Melva's Corner TRUE WORSHIP

(Gal. 6:10)



Central Truth: People who have been loved as much as Christians should know how to love one another.

Have you ever thought of paying attention to others (i.e., support, compassion, a helping hand) as a spiritual gift?

Do you remember the biblical character named Barnabas? He had this highly desirable gift. Devoted as he was to loving and honoring God, he dedicated himself to nurturing weak and struggling, cast-off and unwanted souls. This trait of his redeemed personality made him one of the more significant characters in the Acts of the Apostles. Interestingly, his original name was simply Joseph, but the apostles gave him the name Barnabas. The name means, according to Luke, "Son of Encouragement" (Acts 4:36). To call someone "the son of x" is a well-known Semitic way of identifying the person's most notable quality. That Barnabas lived up to his name is apparent from reading through Acts.

In chapter 4, Barnabas sold a piece of land and donated the proceeds for the apostles to distribute to saints in need. It was unthinkable to him that he should have surplus when others were lacking the basics. In chapter 11, he risked his own reputation to take Saul of Tarsus under his wing and involve him in kingdom activity at Antioch. It was unthinkable to him that someone exhibiting repentance and the

desire to join himself to the church should be refused. In chapter 15, he parted company with the now highly respected missionary Paul in order to take a oncefailed younger missionary, John Mark, on a preaching tour with him. It was unthinkable to him that the young man's failure should be turned into permanent shame or that he suffer punishment beyond the anguish of heart he had already endured on account of his lapse of faith. When someone needed a boost of encouragement generated by sincere compassion, he was there.

Ever know anyone like Joseph Barnabas? Over the years, I have known several men and women cut from the same bolt of cloth. They show up regularly in hospital corridors and nursing homes. They pay attention to children who don't smile enough or easily. They sacrifice for missionaries, orphans, and people on hard times. They have such compassionate hearts that their eyes tend to moisten easily. When someone needs a listening ear, they make time to listen - no matter how busy they are. And when somebody asks one of these godly people to pray for him or her, you sense immediately that it will be done.

These women have the gift of caring for others. These men are encouragement. They are genuinely compassionate, kindhearted, and benevolent. And they tend to be very quiet and inconspicuous people whose behavior calls attention to others more than to themselves. Theirs is a genuine spiritual gift. The church is God's community in which this gift is imparted, shared, and appreciated. It is the place where healing occurs through self-giving love that shows itself as concern (not nosiness), compassion (not pity), and comfort (not enabling indulgence).

Created as we were for relationship, it ought not to surprise us to find that the disconnected lives most people live are unfulfilling and even unhealthy. Oh, we go to work along crowded highways and streets, work in sight of others, and sit in packed church buildings. But for many today relationships don't have much quality to them. There is no real depth or warmth. There are lots of acquaintances but few friendships. And it is painful to have no one with whom to share innermost self and private feelings, the heartaches and joys.

University of Research done at the Michigan just before the end of the twentieth century studied just under 3,000 men and women in the United States, Finland, and Sweden, It concluded that a lack of social relationships heightens one's susceptibility to illness and death. The researchers claimed that loneliness is as significant to mortality rates as smoking, high blood pressure, high cholesterol, and obesity. The sort of isolation focused on in that study was characterized by having nobody with whom to share one's private feelings, hopes, and fears. The lead researchers estimated that fully ten to twenty percent of people have close contact with others less than once a week. That percentage has probably grown rather than declined since their research was published.

Plato envisioned an ideal state in his Republic, and Sir Thomas Moore wrote of an ideal society he named Utopia. In the New Testament, God's place of belonging is called ekklesia and the relationship among its members is koinonia. Yet we hesitate to translate the former "church" and the latter "fellowship" for the simple reason that we have cheapened these English terms to mean an innocuous Sunday gathering and pot-luck dinner or my group and its criteria for membership.

