Responsibilities:

- 1. Develop strategies and oversee the implementation of a vision for Women's Ministry.
 - a. Determine priorities.
 - b. Develop action plans.
 - c. Appoint sub-groups where possible.
- 2. Develop the Women's Ministry spiritual growth program.
- 3. Find and recommend Bible study material for Women's Ministry.
- 4. Schedule special events.
- 5. Look for new ways to equip, encourage, and support women.
- 6. Offer growth, fellowship, and service opportunities for women.
- 7. Attend Women's Ministry team monthly meetings. Contribute to discussions and work with dedication to accomplish all team goals.
- 8. Perform individual tasks as assigned by the Women's Ministry team, for the furthering of team goals.

Time Commitment:

- Monthly commitment times vary depending on the position.
- Women are asked to serve a minimum of 1 year. Some positions require a 2-year commitment.

Relationships: The Women's Ministry team is made up of the Team Coordinator, Leadership Development Coordinator, Publicity Coordinator, Materials Reviewer, Special Projects Coordinator, Secretary, and Treasurer.

The Women's Ministry team reports to the Board of Adult Spiritual Growth through the Women's Ministry Team Coordinator. The Administrative Pastor serves as the Spiritual Advisor for the team.

Training: Women's Ministry team members will be trained by experienced members, and will continue to grow through reading relevant material, researching other congregations' Women's Ministry programs and attending Women's Ministry retreats or conferences when available.
