They both sinned and because of them, the whole human race are born sinners. No one had to teach you to sin. It came naturally.

Romans 3:12 says, "... there is none that doeth g____, no, not o_."

That means everyone sins and no one is perfect without sin. We all are sinners. We all do bad things that displease God. Some examples of bad things we do are stealing, lying, cheating, disobeying and many more.

He did that all for you freely. He died for your sin and rose again the third day **just for you**. What Christ Jesus did for us was a gift. We did not deserve it, we just receive it as a gift at Christmas time.

Romans 6:23, "For the wages of sin is death; but the g__ _ of God is eternal l_ _ through Jesus Christ our Lord."

The only way to get a gift is to receive it.

John 1:12, "But as many as r_____ him, to them gave he power to become the sons of God, even to them that believe on his name:"

Here is how we receive Christ: by calling on Jesus Christ to save us and by believing on Him with all of our heart.

Romans 10:13, "For whosoever shall c____ upon the name of the Lord shall be saved."

Here's what you tell Jesus when you call on the Lord.

- 1. Admit that you are a sinner and do bad things.
- 2. Thank Christ for dying for you and paying your punishment. Believe that He rose from the dead.
- 3. Ask Him to come into your heart and save you.

(That is what receiving Christ means.)

You can do that anywhere, at anytime. If you have not received him, do it now! Once you have received Christ into your heart he will never leave you.

Hebrews 13:5, "I will $n_{_}$ _ _ _ leave thee, nor forsake thee." Once you have been saved, Jesus will never leave you and never forget about you. John 10:28, "And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any $m_{_}$ _ pluck them out of my hand."

God keeps us saved. If good works, going to church and being good can not save us, it can not keep us saved either. God saves us and keeps us. Now as a child of God, we must be good, obedient children. Going to church, reading our Bibles, telling others about Jesus, praying and obeying the Lord's commandments are ways to be good, obedient children.









Exodus 20:12, "Honour thy father and thy mother: that thy
d may be l upon the land which the LORD thy
God giveth thee."
Obeying our parents is very important to God. Jesus said in Mat-
thew 15:4, "Honour thy father and mother: and, He that curseth
father or mother, let him d the d " Disobedience
to our parents was worthy of death in Israel's law a long time ago. It
pleases God if you obey your parents. Colossians 3:20, "Children,
obey your parents in all things: for this is w pleasing unto
the Lord."
$\begin{bmatrix} 1 \\ II \end{bmatrix}$ VI One of the 10 commandments is obeying our par-
iii viii ents. The fifth commandment is this: Exodus 20:12,
"H thy father and thy mother: that thy
days may be long upon the land which the LORD thy God giveth
thee." To honour our parents is to respect what they say and do it-
not asking why, not complaining and not getting angry. The best way
to honour your parents is to obey them without ques-
tion.
The Bible has many examples for us to follow. Even
Jesus as a child obeyed his parents. When Jesus was 12 years old, His
family went to Jerusalem for the passover feast. When it was all over,
His family started back home. They did not realize that Jesus was not
with them until a full day was gone. Joseph and Mary found Him in
the temple. Jesus obeyed His parents and went home with them. Luke
2:51 says, "And he (Jesus) went down with them (parents), and came
to Nazareth, and was s unto them:"
Another example was Isaac. One day God tested Abraham and

told him to go and sacrifice his son Isaac to see if he would pass the

test. Abraham willingly said yes. Isaac allowed Abraham to tie him up. Isaac did not fight to get out of the situation. Isaac obeyed his father, even though Isaac did not fully understand why. Genesis 22:9 says, "And they came to the place which God had told him of; and Abraham built an altar there, and laid the wood in order, and b______ Isaac his son, and l_____ him on the altar upon the wood." Right when Abraham was ready to kill Isaac, an angel said stop. God provided a ram stuck in a bush to be sacrificed

instead of Isaac. Through all this trial, Isaac still obeyed his father.

If you have received Jesus Christ as your Savior, then God is your heavenly Father. We must obey our

heavenly Father. When God says something we should listen to what He says and obey Him. The Bible is God's Word to us. Always listen to what the preacher says about God and obey it. When God tells us to obey our parents, we should obey our heavenly Father by obeying our parents. What happens if we disobey? Then we need to ask our heavenly Father to forgive us and tell our parents we are sorry for disobeying.





truth all the time. God knows your thoughts.

God wants us to be satisfied with what we have
and not worry about what other people own. Do
not ask to have things that you do not need. God
wants us to depart from coveting.
God told us in Colossians 3:8 to "put off all these;
a, w, m(fight-
ing), blasphemy (cursing), filthy communication out of
your mouth (telling dirty stories and jokes)."
God wants us to be more like Him.

