassfire Preparedness Policy</u> requires all schools and early childhood services on the BARR and the Category 4 list to close when a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast in their fire weather district. All school bus routes which travel in or through a district with Catastrophic fire danger must also be cancelled.

When will our school be closed due to Catastrophic fire danger?

Our school will close on a day forecasted as Catastrophic fire danger rating in East Gippsland fire district.

Closure of the school due to a forecast Catastrophic day will be confirmed on the day prior and we will provide you with advice before the end of the school day. Any information regarding potential or confirmed Catastrophic fire danger days will be communicated to you by announcement on the uEducateUs app.





Once confirmed, the decision to close will not change, even if the weather forecast changes. This is to avoid confusion and help your family plan alternative care arrangements for your child. It is also important to be aware that:

- . No one will be on site on days where the school is closed due to a forecast Catastrophic day.
- Out-of-school-hours care will also be cancelled on these days.
- All bus routes that travel through the Catastrophic area will be cancelled.
- School camps will be cancelled if a Catastrophic fire danger rating day is forecast for fire weather district in which the camp is located, or if the travel involves passing through areas that have Catastrophic fire danger.

Families are encouraged to action their Bushfire Survival Plan on Catastrophic fire danger rating days. On such days, children should never be left at home alone or in the care of older children.

For those of us living in a bushfire prone area, the Country Fire Authority (CFA) advises that when Catastrophic days are forecast, the safest option is to leave the night before or early on the morning of the Catastrophic day.

What can families and the school community do to help us prepare?

- Ensure we have your current contact details, including your mobile phone numbers.
- Keep in touch with us by reading newsletters and uEducateUs announcements.
- Make sure your family's bushfire survival plan is up-to-date and includes alternative care arrangements in the event that our school is closed due to a Catastrophic fire danger. Further information can be found on the CFA's website.
- Action your family's bushfire survival plan if your own triggers are met. Our school community may
 be spread out across many areas and some families may be at higher risk than others. Your family's
 safety is critical, so please let us know if you are actioning your bushfire survival plan and if your
 children will be absent on these days.
- If your child is old enough, talk to them about bushfires and your family's bushfire survival plan.