In its purest and best instances, the church exists in the world now as an outpost of the kingdom of God. The church is not the fully realized kingdom of heaven, but it is an in breaking of that kingdom and is a group of its citizens in process of spiritual formation. Its presence in the world bears witness to the cross. It testifies to a view of reality that takes eternity more seriously than time. As a visible community of faith, it senses the call of God to bear witness to life in the midst of death, truth in the midst of lies; joy in the midst of despair and good in the midst of evil.

Against the hellish isolation of our time, the church must be a group of people in congregation (gathered-togetherness). The ekklesia of Christ has not only been called out of the world but has been called together for His purposes. This doesn't mean that we are always together in large groups but that we are always together in spirit. Each of us must take the risk to relate to others who share the view of the cross, eternity, and virtue that we profess. Against a cultural reluctance to make commitments, we have committed to be God's presence for one another.

So we assemble on the Lord's Day, celebrate our call from God, discern the body of Christ at the table with our fellowbelievers, and affirm one another. When we do so, we must allow the Spirit of God to quicken us by His presence, to renew holy zeal in our hearts. But beyond our times of spiritual renewal en masse, we must be willing to seek and open to experience contact with one another that allows spiritual intimacy. These are burdenbearing. iov-disclosing, service-sharing experiences that cannot happen in wholechurch assemblies. They are too personal. They require small-group and one-on-one settings.

This is the venue that had to be created by Alcoholics Anonymous because of the church's failure to be the church. They are settings in which men and women abandon defensiveness and lies in order to become vulnerable to one another. They open their hearts without condemnation from the rest

of the group. With the pain of self-judgment already so intense it can hardly be tolerated, they bare their insecurities, addictions, infidelities, and failures to one another as the beginning point for recovery. Without fear of envy in such a community, they celebrate their triumphs, good fortune, temptations resisted, and successes.

The term "church" is a dirty word to some people. And what a pity that is, since Christ Jesus intends for the church to bear witness to Him throughout the world.

For these people, however, church has been the address for a vindictive God, His abusive shepherds, and a joyless flock. They have been regaled over and over again by these very same people with the Four Spiritual Laws or the Five Steps to Salvation as their only hope of escaping hell if they should die tonight. "What if the hypocrites, snake-oil salespeople, and folded-faith witnesses to Jesus as 'my personal Savior' were the ones to die tonight?" They think to themselves. "Mightn't the world be a happier, friendlier place without them?"

And we wonder why these people are turned off to Christianity? We wonder why they are so angry at the idea of prayer in public schools or faith-based initiatives that will get some of their tax dollars? "Well, they're just ungodly souls who won't hear the truth!" someone says. That may be true of some, but many of these people are the most ethically sensitive and professionally upright, family-dedicated and community-involved people you will ever meet.

These people will not hear the message of Jesus Christ about their salvation favorably until its bearer (i.e., the church) is saved first! And the church does need saving from its hypocrisies, injustices, and authoritarianism. The church must get outside itself or – perhaps, better, it must get over itself – in order belie the image

of an us-versus-them attitude of superiority and judgment. To be credible, it must become less institutional and more personal, less defensive of itself and its history and more confessional of its insufficiencies failures, far less materialistic and self-serving and more generous and loving toward people, movements and entities it cannot control or manipulate. In order to be convincing to people who didn't grow up inside it and learn how to turn blind eyes to its obvious defects, the church must get over its addiction to religious power and learn the healthy lifestyle of spiritual vulnerability, where His children tell the story of Christ, affirm the reality of God's love in him, and learn how to pay attention to one another. After all, to "love the whole world" or to "love my (faceless) neighbor as myself" can be nothing more than pious profession. In the church we rub elbows with real people, notice their faults, pay attention to the hurts and needs of these imperfect people and allow God to perfect His love in us by teaching us to deal with one another in love. The church is where God reassures me that I am loved securely enough that I can take the risk of loving you. And that is His message for us all.

