TWO SORT RECYCLING SYSTEM





You Sort, We Sort, and the Facility Sorts Even More!

Mountain Waste employs a "Two Sort" system for collecting recyclables and taking them to the nearest recycling processing facility. This system of dividing the recyclables into two main groups is required by the recycling processing facility that we utilize. We do not own the facility, nor do we set the terms of accepting the recyclable materials.

Here is how the processing facility wants each of us to prepare the recyclables:

FIBER - such as newspaper, office paper, un-coated cardboard (flattened), cereal/food boxes, telephone books, magazines, & junk mail

CO-MINGLE (everything else that is accepted by the MRF) - such as aluminum and steel cans, #1 - #7 plastic bottles/containers, and glass bottles

"Two Sort" Recyclables Take a Shorter Trip, But They Still Go a LONG Way

Mountain Waste & Recycling transports about 80% of the recyclable materials that it collects to the nearest processing facility which is located in Wolcott, CO and owned by the Eagle County government. This is the closest recycling Materials Recovery Facility (MRF) to our area of Colorado and is about 60 miles from Carbondale. This facility requires us to bring your materials to them sorted into two groups.

Please take a moment to prepare your recyclables for their long journey:

- FLATTEN ALL CARDBOARD— cardboard takes up a lot of space in the truck if you forget to break it down; please flatten your boxes
- CRUSH PLASTIC BOTTLES AND CON-TAINERS— put the cap back on the bottle once you have flattened the bottle—this traps the air out and shrinks the bottle for more efficiency in the truck





Items That Are

NOT ACCEPTABLE!

Please, please - DO NOT PLACE YOUR RECYCLABLES INTO PLASTIC

BAGS for collection. The plastic bags cause damage to the sorting equipment at the MRF and can contaminate the load causing everything to go into the landfill

- NO PLASTIC BAGS plastic bags can be recycled at many retail locations such as WalMart, supermarkets, or Ace Hardware
- NO STYROFOAM
- NO WINDOW GLASS, CERAMICS, DISHES, MIRRORS, OR PYREX DISHWARE

Vicious dogs are prohibited within town limits unless properly licensed and all conditions of the code are met. (SMC 6.04.180)

Animal cruelty is prohibited; animals must be properly cared for and treated humanely. (SMC 6.04.150)

Lost your dog? Call Code Enforcement! We may have picked it up, or seen the dog somewhere.

Feral Cats: The removal of feral (domestic and un-owned) cats is the responsibility of the property owner, not the town.

It is prohibited to keep any cattle, horses, swine, sheep, turkeys, geese, roosters or goats within any zoning district of the town. (SMC 6.08.015) chickens, with an appropriate permit are allowed. (SMC 6.08.017)

Wildlife problems: The Colorado Division of Wildlife handles complaints about damage or other problems involving wild animals. They can be reached at 970-947-2920

Automobiles, Parking and Traffic

The unsheltered storage of an inoperable or junk vehicle for thirty days or more on any private property within the Town limits is prohibited. (SMC 10.10.020)

It is the responsibility of both the occupants/owners of the property and the vehicle owner to remove inoperable or junk vehicles (SMC 10.10.050)

If it becomes necessary for the Town to remove an inoperable or junk vehicle the cost of the removal and a 15% administrative fee will be assessed. (SMC 10.10.060)

International Property Maintenance Code

For the purpose of providing minimum standards for existing residential and nonresidential structures, equipment, and facilities for light, ventilation, space, heating, sanitation, protection from the elements, life safety, safety from fire and other hazards, and for safe and sanitary maintenance, the town has adopted by reference as its Property maintenance code, the 2009 international Property maintenance Code, published by the International Code Council. (SMC 15.04.050)

All Buildings within the Town limits must display property numbers that are clear, legible, at least 4" in height. (SMC 15.02.270)

The owner or occupant of any lot, tract or parcel of ground within the town having a sidewalk along or adjacent to any boundary thereof shall cause all snow and ice to be removed from the sidewalk within twenty-four hours from the time of the last accretion of such snow or ice upon the sidewalk. (SMC 12.04.020)



ADDITIONAL WATER SAVING TIPS

- 1. Check faucets and pipes for leaks.
 - A small drip from a worn faucet washer can waste 20 gallons of water per day.
- 2. Install water-saving showerheads and low-flow faucet aerators.
 - Long hot showers can use five to ten gallons every unneeded minute. Limit your showers to the time it takes to soap up, wash down, and rinse.
- 3. Do not use the toilet as an ashtray or wastebasket.
 - Every time you flush a cigarette butt, facial tissue, moist wipe or other small bit of trash, five to seven gallons of water is wasted.
- 4. Insulate your water pipes.
 - You will get hot water faster and avoid wasting water while it heats up.
- 5. Use your dishwasher and clothes washer for only full loads.
 - Automatic dishwashers and clothes washers should be fully loaded for optimum water conservation.
- 6. Keep a bottle of drinking water in the fridge.
 - Running tap water to cool it off for drinking water is wasteful.
- 7. Turn off the water after you wet your toothbrush.
 - Save 2,880 gallons of water a year.
