- "I'll never find a job that pays this well anywhere else."
- "It is my responsibility to support my family, you know."
- "I've invested too many years in this company to start over."
- "I like my job, and besides, God will give me the strength to overcome the temptations that exist here."

We hang with a group of people who pursue lifestyles and activities that are ungodly and worldly, yet see no reason to change peer groups.

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 "How will they ever get to know Jesus if I don't spend time with them."

• "I know they pressure me into sinning, but every once in a while I've been able to stand up to the pressure."

Our secret sins flourish in the dark places that we visit when we think no one is watching, then we keep going back for more.

- "I probably should get out of these ungodly chat rooms on the Internet, but I use them for so many other useful things."
- "I can't just stop going to the store around the corner! I know that its easy access to the alcohol next door that has a hold on me, but avoiding the store isn't going to help."
- "It's not what you think, she and I are just good friends. So what if we spend time alone. We need each other to help work out some of our problems."

Here's the bottom line. You know it and I know it. We won't win the battles if we refuse to lose the things in life that keep us from following Jesus. I'm not just talking about the end result things; I'm also talking about those little steps of compromise along the way. So, let's pick up our cross today and lose our lives for Jesus' sake. Let's find a way to stand up to the temptations on the job or find another job if necessary. Let's stay in touch with worldly friends, but chose godly people for our closest friends. And by all means, let's turn away from those dark, secretive places and run for the light! We'll never lose anything in life worth keeping if we give it up for Jesus' sake!