People who have been loved as much as Christians should know how to love one another. May it be so here – and in every holy community that has been formed around the gospel of the grace of God.

When the church is together in her corporate worship, the proclaimed (i.e., preaching Scripture) and symbolized (i.e., eating the Lord's Supper) word challenges the bride of Christ not only to be faithful to her husband but to make her transformed nature manifest in serving those in the community. The love that exists freely as self-giving within the Trinity becomes the model for how the individuals who are one in Christ will love one another. The corporate assembly overflows into the daily life experience of all who are in that relationship. Such love blesses even the larger community around that church. The

CALLED TO SERVICE



(Ephesians 2:8-10 NKJV)

Central Truth: God's grace makes us new so that we can do something significant by His power to display His glorious grace to others.

Christian young people today are leaving our churches in droves because they find church to be irrelevant at best, often contentious with non-Christians in the main, and totally lacking in concern for bigger issues of social justice, poverty, hunger, and modern slavery — estimates are that there are well over 25 million people enslaved in the world today, most of them children in horrible situations being forced to do despicable and often barbaric things. As churches squabble over internal differences, divide over denominational loyalties, and find themselves absorbed in the cult of media personalities, young people continue to leave in droves. They see few great works being done with commitment and passion that reflect the ministry of Jesus Christ.

I am absolutely convinced that this is partially the result of an impotent and nonbiblical grace that has been widely taught. This "cheap grace" as Dietrich Bonhoeffer called it decades ago, is false grace. It calls people to a quick and easy formula type of conversion that requires no repentance, no discipleship, doesn't talk about surrendering ourselves to the Cross of Christ, and does little to call people to follow Jesus as Lord.

Remember how the apostle Paul described grace:

For by grace you have been saved through faith, and that not of yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of works, lest anyone should boast. For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them (Ephesians 2:8-10 NKJV).

This great passage doesn't end on the truth that we can't earn our salvation. Instead, it goes on to remind us that grace is God's way of working His artistry in us — we are His "workmanship." God's grace makes us new so that we can do something significant by His power to display His glorious grace to others. Put bluntly, grace is not just about saving us FROM the wrath of God, but it is also about saving us FOR God's purposes in the world.

Okay, so you're not the next Mother Teresa or someone who is going to give up your warm bed to live among street people in the dead of winter. Me either! But we can try to keep our giving and caring from becoming impersonal. We can actually be on-site occasionally. Give time as well as money. Have a conversation. Show real concern.

The emerging generation of young adults is looking for us to do more than come together in insular buildings and talk about moral conduct and celebrate that we've been saved from what is bad. They are looking for us to hear God's grace call us to the Jesus lifestyle of making real differences in the world around us. This high and holy calling is what we've been remade by grace to do — God planned in

advance as our role in this world. So let's be more than reminded; let's be changed . . . let's recognize that God has great things for us to do by His powerful grace so that the world can see the church as Jesus in action.

Awhile back I sent an email to Melva before (June 23rd) asking for your prayers. Mind you, we hadn't even started praying the Hedge of Protection Prayers yet.

the peace and grace of God had come all over and around me. My son said he had felt it to. I had a smile on my face. The same joy a child experiences at an amusement park. The Judge called my son's name; read the charges to him, asked if he understood them; he replied "yes". She then ordered him to pay his attorney \$150 per month he replied, "yes your honor". THEN his attorney stated to the judge and the prosecuting attorney that if they would review the statements of the Victim and the Victim's mother in the case, that it was evident to him that the Victims mother instead of my son should be the one that should be prosecuted here today. The attorney further stated that was also going to present recommend to the Grand Jury that the mother be thoroughly investigated.

Shortly after this, the judge told my son he could leave. She is giving my son time to think over the seriousness of his charges. Time to think about turning his life around . . . In the meantime, the court and the Grand Jury will look at his background and history; investigate the statements of the case, gather the facts and decide if this case is worth spending the time and taxpayers money. My son was given the time to straighten his life out and get his mind right by the JUDGE OF JUDGES THE ALMIGHTY GOD HIMSELF THE MIGHTY GOD WE SERVE.

