Dear Parents,

Many of you will have listened to the Premier's announcement yesterday and will be aware that for the next week at least Regional Victoria will continue with the current restrictions. I attended a Principal's briefing yesterday to confirm the arrangements for schools.

It was made very clear the remote learning will continue for all schools until the end of term 3. Hopefully after the holiday break schools in regional Victoria will be able to return to face to face learning.

During the week, I hear of students enjoying so many different activities and I would love to see some examples of students working from home. In May, students in Grade 3 and 5 completed their NAPLAN assessments. You may have heard in the news that Victorian students topped the country in their performances. This week we received the student's individual results pages and they will be available for collection between 1-2pm from a collection point at school. As we cannot have visitors to the school results can be collected from the car park during this time. If parents are unable to collect them during this time they will be mailed on Monday. It is important to remember that NAPLAN gives only a snapshot of what students can do and results can vary from what teachers can see over days and weeks. If you have any questions, please contact your child's classroom teacher. Congratulations to all the students for using their growth mindsets and giving their best effort of the day.

One of the most important things we can do to slow the spread of coronavirus (COVID-19) in our community is to stay at home when we are unwell, even when we have the mildest of symptoms.

What you need to know

1. If a child is unwell, even with the mildest of symptoms, they must stay at home

If a child becomes unwell during the day, they must be collected from school/early childhood education and care (ECEC) as soon as possible.

2. If a child has any of the symptoms of coronavirus (COVID-19) outlined below, however mild, they should get tested and they must remain at home until they receive their results:

- fever
- chills or sweats
- cough
- sore throat
- shortness of breath
- runny nose
- loss of sense of smell or taste.

In certain circumstances headache, muscle soreness, stuffy nose, nausea, vomiting and diarrhoea may also be considered symptoms.

3. A child must stay at home until they are symptom free, even if their coronavirus (COVID-19) test is negative

If a person has tested positive for coronavirus (COVID-19) or been identified as a close contact they must isolate/quarantine until they receive clearance from DHHS.

Children with persistent symptoms due to underlying conditions such as hay fever or asthma whose symptoms are clearly typical of their condition can continue to attend ECEC/school. They should be tested for COVID-19 if they develop symptoms that are different to or worse than their usual symptoms. They should consider getting a medical certificate from their GP to attend ECEC/school if they have persistent symptoms that may overlap with symptoms of COVID-19 such as cough or runny nose.

Younger children (pre-school up to Grade 2) may have prolonged post viral symptoms such as a runny nose or cough and may return to school/ECEC following a negative COVID-19 test even if they are not completely free of symptoms. They will need a medical certificate from their GP to confirm they are otherwise well or have recovered from their acute illness.

4. Children do NOT need a medical certificate before returning to school/ECEC

Once symptoms have cleared, there is no requirement from the Department of Education and Training or DHHS for children/students to have a medical certificate before they return to school/ECEC.
