Dear Parents,

Reconciliation Week starts next week on 27th May. This year the theme is 'More than just a word, Reconciliation takes action'. This statement closely aligns with my personal philosophy that we cannot expect change by doing nothing. Authentic change occurs when people make conscious decisions to change their behaviour and knowledge about a topic or an issue and then take action. This year I encourage and challenge each of our families to think about their own position and current action in working towards reconciliation with Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander people. Parents are welcome to come along to school on this day and join in the fun!

With the cooler weather, it is prime time for the increase in head lice. Thank you to the parents who have let us know that their children have been treated before returning to school. Could all parents please check their children's hair carefully and immediately treat if any lice or eggs are found to be present. If you do not have medicated washes or shampoos in the house, head lice can be treated by using a nit comb through hair coated in conditioner. If you decide to use this method please remember that you will need to repeat the combing every day for at least a week to remove any newly hatched lice as the eggs can take numerous days to hatch. Most medicated washes and shampoos do not effectively kill the eggs either so it is important to retreat as per the package instructions.



One of the most important things we can do to slow the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) in our community is to stay at home when we are unwell, even when we have the mildest of symptoms.

What you need to know

1. If a child is unwell, even with the mildest of symptoms, they must stay at home

If a child becomes unwell during the day, they must be collected from school/early childhood education and care (ECEC) as soon as possible.

2. If a child has any of the symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) outlined below, however mild, they should get tested and they must remain at home until they receive their results:

- fever
- chills or sweats
- cough
- sore throat
- shortness of breath
- runny nose
- loss of sense of smell or taste.

In certain circumstances headache, muscle soreness, stuffy nose, nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea may also be considered symptoms.

3. A child must stay at home until they are symptom free, even if their coronavirus (COVID-19) test is negative

If a person has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) or been identified as a close contact they must isolate/quarantine until they receive clearance from DHHS.

Children with persistent symptoms due to underlying conditions such as hay fever or asthma whose symptoms are clearly typical of their condition can continue to attend ECEC/school. They should be tested for COVID-19 if they develop symptoms that are different to or worse than their usual symptoms. They should consider getting a medical certificate from their GP to attend ECEC/school if they have persistent symptoms that may overlap with symptoms of COVID-19 such as cough or runny nose.

Younger children (pre-school up to Grade 2) may have prolonged post viral symptoms such as a runny nose or cough and may return to school/ECEC following a negative COVID-19 test even if they are not completely free of symptoms. They will need a medical certificate from their GP to confirm they are otherwise well or have recovered from their acute illness.

For information on the minimum periods students and children need to stay at home for other conditions, refer to the [DHHS school exclusion table](#).

4. Children do NOT need a medical certificate before returning to school/ECEC

Once symptoms have cleared, there is no requirement from the Department of Education and Training or DHHS for children/students to have a medical certificate before they return to school/ECEC.