PRAYER FROM IMPOTENCY TO POWER! Part II

(Rom. 8:26)

Central Truth: "To me, real prayer is simply communicating with God, inviting Him to talk to you as you talk to Him. There is more to prayer, but this is basic to true prayer."

As we continue our study of prayer we have learned through the years that the average Christian does not know how to pray. A friend of mine who has been a Christian for more than fifty years told me, "I never pray in public, and I know very little about prayer or how to pray." Because so many Christians - new and old alike - know so little about prayer, I wish to share with you in the next week or so some simple, basic truths and answer some vital questions about prayer. We will start with the first two:

- 1. What is Prayer?
- 2. Who Can Pray?
- 3. Why Are You to Pray?
- 4. To Whom Do You Pray?
- 5. When Should You Pray?
- 6. What Should Be Included in Prayer?

What Is Prayer?

Someone has said, "Prayer is a dialogue between two people who love each other - God and man." Simply put, prayer is communicating with God. Every Christian has a direct line of communication with God, available at all times. But most Christians never lift the phone off the hook and often forget the line exists until an emergency arises.

Prayer is much more than words, however. It is an expression of the heart towards God. It is an experience, a relationship, not an activity.

As a child of God you are invited to come boldly before His throne. "Since we have a great high priest who has gone through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God," Paul writes, "let us . . . then approach the throne of grace with confidence, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help us in our time of need."

Because the one to whom you pray is the King of kings and the Lord of lords, the Creator of heaven and earth, you come into His presence with reverence. But He is also your loving heavenly Father who cares for you and delights in having fellowship with you. Therefore, you can enter into His presence with a relaxed joyful heart, knowing God loves you more than anyone else has ever loved you or will ever love you.

To me, real prayer is simply communicating with God, inviting Him to talk to you as you talk to Him. There is more to prayer, but this is basic to true prayer.

Who can pray?

Anyone can pray. However, only those who walk in faith and obedience to Christ can expect to receive answers to their prayers. On the eve of His crucifixion, Jesus promised to those who belong to Him, "You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it."

Man instinctively prays whenever He is faced with tragedy, heartache, sorrow or danger - even if only to false gods made of wood, stone, or His own fallen imagination.

But serious danger exists in this. People always assimilate the moral character of the objects they worship. Those who worship gods of lust, for example, become morally degenerate. Those who pray to

gods of blood, gore and war, become militaristic, ruthless and sadistic. Those who bow to the god of materialism become greedy and self-centered. Prayer to anything or anyone apart from God through our Lord Jesus Christ is forbidden. God's Word declares:

Although they claimed to be wise, they became fools and exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images made to look like mortal man and birds and animals and reptiles. Therefore God gave them over in the sinful desires of their hearts...

Paul writes that "anyone who comes to Him (God) must believe that He exists and that He rewards those who earnestly seek Him." By coming to Christ and worshipping Him, you are changed into His image:

We, who with unveiled faces all reflect the Lord's glory, are being transformed into His likeness with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.

This explains the scriptural emphasis on the worship of and prayer to the only true righteous, Holy and loving God.

According to the Scriptures, "There is one God and one mediator between God and men, the man Christ Jesus, who gave himself as a ransom for all men..." Jesus Himself is the only way to God. He says, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me." Does this sound too exclusive? No. Jesus Christ came to die for all people in all lands. He promises rest for all who are weary and heavy-laden. Many people who have ignored God for a lifetime come to a difficult situation near the end of life and are too embarrassed to turn to Him in prayer. They reason, "I've ignored God all my life - it's too late now." Do not feel this way. God listens to the prayer of any truly repentant individual. He proved His love for us by sending Christ to die for us while we were still in our sins. There is nothing that

you or I can do that will cause God to stop loving us.