The devil is evil. When we do a lot of evil things we are acting like the Devil - not God. Try to be like God. Depart from evil! Ask God for His help today.

It is easy to guess what these people do because they look like a barber, doctor, fireman and police officer. It is the same way for a child of God. People know us by what we look like and more importantly how we act. If I would say your friends name, you might think to yourself - "He or she is a good friend or a bad friend because of how he or she behaves." We are known by others for the good or bad that we do, also. That is why it is so important to be doing the right thing all the time. We don't want to be known as a bad child but a good child. Here are some right things we should be doing as a child of God.

1. Reading our Bible.

Joshua 1:8 says, "This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein d___ and n____, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: "A good time to read is in the morning or at night. But you can read any time you have free time. Start in Matthew and read a verse or a chapter a day. The reading of the Bible will help you keep doing the right thing. Psalms 119:11 says, "Thy w____ have I hid in mine heart, that I might not sin against thee." Keeping the Word in our heart is memorizing verses like this one and others from the Bible.

2. Praying.

A man named Daniel in the Bible prayed three times a day. We should learn to pray, too. These are some times that we should learn to pray:

a. When we get up and when we go to bed.

A man named Job in the Bible got up every morning to pray for his children. Psalms 55:17 says, " $E_{\underline{}}$," and morning, and at noon, will I pray..."

b. When we eat.

Pray every time before you eat. Jesus did in *Matthew 15:36*, "And he took the seven loaves and the fishes, and gave $t_{_}$, and brake them, and gave to his disciples.."

c. When we have important decisions.

Ask God to help you make the right decision when you don't know what to do.

3. Telling others about Christ.

God told us to tell others in Mark 16:15, "And he said unto them, $G_{\underline{}}$ ye into a the world, and preach the gospel to every creature." The disciple

Andrew, brought his brother Peter to Christ. We can bring other people to Christ by telling them about how Christ died for them. If Andrew did, so can we!

4. Giving to the Lord.

a. Always give 10 percent of what money you make to the Lord.

Malachi 3:10. "Bring ve all the tithes into the s that there may be meat in mine house..." The word tithe means 10 percent. For example, if you made one dollar, you should give 10 cents to God. If you made 10 dollars, you give to God. (Figure it out if you can.) b. Give your time to God by attending church. We learn more about God when we go to church. God said in *Hebrews 10:25*, "Not forsaking (leaving) the assembling of o_____ together, as the manner of some is;..." That means not to forget about going to church like many people forget about church on Sundays. c. Give God vour talents. If you can sing, play an instrument or have a talent at doing something, try to use it for God. David played a harp for God. A small boy gave his lunch to God and that lunch fed 5,000 people. Deuteronomy 16:10 says, "... thou shalt g unto the LORD thy God, according as the LORD thy God hath blessed thee:" 5. Obeying God's commandments.

Every commandment is important to follow. God said in Matthew 5:19, "Whosoever therefore shall b___ one of these least commandments, and shall teach men so, he shall be called the least in the kingdom of heaven: but whosoever shall do and teach them, the same shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven." There are no small commandments and big commandments. If God told us to do it, we should do it. People know we are Christians because we do what God tells us to do

God told us to:

a.	"O	your parents	" - <i>Ephesians 6:1</i> .

c. "... we ought to lay down our l____ for the brethren." (our brothers and sisters in the God's family) I John 3:16



Fear not, little flock; ...

Luke 12:32

Have you ever been scared? We all get scared sometime. Some-
thing in our lives will scare us eventually. Jesus Christ is a friend that
will help us in a time of FEAR. When we do not know where to turn,
what to do and where to go, we always have Jesus Christ's Words to
comfort us. I John 4:18 says, "There is no f in love; but perfect love
casteth out f: Many things can scare us: people, darkness, height,
animals etc. That is why God told us to "Fear Not" 63 times in the Bible. Learn not to fear:
I. When God allows bad things to happen in our lives.
There is a story in the Bible about a man named, Joseph. His broth-
ers hated him and sold him into slavery and they lied to their father saying
that he died. Joseph eventually became the most powerful person besides Pharaoh
(King of Egypt). His brothers were afraid because they thought he would have
revenge on them and kill them. Joseph told them not to FEAR because he learned
not to be afraid when he was going through hard times. Genesis 50:20 says, "But
as for you, ye thought evil against me; but God meant it unto g, to bring
to pass, as it is this day, to save much people alive." Learn not to fear what hap-
pens to us when bad things happen. God allows it to happen for a purpose to help
us become a strong Christian. Romans 8:28 says, "And we know that all things
work together for g to them that love God, to them who are the called
according to his purpose." We don't always understand what God is doing. Just
trust Him in all things.
1. Joseph did not fear but learned to:
A. Wait on the Lord.
Isaiah 40:31 says, "But they that w upon the LORD shall renew their
strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be
weary; and they shall walk, and not faint."
B. Go to God for help.
Matthew 11:28 says, "C unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy
laden, and I will give you rest."
C. Give his problems to God.
I Peter 5:7 says, "C all your care upon him; for he careth for
you."
II. When people try to discourage us for being Christians.
Daniel was a godly man in the Bible who tried to do the right thing all
the time. He prayed t times a day in <i>Daniel 6:10</i> . Some men did
not like it and made a law that he could not pray. If he prayed to God, he would be thrown into the lions' den. Daniel was not afraid but obeyed God
and prayed to Him. Daniel 6:10 says, " he kneeled upon his knees three
times a day, and p , and gave thanks before his God, as he did
aforetime." He was cast into the lions den for a whole night, but the lions did
not eat him. Daniel 6:22 says, "My God hath sent his a , and

