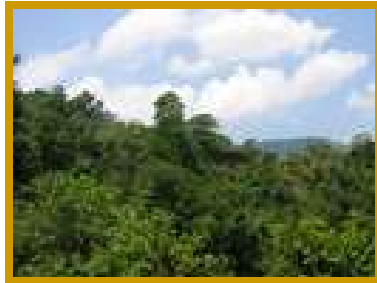

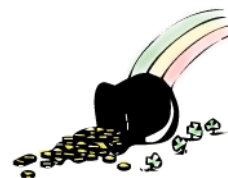

Melva's Corner

ROAD TO RIGHT RELATIONSHIPS

Bible Text: John 20:31

Central Truth: There are vulnerable and woundable people who need someone to love them unreservedly — just like you and I do!

Last week we introduced the plan to learn how to treat people more appropriately. And that plan is really simple. We're going to let Jesus be our coach.

God's number-one priority is people. To do His main thing, God became "a people" and relocated to live among people. Jesus, who became God in a body, was out there on the people turf. For Jesus, people are job one. For authentic followers of Jesus, people become top priority as well.

The Word says that when Jesus owns us and fills us, we see people in a whole new way. "For Christ's love compels us" and thus we "should no longer live for [ourselves], but for Him.... So from now on we regard no one from a worldly point of view. We have a new view of people because if "anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation; the old has gone, the new has come!" (II Corinthians 5:14-17) The old view of people is gone! The new view of people has come. And since we are "Christ's ambassadors, God is making His appeal through us." (II Corinthians 5:20)

So God, who is in the people business, has also called us to people-centered living. The most godlike thing we can do is to treat people like Jesus did.

The way Jesus put it; our love for God is expressed, not in pews, pulpits, and stained-glass tones, but in relationships

with people — in the way you and I get along with him, her, and them. If being with God on Sunday doesn't make us better at being with people on Monday, then we've missed the point. Real Christianity shines in right relationships.

The grist of Christianity is ground out in the mill of marriages, friendships, partnerships, neighborhoods, communities, property lines, and sales contracts. Or to simplify it, if we really love God, the first ones to benefit will be family, friends, and neighbors

Hmm. That complicates things a bit, especially when you think about our neighbors! Grumpy ones. Mean ones. Lazy ones and so on.

We come into the world in families. Then we must fit into society, schools, and other organizations. We must interact with others for success to come to us in any personally effective way.

What does all this mean? It means that not merely your success, but also your personal fulfillment — maybe even your survival — depend on your ability to manage and nurture healthy relationships.

But it sure is hard for us to get along with each other. Linus, the Peanuts comic strip character, said it for all of us: "I love the world. It's people I can't stand."

Doing right by people should be the Christian's forte. Isn't our mission the same as Jesus' mission? Touching people? Didn't John say, "For anyone who does not love his brother, whom he has seen, cannot love God, whom he has not seen"? (I John 4:20)

As believers, we need to help each other remember our new identity and to encourage each other to live passionately

as members of God's Kingdom of light (**Hebrews 3:12-14**). In this world, we may feel like strangers and exiles, but we are actually God's holy and special people called to live a life based on love.

So we come to an important personal question: How are your relationships? Think for just a minute about the people in your world. Some are in your life by choice: your mate, your best friend, perhaps a business associate. Others you inherited: your relatives, your next-door neighbor, maybe your boss. But no matter how you became connected with them, they all have one thing in common:

They are vulnerable and woundable people who need someone to love them unreservedly — just like you and I do!


Could you use a little help in doing right by people? I guess we all could.

So again . . . what's the plan!

Simple. Allow the Holy Spirit to paint a picture of Jesus inside us.

Jesus will be our coach. We're going to learn from Jesus how to treat people!

ROAD TO RIGHT RELATIONSHIPS

Part II

Bible Text: (John 1:14)

Central Truth: How can we connect with people if we step around the inconvenient times and unpleasant places where they live their lives?

Two weeks ago, we introduced the plan to learn how to treat people more appropriately. And that plan is really simple. We're going to let Jesus be our coach. Let's start with Jesus and the Samaritan Woman (**John 4:1-17 NLT**)

Jesus learned that the Pharisees had heard, “Jesus is baptizing and making more disciples than John” (though Jesus Himself didn't baptize them — His disciples did). So he left Judea to return to Galilee.

He had to go through Samaria on the way. Eventually He came to the Samaritan village of Sychar, near the parcel of ground that Jacob gave to his son Joseph. Jacob's well was there; and Jesus, tired from the long walk, sat wearily beside the well about noontime. Soon a Samaritan woman came to draw water, and Jesus said to her, “Please give me a drink.” He was alone at the time because His disciples had gone into the village to buy food.

The woman was surprised, for Jews refused to have anything to do with Samaritans. She said to Jesus, “You are a Jew, and I am a Samaritan woman. Why are you asking me for a drink?”

Jesus replied, “If you only knew the gift God has for you and who I am, you would ask me, and I would give you living water.”

“But sir, you don't have a rope or a bucket,” she said, “and this is a very deep well.

Where would you get this living water? And besides, are you greater than our ancestor Jacob who gave us this well? How can you offer better water than he and his sons and his cattle enjoyed?"

Jesus replied, "People soon become thirsty again after drinking this water. But the water I give them takes away thirst altogether. It becomes a perpetual spring within them, giving them eternal life."

