Melva's Corner

LIFE'S REMOTE CONTROL (Your Destiny Awaits You)

Bible Text: Ephesians 4:31-32

Central Truth: When it seems that we are powerless, God wants us to know that He is with us.

When was the last time you picked up life's remote and contemplated switching channels on an education, a job, a friendship, a church, or maybe a marriage? If so, you've slammed up against one of life's most annoying realities - the inevitability of choice. Contrary to the slogan, you can have it all, meaning you can have both the kingdom of darkness and the kingdom of light - just isn't true; you must make a choice. Daily choices can often be confusing, some will be obvious, and some will happen almost unconsciously. But all have consequences, and the sum of those consequences forms your destiny.

Here's the crucial question: by what criteria will you choose? Our culture's most popular alternative is happiness. During the seventies we heard, "If it feels good, do it." Nowadays, we hear about "self-actualization," "listening to the inner child," or "following your heart." But often, self-focused pursuit of personal happiness exacts a steep toll from "peripheral" relationships. Happiness, like the rainbow, is the by-product of something else. Chasing happiness for its own sake is doomed to frustration and ultimate failure. Like Tantalus in the Greek myth, the more we swallow, the more we crave.

Is there another, more reliable criterion? I remember a church song: "Trust and obey . . . for there's no other way . . . to be happy in Jesus . . . but to trust and obey."

Is there truth in this old hymn? By looking away from my desires and focusing instead on a higher Good - on what is right, honorable, and best for someone else - might I discover the key to a meaningful life?

Jesus said, ". . . whoever wants to save his own life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for me will find it." This may sound like Columbus' blather about sailing west to go east. If your world is flat and the horizon of your wants is the boundary for your confidence, Columbus' voyage looks like a lousy bet. But if the world is round; if there really is something out there beyond our narrow vision, maybe heading west to go east makes more sense than we thought.

One thing's for sure, we will spend the rest of our life making choices. That's a given. And the most fundamental choice of all is deciding how to decide.

When we think about the Christmas story, we think of the destiny of Jesus Christ. He was born in a humble manger, but His destiny was to die on the cross for our sins. Even some of the Christmas Carols mention that He is Lord at His birth and that myrrh was given to Him symbolizing His death.

Should we have a sense of destiny in our lives? Yes! Let me help you with your choice, Paul declared this way, "**For we are His workmanship, created in Christ Jesus for good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them.**" (Ephesians 2:10 NKJV)

God has plans for our lives. David said it like this:

**"For You formed my inward parts;
You covered me in my mother's womb.
I will praise You,
for I am fearfully and wonderfully made;**

Marvelous are Your works,
And that my soul knows very well.
My frame was not hidden from You,
When I was made in secret,
And skillfully wrought in the lowest parts of
the earth.
Your eyes saw my substance,
being yet unformed.
And in Your book they all were written,
The days fashioned for me,
When as yet there were none of them.

As we make choices in our life, God wants us to turn to Him in prayer. He will hear and He will answer. He wants us to trust Him in times of trouble. He cares and He will bless. He wants us to have hope in times of sorrow and comfort in times of sickness. When we are afraid, He will give us courage. When we are attacked, He will give us victory. When we are tempted, He will give us strength to resist sin. In His great love and mercy, "The eyes of the LORD range throughout the earth to strengthen those whose hearts are fully committed to him" (II Chronicles 16:9).

When it seems that we are powerless, God wants us to know that He is with us. When it appears that wicked people are controlling the world, God wants us to know that they will answer to Him. After listing the spiritual and world forces that Satan uses to try to destroy our faith in our heavenly Father, the apostle Paul says, "that there is nothing that can separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Romans 8:37-39). No power, either spiritual or earthly, can break God's hold on us as we completely trust in Him.

Paul assures us that while "our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the authorities, against the spiritual forces of evil in the heavenly realms," (Ephesians 6:12) our mighty God, "the God of peace will soon crush Satan under your feet" (Romans 16:20). For we are indeed more than conquerors!


Fulfilling God's purposes for our lives is one of the most gratifying things I can imagine. As we think of the destiny of the Christ Child and the beginning of a new year for each of us, let's ponder on what God's destiny may be for our lives.

Prayer: With a more forgiving attitude in 2007, I will choose not to hold grudges. I will let go of offenses against me. I will ignore more comments. I will not assume the worst in people. I will not hang on to their mistakes. I will not remind them of the mistakes they have made, the flaws I see, and wrongs they have done. I will be more forgiving of myself. I will allow God to truly free me of my sins. I will let go of my past and enjoy the experience of being new.

With a bigger heart in 2007, I will be open to more of the blessings God sends my way. I will notice the small things He places in my path as well as the large ones. I will spend more time with children.

I will listen more, try to understand more and affirm others more often. I will guide more and inform less. I will suggest more and dictate less. I will touch people with more gentleness, hold on to them more loosely and release them with more confidence, hope and love. With a bigger heart in 2007 I will sing more, smile more, hug more, encourage more and enjoy more. In Jesus name Amen.

