Bible Excerpts About Prayer and Healing

Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, <u>present your requests to God</u>. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (**Philippians 4:4-7**)

Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them pray. Is anyone happy? Let them sing songs of praise. <u>Is</u> anyone among you sick? Let them call the elders of the church to pray over them and anoint them with oil in the name of the Lord. And the prayer offered in faith will make the sick person well; the Lord will raise them up. If they have sinned, they will be forgiven. Therefore <u>confess your sins to each other</u> and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective. Elijah was a human being, even as we are. He prayed earnestly that it would not rain, and it did not rain on the land for three and a half years. Again he prayed, and the heavens gave rain, and the earth produced its crops. (James 13:18)

Hide your face from my sins, and blot out all my iniquities. <u>Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me</u>. Cast me not away from your presence, and take not your Holy Spirit from me. Restore to me the joy of your salvation, and uphold me with a willing spirit. (**Psalm 51:9-12**)

<u>Surely he took up our pain and bore our suffering</u>, yet we considered him punished by God, stricken by him, and afflicted. But <u>he was pierced for our transgressions</u>, he was crushed for our iniquities; the <u>punishment that brought us peace was on him</u>, and by his wounds we are healed. (Isaiah 53:4-5)

And Jesus went about all the cities and villages, teaching in their synagogues, and preaching the gospel of the kingdom, and <u>healing every sickness and every disease among the people</u>." (Matthew 9:35)

<u>Very truly I tell you, whoever believes in me will do the works I have been doing, and they will do even</u> <u>greater things than these</u>, because I am going to the Father. And <u>I will do whatever you ask in my</u> <u>name, so that the Father may be glorified in the Son. You may ask me for anything in my name, and I</u> <u>will do it</u>. (John 14:12-14)

When they came to the crowd, a man approached Jesus and knelt before him. "Lord, have mercy on my son," he said. "He has seizures and is suffering greatly. He often falls into the fire or into the water. I brought him to your disciples, but they could not heal him." "You unbelieving and perverse generation," Jesus replied, "how long shall I stay with you? How long shall I put up with you? Bring the boy here to me." Jesus rebuked the demon, and it came out of the boy, and he was healed at that moment. Then the disciples came to Jesus in private and asked, "Why couldn't we drive it out?" He replied, "Because you have so little faith. <u>Truly I tell you, if you have faith as small as a mustard seed, you can say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,' and it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you."</u> (Matthew 17:14-20)

The next day as they were leaving Bethany, Jesus was hungry. Seeing in the distance a fig tree in leaf, he went to find out if it had any fruit. When he reached it, he found nothing but leaves, because it was not the season for figs. Then he said to the tree, "May no one ever eat fruit from you again." And his disciples heard him say it. When evening came, Jesus and his disciples went out of the city [of Jerusalem]. In the morning, as they went along, they saw the fig tree withered from the roots. Peter remembered and said to Jesus, "Rabbi, look! The fig tree you cursed has withered!" "Have faith in God," Jesus answered. "Truly I tell you, if anyone says to this mountain, 'Go, throw yourself into the sea,' and does not doubt in their heart but believes that what they say will happen, it will be done for them. Therefore I tell you, whatever you ask for in prayer, believe that you have received it, and it will be yours. And when you stand praying, if you hold anything against anyone, forgive them, so that your Father in heaven may forgive you your sins." (Mark 11:12-25)

Then Peter said [to the beggar], "Silver or gold I do not have, but what I do have I give you. In the name of Jesus Christ of Nazareth, walk." Taking him by the right hand, he helped him up, and instantly the man's feet and ankles became strong. He jumped to his feet and began to walk. Then <u>he went</u> with them into the temple courts, walking and jumping, and praising God. (Acts 3:6-8)

Do you not know that <u>you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you</u>? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy him. For <u>God's temple is holy, and you are that temple</u>. (**1 Corinthians 3:16-17**)

Do you not know that <u>your bodies are temples of the Holy Spirit</u>, who is in you, whom you have <u>received from God</u>? (**1 Corinthians 6:19-20**)

"<u>The Spirit of the Lord is upon me</u>, because he has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to proclaim liberty to the captives and <u>recovering of sight to the blind</u>, to set at liberty those who are oppressed, to proclaim the year of the Lord's favor." (**Luke 4:18-19 / Isaiah 61:1-2a**)

"If you love me, keep my commands. And <u>I will ask the Father, and he will give you another advocate</u> to help you and be with you forever — the Spirit of truth. The world cannot accept him, because it neither sees him nor knows him. But you know him, for he lives with you and will be in you. <u>I will not</u> <u>leave you as orphans; I will come to you.</u>" (John 14:15-18)

I tell you the truth: it is to your advantage that I go away, for if I do not go away, the Helper will not come to you. But if I go, <u>I will send him to you</u>. When he, the Spirit of truth, comes, he will guide you into all the truth. He will not speak on his own; he will speak only what he hears, and he will tell you what is yet to come. <u>He will glorify me because it is from me that he will receive what he will make known to you</u>. (John 16:7-14)

When Jesus came down from the mountainside, large crowds followed him. A man with leprosy came and knelt before him and said, <u>"Lord, if you are willing, you can make me clean." Jesus reached out his hand and touched the man. "I am willing," he said. "Be clean!"</u> Immediately he was cleansed of his leprosy. (**Matthew 8:1-3**)

"This, then, is how you should pray: "'Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name, your kingdom come, <u>your will be done, on earth as it is in heaven</u>. Give us today our daily bread. And forgive us our debts, as we also have forgiven our debtors. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from the evil one. (Matthew 6:9-13)

"Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moths and vermin destroy, and where thieves break in and steal. But <u>store up for yourselves treasures in heaven</u>, where moths and vermin do not destroy, and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." (Matthew 6:19-21)

Since, then, you have been raised with Christ, <u>set your hearts on things above, where Christ is, seated</u> <u>at the right hand of God. Set your minds on things above, not on earthly things.</u> For you died, and your life is now hidden with Christ in God. When Christ, who is your life, appears, then you also will appear with him in glory. (**Colossians 3:1-4**)

<u>I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content</u>: I know how to be abased, and I know how to abound. Everywhere and in all things I have learned both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need. <u>I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me.</u> (**Philippians 4:11b-13**)

<u>Blessed is the one who perseveres under trial because, having stood the test, that person will receive</u> the crown of life that the Lord has promised to those who love him. (James 1:12)