A. Daniel learned not to fear because God's Word says:
1. I Chronicles 28:20 says, " for the LORD God, even my God, will be w
thee; he will not f thee, nor f thee,"
2. Psalms 115:10 says, " he is their h and their s"
3. Psalms 34:4 says, "I sought the LORD, and he heard me, and delivered me
from all my f"
B. Daniel learned not to be afraid but to:
1. " Be strong and of good c , and do it: fear not, nor be
dismayed:" - I Chronicles 28:20.
2. "T in the LORD with all thine heart; and lean not unto
thine own understanding." - Proverbs 3:5.
III. When standing up for God.
There were three Hebrew men in the Bible named Shadrach,
Meshach and Abednego. These men stood up to the king when the
king made a law that all the people had to bow down to his statue.
They said they would not bow down to that idol. The king told them if
anyone who did not bow to the statue would be thrown into the fiery
furnace. The three Hebrew men said this: Daniel 3:17-18, "If it be so, our God
whom we serve is able to deliver us from the burning fiery furnace, and he will
deliver us out of thine hand, O king. But if not, be it known unto thee, O king,
that we will not s thy gods, nor worship the golden image which thou
hast set up." The king was very angry and threw them into the fiery furnace
immediately. To the king's surprise these men did not die and a fourth person
was there "like the Son of God." Jesus was there with them. Jesus will always be
there to help you through times like these. Never fear or be afraid to do the right
thing because God will take care of you.
A. The three Hebrew men were not afraid but learned:
1. God takes care of the sparrows, He will take care of you.
Luke 12:6-7, " not one of them is forgotten before God? Fear not therefore:
ye are of more v than many sparrows."
2. God will deliver you from your troubles.
Psalms 34:6, "This poor man cried, and the LORD heard him, and s
him out of all his troubles."
3. God will comfort you.
Psalms 23:4, " I will fear no evil: for thou art with me; thy rod and
thy staff they c me."
God does not want us to fear. If you have received Christ as
your Savior, then you have the best friend in the world to help you go
through troubles. It even gets better. As a child of God, the Holy Ghost
lives in you. The Holy Ghost will comfort you. <i>John 14:26-27</i> says,
"But the Comforter, which is the Holy Ghost, whom the Father will send in my
name, Peace I leave with you, my peace I give unto you: not as the world giveth,
give I unto you. Let not your heart be t, neither let it be
afraid." With Jesus and God the Father beside us and the Holy Ghost in us, we
have no need to fear.

God showed us true love by keeping us.
Hebrews 13:5 " I will never l thee, nor forsake

John 10:29, "My Father, which gave them me, is g than all;

Romans 8:39, "Nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to
s us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our
Lord."
When we recieve Christ as our Saviour, he keeps us. We will
never have to worry about losing our salvation becasue God keeps
us and will never leave us. We are God's children forever!
God showed us true love by protecting us.
John 10:14, "I am the good s, and know my sheep, and am
known of mine."
God takes care of His own children. Think of all the many things that he
protects us from every day. Good shepards protect their flock from danger. In
Matthew 18;10, it says that the "little ones" have "their angels" which means
God us His children. Never be afraid when God is near, protecting us.
There are many other things that God shows His love in. God's example of
love tells us that He loves us. The love of God is in us if we are saved through
Jesus Christ.
We should show God's love by:
1. Loving the Lord thy God.

2. Many Jews knew that the Messiah or God would come someday and
be born just like us because the Bible said so. Isaiah 9:6, "For unto us a child
is b, unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon his
shoulder: and his name shall be called Wonderful, Counsellor, The mighty
God, The everlasting Father, The Prince of Peace."
3. The Bible talked about Jesus being born of a virgin. Isaiah 7:14,
"Therefore the Lord himself shall g you a sign; Behold, a virgin
shall conceive, and bear a s, and shall call his name Immanuel."
Before we go into the Christmas story, remember that Jesus is
God and existed before He came down to earth as a baby.
The Wonderful Story of the First Christmas Gift, God's Son, Jesus.

barn and laid "in a manger" (Luke 2:7). At that same time there were shepherds
taking care of their sheep when angels appeared to them. Luke 2:9,13-14, "And, lo,

What God wants us to do with our mouths.