THE AVALANCHE OF GRACE

Bible Text: Psalm 1:1-6

Central Truth: Every step of the way, prayer is a gracious gift spilling from the mercy and generosity of our Father who loves and cares for us.

Everywhere I go, I hear about it. More and more people are dedicated to it. Most churches have groups that regularly do it. Many people have seen it as their primary calling as a disciple. If you peruse your local Christian bookstore, or look at books online, you will find a large number of titles about it. It is a rebirth in evangelism.

What the great secret that has caused this rebirth? It's no secret, we've just awakened it from hibernation and retrieved it from eclipse. This great blessing is prayer.

As a friend so eloquently put it, "God in His sovereign wisdom chose to wait until we ask for what He longs to give us before He actually blesses us with it." Prayer is our way of asking God — not selfishly asking, mind you, but redemptively and passionately for others and His work. God longs for us to pray for our neighbors and their hearts to be open to the Gospel. God wants us to pray for those who are ill and need healing. God wants us to pray for our children, our families and our marriages. God wants us to pray for rulers and authorities.

Prayer is much more than merely a wish list given to the High King of Heaven! Prayer is a time of confession for our sins, of praise to Almighty God, of thanksgiving for our blessings and of declaring the things God has done. Prayers can be written out, said silently, spoken out loud, uttered while kneeling or standing, offered with uplifted hands, or shouted with joy and jubilation.

Prayer is an avalanche of grace. You see, prayer doesn't really change things; no, prayer changes us. Prayer doesn't really change things; God changes things in response to prayer. Every step of the way, prayer is a gracious gift spilling from the mercy and generosity of our Father who loves us. By grace and the intercession of Jesus and the Holy Spirit, we come into the very presence of God and He hears us. By grace, even when we don't have the words to say, the Holy Spirit intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words and does so in accordance with the Will of God. By grace, God gives us what we need and not necessarily what we think is best. By grace, God chooses to respond to our request for mercy, deliverance, restoration and forgiveness. By grace, prayer invites God to go to work in our world and bring His presence and power to bear on situations too big for us to understand, much less control. By grace, God unleashes His awesome love and power to ripple out across generations, communities, and years. Prayer is an avalanche of grace!

So when the call to pray for the nation and the world shows up on our doorstep, how can we not pray for the leaders of world governments, for the righteousness of our governmental leaders, for peace in the world that will speed evangelism to the nations in bondage and for godly wisdom to be displayed in our schools and justice be honored in our courthouses.


The emphasis on prayer, must never be allowed to be routine or happenstance. God has given us this gift to unleash an avalanche of His grace. So as one who walked in the high country of grace and tasted the sweet air of salvation, isn't time you joined in the sounds that release an avalanche of grace?

Just when you are busy with your fairly - ordinary - not - real - exciting - but - not - really - boring - life, the Lord announces, "I'm here!"

He answers a prayer. You win a victory. A relationship comes alive. You find answers to your questions. Life brings you new challenges.

At a time when you least expect it you discover that the Lord is doing something. Go see what it is that the Lord is doing. It may be the discovery of a lifetime . . . or an eternity.

Our sister Mary Simpson underwent a surgical brain procedure on yesterday . . . December 18th. And just to give you a little medical history . . . please read the following information:

Original Praise Report: We praise God for delivering Mary Simpson during surgery on February 17, 2004. Mary was diagnosed with an 8-cm. aneurysm that was discovered in the main artery above the right eye, a very serious procedure. But God brought her through. She is now home resting and giving God continual praise.

Current Praise Report: Yesterday, Monday December 18, 2006. Mary had a follow up surgical procedure to determine the condition of her surgery two years ago.

The procedure went well yesterday considering the possible residual effects that loom heavy during surgery, especially brain surgery. God was in the operating room once again and Mary is now home resting.

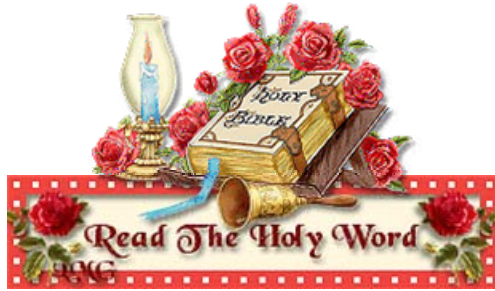


AT THE 6:00 P.M. HOUR OF PRAYER

THE JOURNEY CONTINUES

Each of us is on a journey! Many times it is referred to as "our Christian walk". That's probably as good a way as any to refer to our journey through life. Jesus said "Straight is the way and narrow is the gate that leads to life". My goal is to help any who read my words stay on the path. We are on this journey together! Let's help each other complete it safely!

Do you find serving God and obeying His will to be something hard to do? I know that some people have a harder time than others living as God would wish. Our world puts so many pressures on us to conform to it that sometimes it can be hard to swallow all that we are told we should be doing.

