Dear Parents and Carers,

Well, the Grade 5 & 6's are finally off to camp! There have been a few hurdles this year with camp and I would like to thank Mrs Langley, Mr Driver, Zac, Julie and Jack for their hard work in arranging this camp so early in the school year. With camp opportunities such as Sovereign Hill, we have no choice in dates and although getting a camp organised this early in the year has some challenges, it is also an amazing opportunity to get to know the students better and build solid relationships that will last the whole year. Mr Driver let me know that after an action packed first day, the children were having a blast and looking forward to being a part of the museum experience today. On Tuesday and Wednesday, the staff and students dress up in 1850's period clothing and become a part of the museum display, taking on the roles of children in a school in the Gold Fields. Over the next 2 days students experience what it would have been like to grow up and attend school during this time period. Students will leave Ballarat on Thursday morning, visiting Science Works before returning home in the late afternoon. Updates and photos are being posted on Class Dojo.

Next Tuesday, Eagle Point Primary School will be hosting the first Bairnsdale Tambo Principal's Network meeting for the 2024 school year. Principals and school leaders from the Bairnsdale area will come to the school. The first part of the day is in classrooms, where the school leaders provide feedback to our school on an area we choose. This is really useful as it provides us with observations from an expert panel. After this, we will be moving to The Eagle Point Foreshore Hub for the feedback session and the remainder of the meeting.

Next week, students in Grade 3 and 5 will be starting their NAPLAN assessments. The national assessments are held online for all students in years 3 and 5 with the exception of Grade 3 writing which is completed on paper. Students will start with writing on Wednesday, followed by Reading, Numeracy and Language Conventions. The format for the assessments is very similar to both the DAL and PAT assessments that the school uses regularly so the students will have experience and will be able to show us how clever they are. Results will be made available to the school and parents later in Term 2.

If your child is interested in learning a musical instrument, I have been contacted by a member of our school community who teaches piano, guitar and ukelele amongst others. 