The fact still remains, however, that you cannot expect God to answer your prayers unless you come to Him in the name and authority of the Lord Jesus as your only mediator and confess your sins and receive Him as your Savior and Lord.

You must also come with a clean heart. The psalmist says, "If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord will not hear: Therefore, you cannot expect God to answer your prayers if there is any unconfessed known sin in your life. Just as the omission of one ingredient in a cake recipe can result in failure, so the omission of confessing any known sin can result in prayer failure.

One of the most frequent hindrances to prayer is an unforgiving spirit. Jesus said, "When you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive Him, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you your sins." In our Lord's Prayer, the words "give" and "forgive" occur in the same context: "Give us today our daily bread. Forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven out debtors." No prayer except the prayer of confession can be answered by God unless it comes from a heart that is free of unforgiveness and bitterness. The well-worn compromise, "Well, I can forgive, but I can't forget," only defeats your prayers. What if that was God's attitude? His love has prompted a wonderful forgetfulness in which He has pledged to put all of your sins behind His back and remember them against you no more. You and I must come to God with a forgiving heart if we are to receive the Christian's legacy of power in prayer.

Those who pray in faith can pray. You must also have a believing heart if your prayers are to be answered. The same Lord who says, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me" and, "Surely I am

with you always, to the very end of the age" also says, "You may ask me for anything in my name, and I will do it" and, "If you believe, you will receive whatever you ask for in prayer" and, "According to your faith will it be done to you."

McClain Ministries Girl's School in Africa

Several months ago Oprah Winfrey built and furnished a girls' school in Africa. She also provided uniforms for all of the girls in attendance and, no doubt, paid their tuition as well. Many of us witnessed this on television and in the newspapers and thought how wonderful it was that she was able to do such a noble and selfless thing. You may have even wished that you could be such a blessing to those who are so needy. McClain Ministries would like to offer you an opportunity to make your wish a reality.

We are building a school in Burkina Faso, Africa. This territory has a population of almost 14 million people. It is comprised of villages, one of which is Tibga. The village of Tibga, our area of focus, is the home of a member of McClain Ministries who serves as a Peace Corp volunteer in the area, Theodis Lever. Theodis has learned a great deal about the people of Burkina Faso. His primary concerns about the area are the extreme poverty and their failure to see the need to educate women. Unlike the United States, an education in Burkina Faso is not free. In a country where the standard annual income is less than \$1,000, tuition averages \$65.00 per year per child.

It is our belief that this concept of not educating females stems from customs and traditions handed down from generations. It is also our belief that very often traditions can be a highly destructive determent to progress. It is written in the Word that "Where there is no vision, the people perish." God has given us a vision for Burkina Faso in order that his people there do not perish. If you can get a glimpse of our vision, we hope that you will join us in making it happen.

In 2008, McClain Ministries will build a girls' school in Burkina Faso, and you can be a part of it. The school will consist of 4 classrooms 2 bathrooms and an administrative office that will accommodate approximately 300 girls. The cost of building the school is estimated at \$25,000. Of course, there are other costs that we will need assistance with such as benches for the school, tuition and uniforms. We are seeking financial assistance with this comprehensive project. For donors who contribute \$1,000, we will place a plaque in the school bearing the name of that person or group. Donations to be applied toward the purchase of benches for the school will warrant a name plate bearing the donor's name being attached to each bench paid for. The combined cost of tuition and uniforms for the girls will be \$75.00. Donors for these costs will be sent a picture of the girls who are assisted by their giving. All donors will receive monthly newsletters giving updates on the progress of the school and the children.

Won't you please join us in this effort? Remember, we are blessed to be a blessing. Our children have been blessed to live in a democracy where the government takes on the responsibility of seeing that each and every one of them has an opportunity to attend school and learn - a blessing so often taken for granted. Help us to provide this opportunity to children who will not only take advantage of it, but who will use it to benefit posterity in their homeland.