Sometimes we are like the man that declared that he would begin to eat healthier and after hearing so much about the benefits of oatmeal that oatmeal would now be his cereal of choice. After eating his first bowl, he told his wife, "I hope I develop a taste for the stuff, I really hate the texture." "Well," she asked, "how long did you cook it?" "You're supposed to cook it?" he said.

Could part of the problem be in how we receive the word of God? You see part of the problem I have observed through the years is that many people only take in the Word of God as it is prepared and spoon-fed to them by others. God's word is meant to be taken in or "eaten" if you will, by us as individuals and will always taste best when we feed ourselves. Yes, I know that we may sometimes need help in clarifying or understanding some portions of it, but if it is not something you savor and enjoy then the Word becomes a chore to read. David wrote in Psalms 119:103, "How sweet your words taste! Yes, sweeter than honey to my mouth!" and in Psalms 19:9-10 "the judgments of the LORD are true and righteous altogether. More to be desired are they than gold, yes, than much fine gold: sweeter also than honey and the honey-comb."

How about spending more time with a healthy portion of God's word today?

Let's begin by reading the Gospels and truly getting to know what Jesus did so when the opportunities present themselves, we know what Jesus would do in a given circumstance. Rather than being trendy, let's be faithful in living like Jesus.

Here are a few simple things to keep in mind as we begin our journey into the new year with Jesus.

- Let's take out a Bible and make a commitment that when the end of the year comes, the most worn pages in that Bible will be in the Gospels — let's make Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John our tour guides through the new year.
- Let's begin each day praising God for sending Jesus and asking the Father to help us know Jesus better.

- Let's memorize 12 verses about Jesus to place in our heart.
- Let's not lose our joy, our sense of wonder, our excitement of God's love for us in Jesus, just because the Christmas lights are put away!



Twelve Recommendations for Scripture Memorization

January — II Corinthians 5:17, 21

Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come! . . . God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God.

February — I John 4:9-11

This is how God showed his love among us: He sent his one and only Son into the world that we might live through him. This is love: not that we loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as an atoning sacrifice for our sins. Dear friends, since God so loved us, we also ought to love one another.

March — II Corinthians 3:18

And we, who with unveiled faces all reflect the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his likeness with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit.

April — II Corinthians 15:57-58

Christ has indeed been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep . . . Thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, my dear brothers, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain.

May — I Thessalonians 4:15-17

According to the Lord's own word, we tell you that we who are still alive, who are left till the coming of the Lord, will certainly not precede those who have fallen asleep. For the Lord himself will come down from heaven, with a loud command, with the voice of the archangel and with the trumpet call of God, and the dead in Christ will rise first. After that, we who are still alive and are left will be caught up together with them in the clouds to meet the Lord in the air. And so we will be with the Lord forever.

June —John 14:1-3

"Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am."

July —John 14:21

"Whoever has my commands and obeys them, he is the one who loves me. He who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I too will love him and show myself to him."

August —Colossians 1:28-29

We proclaim him, admonishing and teaching everyone with all wisdom, so that we may present everyone perfect in Christ. To this end I labor, struggling with all his energy, which so powerfully works in me.

September —Acts 4:10-12

Then know this . . . It is by the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, whom you crucified but whom God raised from the dead, that this man stands before you healed . . . Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved.

October —John 16:33

"I have told you these things, so that in me you may have peace. In this world you will have trouble. But take heart! I have overcome the world."

November —John 1:14, 18

The Word became flesh and made his dwelling among us. We have seen his glory, the glory of the One and Only, who came from the Father, full of grace and truth . . . No one has ever seen God, but God the One and Only, who is at the Father's side, has made him known.

December —John 3:16-17

For God so loved the world that he gave his one and only Son, that whoever believes in him shall not perish but have eternal life. For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but to save the world through him.

PROJECTS 2007

1. Computer Clinic

Provide a comprehensive computer-training program for economically disadvantaged individuals and others to prepare them to compete in today's job market. This activity will serve as a resource center to provide individuals with the technical skills needed to propel some from welfare to workfare and others from unskilled to skilled positions. This project will be initiated March, 2007 and completed May, 2007.



2. Tutoring Classes



Tutoring classes will be offered during the regular school term as well as the summer for those students who are slow learners, have learning disabilities or lack the aptitude to compete with others in a regular classroom setting. This activity will enhance individuals self esteem and decrease the student dropout rate. Plans are to initiate this project in the fall of 2007 using retired and active school teachers.

3. Community Pantry

Plans are to partner with local agencies including soup kitchens and shelters in an effort to supplement their services by providing can good items on an as need basis. This activity will serve as reinforcement to current community outreach programs. The project will be initiated October, 2007.

Keep Right at the fork on the ramp

Keep Right onto US-80.

Just pass the 3rd traffic light
Turn Left onto TRICKHAMBRIDGE RD
(Travel Approximately 3 miles)

Turn Left onto N. BRANDON BLVD. (SAME
AS NORTH BRANDON ESTATES)

Turn Left onto RIDGESIDE DR.
