Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been an absolute delight this week to walk around the school and see the smiling faces of students returning for the 2024 school year. There were so many excited voices throughout the week, catching up with friends and telling fun stories of holiday adventures. We also welcome a number of new families to the school. I hope you enjoy your time with us and feel a welcome part of the Eagle Point Primary School family.

This year, the afterschool program will continue to operate 5 afternoons per week from 3:30-6:00pm. We have also started a Before School Hours Program to assist parents who require care for students before school. If students are required to be at school before 8:30am, please contact Theircare 1300 072 410, visit the website www.theircare.com.au or email info@theircare.com.au. Any student from Prep-Grade 6 can access the program after school or on student free days.

On Monday 19th February all staff will be involved in professional learning, building on deepening our understanding of teaching writers. There will be no school for students on this day so please make arrangements for your child/ren to be supervised. Theircare will be operating a program from the Old School Building so please register for this date if required.

The annual swim carnival trials will be held on Monday 12th February at the Bairnsdale Outdoor Pool. All students in Grades 3-6 are invited to try out for the school team but they must be able to swim at least 50 metres without stopping in either freestyle, backstroke, breaststroke or butterfly. Students will travel by bus to the pool with Mrs Simpson and myself. If students would like to register for the trials, please give your name to Mrs Simpson by Friday 9th February.

As the school year begins, I ask parents to please consider where they park while waiting to collect children from school. I understand that it does get quite congested around the school between 3:15-3:45pm but I have noticed that some people are parking over the driveways of our neighbours and along the bushes outside the hall. Parking here means that children are not able to follow the path along the fence-line and are having to walk behind cars onto the road to get into the school grounds. This is extremely unsafe for students. Our neighbour across the road also becomes distressed if they are not able to leave their driveway. If you are not able to find a car parking space at these times, please use the Hall carpark or arrange with your child to meet at the Drop and Go gate where cars can collect children directly from in front of the school without having to get out of your car.

Camps, Sports and Excursions fund eligibility

Below are the criteria used to determine a student's eligibility for the Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF).

Criteria 1 – Eligibility

To be eligible* for the fund, a mature minor of sixteen years of age or over, a parent or legal guardian of a student attending a registered Government or non-government Victorian primary or secondary school must:

- · on the first day of Term one, or,
- · on the first day of Term two.
- a) Be an eligible beneficiary within the meaning of the State Concessions Act 2004, that is, be a holder of Veterans Affairs Gold Card or be an eligible Centrelink Health Care Card (HCC) or Pensioner Concession Card (PCC) holder, OR
- b) Be a temporary foster parent, and;
- Submit an application to the school by the due date.
- A special consideration eligibility category also exists. For more information, see: <u>Camps, Sports and Excursions Fund</u> (CSEF): Eligibility | education.vic.gov.au

Mature minors or parents who receive a Carer Allowance on behalf of a child, or any other benefit or allowance not income tested by Centrelink, are not eligible for the CSEF unless they also comply with one of (a) or (b) above.

Criteria 2 - Be of school age and attend school in Victoria

School is compulsory for all Victorian children aged between six and seventeen years of age inclusive.

For the purposes of CSEF, students may be eligible for assistance if they attend a Victorian registered primary or secondary school. Typically, these students are aged between five and eighteen years inclusive.

CSEF is not payable to students attending pre-school, kindergarten, home schooling, or TAFE.

Eligibility Date

For concession card holders, CSEF eligibility will be subject to the parent/legal guardian's concession card being successfully validated with Centrelink on 29 January 2024 and/or 15 April 2024.

Payment amounts

CSEF payment amount

The CSEF is an annual payment to the school to be used towards camps, sports and/or excursion expenses for the benefit of the eligible student.

- · Primary school student rate: \$150.00 per year.
- Secondary school student rate: \$250.00 per year.

The CSEF is paid directly the school and will be allocated by the school towards camps, sports and/or excursion costs for your child.

For ungraded students, the rate payable is determined by the student's date of birth. For more information, see: <u>Camps</u>, Sports and Excursions Fund (CSEF): Payment amounts | education.vic.gov.au

Foundation and Year 7 government school students who are CSEF recipients are also eligible for a uniform voucher. Schools are required to make applications on behalf of parents, so please register your interest at the school.

How to complete the application form

NOTE: ALL SECTIONS MUST BE COMPLETED BY PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN

Complete the PARENT/LEGAL GUARDIAN DETAILS section.
 Make sure that the Surname, First Name, and Customer Reference Number (CRN) details match those on your


concession card. You will also need to provide your concession card to the school.

- If you are claiming as a Foster Parent or a Veteran Affairs Pensioner, you will need to provide a copy of documentation confirming your status as a temporary Foster Parent or provide your Veterans Affairs Pensioner Gold card to the school.
- 2. Complete the STUDENT/S DETAILS section for students at this school.
- Sign and date the form and return it to the school office as soon as possible. The CSEF program for 2024 closes at the end of term two 2024.

CSEF payments cannot be claimed retrospectively for prior years.

Queries relating to CSEF eligibility and payments should be directed to the school.


