The Board of Trustees have approved the purchase of equipment that will give First Baptist the ability to livestream all worship services, even after restrictions on public gatherings are lifted. Cost will be between \$3,000 and \$4,000. Because of COVID-19, equipment may not be available until the end of July.