"Please, sir," the woman said, "give me some of that water! Then I'll never be thirsty again, and I won't have to come here to haul water."

"Go and get your husband," Jesus told her.

"I don't have a husband," the woman replied. Jesus said, "You're right! You don't have a husband — for you have had five husbands, and you aren't even married to the man you're living with now."

A Wounded Outsider

If there ever was a woman with a wounded soul, this "outsider of Samaria" was one. She didn't hide it. She couldn't hide it. It was too obvious. Possibly her shoulders slumped from both the water jar and the weariness of her pain. Likely her eyes looked tired from ducking condemning glances fired in her direction. Her heart was scarred and calloused from the train of men in her life. Her gait was difficult and slow as if each step were a trudge through the thick mud of her past. Perhaps half a dozen kids, each looking like a different daddy, tagged along stair-stepped behind her.

Maybe Jesus wondered what she was doing there at noon. Most people came in the cool of the morning. Perhaps she came for no other reason than a hot day demanded an extra draw of water. Or more likely, "decent" people didn't come to the well at noon.

They cleared out so they wouldn't have to rub shoulders with the riffraff. Perhaps, for this woman, being shoved to this hour with the "trash" wasn't fun, but at least it cut down on the daily barrage of cheap comments and rude stares.

"Here she comes. They say she'll sleep with any man.

"Her kids are the worst on the street."

"Did you hear that she has a new lover?"

"The last one left her."

She was a wounded soul, this "outsider." It was worth a walk in the hot sun to be away from the words that wounded so deeply.

Bridging Social Chasms

As surely as Jesus wondered what brought the woman to the well specifically at noon, she probably wondered what Jesus was doing there at all! One glance told her that He was a Jew. And in Samaria! "What was this Jew guy up to?"

Jews avoided Samaria at all costs. The shortest line from Galilee to Judea ran through Samaria, but most Jews would walk the long way around, adding extra miles on foot, to avoid contact with Samaritans. "Might get contaminated." "Hard to buy kosher foods." Discrimination was rampant.


But Jesus and His disciples deliberately walked smack into the middle of Samaria. He even stopped at a public watering hole at noon—the hour of the riffraff, no less. He was available, even to this despised Samaritan woman. That's the way Jesus was. The way He still is! His feet tread the turf of the people He's trying to touch.

How can we connect with people if we step around the inconvenient times and unpleasant places where they live their lives?

Jesus' heart for people wouldn't let Him dodge the unwanted or steer clear of the unpopular. For Him, each person has immense value. So here again in Samaria, Jesus deliberately placed Himself face to face with a person whom, apparently, no one else wanted. The real question for us is very simple: "Would we?"

Let's learn from Jesus how to treat people!

So the Word became human and lived here on earth among us. He was full of unfailing love and faithfulness. And we have seen his glory, the glory of the only Son of the Father. (John 1:14)

(Ephesians 4:1)

Central Truth: It's time to get our church-going backsides off the pews and get our hands dirty doing the work of grace.

We have become a celebrity-obsessed culture. Character, virtue, and value have completely given way to glamour, to image, to street cred, and to personality cultism. Maybe our fascination with the glitzy and the glamorous has always been an obsession. Yet somehow, as we tend to creep toward lives of hyper-reality rather than authenticity, we seem consumed with a covetous voyeurism toward the rich, the beautiful, the famous, the movie star chic, and the athletic. Life is not even lived on the fringes; it is now lived on the rumor, the potential publicity, and the glitz of the pseudo-world of stardom.

So what do we do? What can we do? Or should we even care?

We must care! When an athlete's overdose gains more attention and focus than the murder of a sixteen year old student gunned down by her fellow classmate or principal's murder by a student, something deep within us has seriously broken.

We must awaken and realize that the show on Sunday isn't God's goal for us. Instead, it must be the motivation for us to be the people of God who daily live redemptive lives in our communities as the recognizable aroma of Jesus. (I'm not bashing relevant and cutting communication and worship, but if we continue the long-time Western trend of going to church as our Christian focus, our impact on our world will continue to be insensitive political rhetoric and not Jesus' work of human redemption.)

To put it in plain English, it's time to get our church-going backsides off the pews and get our hands dirty doing the work of grace.

We can care! As Jesus seekers, everyday folks committed to carry on the life of Jesus in the world; we can and must serve our communities. There are a jillion ways from volunteering as foster parents, being a Big Brother or Big Sister, working with Meals on Wheels, volunteering as a school tutor, visiting people in the hospital, finding needy people and anonymously supplying them with groceries in times other than Christmas or Thanksgiving and on and on we can go.

So . . . let's quit whining about our culture "going to hell in a hand basket" and get busy lending our warped world a hand that helps and doesn't hurt! Anything less is simply not worth our time or worthy of our calling.

So here's the deal. I'm interested in what you think about this.

Letters from home during these times are appreciated, too.

- Individually wrapped pieces of candy, examples - Twizzlers, Tootsie Rolls, and Tootsie Roll Pops, Bubble Gum, Skittles, suckers, Lifesavers, Candy Sticks, Sweet Tarts.
- Cookies, peanuts, pretzels and other snack foods.
- Wet wipes, sunscreen, lip balm, foot powder, batteries, wrap around sunglasses, small pencil sharpeners, Kool-aid and other drink mixes.
- Blank greeting cards - variety, toiletry items such as shaving cream, razors, toothbrushes, shower soap/gel and toothpaste.