1. Speak with Charity
I Corinthians 13:1, "Though I speak with the tongues of men and of an-
gels, and have not c, I am become as sounding brass, or
a tinkling cymbal."
Always try to be kind with our words. No one likes mean - talking people
2. Speak the truth
Ephesians 4:25, "Wherefore putting away l , speak every man
truth with his neighbour: for we are members one of another."
If we tell somebody something but do not know all the facts for sure
and we say it, we are not telling the truth. God wants us to always say the
truth no matter what.
3. Speak to bring life or to build up someone.
Proverbs 18:21, "Death and l are in the power of the
tongue: and they that love it shall eat the fruit thereof."
Try to encourage people and not to put them down. It is a
hard thing to do, but God wants us to talk about people's good points and
not talk about their bad points.
4. Speak softly
Proverbs 15:1, "A s answer turneth away wrath: but
grievous words stir up anger."
Learn not to yell and wine. We need to speak respect-
fully and properly at all times.
5. Speak shortly
Ecclesiastes 5:2, "Be not rash with thy mouth, and let not thine heart be
h to utter any thing before God: for God is in heaven, and thou
upon earth: therefore let thy words be f "
I Thessalonians 4:11, "And that ye study to be $q_{\underline{}}$, and to do
your own business, and to work with your own hands, as we commanded
you;"
God wants us to be quiet and not talk for a long time. Learn to keep
your words short and to the point.
6 Sneak slowly (well thought out words)


James 1:19, "Wherefore, my beloved brethren, let every man be swift to

Think before you talk! We would be in a lot less trouble if we would
think about what we are going to say before we blurt out words. That is the
best way to control our mouth.
What God does NOT want us to do with our mouths.
1. Speak Loudly (Clamor is yelling, fussing)
Ephesians 4:31, "Let all bitterness, and wrath, and anger,
and clamour, and espeaking, be put away from you,
with all malice:"
We should never lift our voices to anyone. Try to keep
our voices soft. God does not want us to be loud and boistrous to others,
especially to parents.
2. Debate (arguing in the wrong way)
II Corinthians 12:20, "For I fear, lest, when I come, I shall not
find you such as I would, and that I shall be found unto you
such as ye would not: lest there be d, envyings,
wraths, strifes, backbitings, whisperings, swellings, tumults:"
We do not have to have the last word. Arguing is wrong. We listen to
our authority and obey, not argue.
3. Backbite
Psalms 15:3, "He that backbiteth not with his t, nor doeth evil to his neighbour, nor taketh up a reproach against
his neighbour."
If the person is not there to defend themselves then do not talk about
them in a bad way in front of others. Hold your mouth from talking about
others at all times. 4. Curse.
Exodus 20:7, "Thou shalt not take the name of the LORD thy God
in vain; for the LORD will not hold him g
that taketh his name in v"
Never curse God's name by saying it without rever-
ence. Do not even say swear words or words that sound like swear words.
Keep our mouth pure and clean from words that sound like swear words.
5. Use Guile (saying something you do not mean to get your own way -
deceiving others).
I Peter 3:10, "For he that will love life, and see good days, let him refrain
his tongue from evil, and his lips that they s no guile:"
Never say things that you do not really understand to deceive others.
Some examples would be saying, "I love you" to a boyfriend or girlfriend;
making up a story to make people like you; and impressing others with
stories that are not true.







The big question is **who** are you going to serve? Will it be **God**? Or will it be the **Devil**? We cannot serve both at the same time. We must choose only one. Who will you choose? Let's take a look at each one and then you can decide who you will serve.

Where did the Devil come from?




What is the Devil like?

How do you get baptised?

1. You have to be saved or a believer, first.

Acts 8:12 "But when they b_____ Philip preaching the things concerning the kingdom of God, and the name of Jesus Christ, they were baptized, both men and women."

2. You must be put under the water - not sprinkled or poured with water.

Mark 1:10, "And straightway coming u__ o__ of the water, he saw the heavens opened, and the Spirit like a dove descending upon him:" Jesus came out of the water which means He was under the water. Acts 8:38-39, "... and they went down both into the water, both Philip and the eunuch; and he baptized him. And when they were come u__ o_ of the water, the Spirit of the Lord caught away Philip, that the eunuch saw him no more: and he went on his way rejoicing." The Ethiopian went into the water and came up out of the water.



2. You are not being saved again.

Ephesians 2:8-9, "For by grace are ye s_____ through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast."

3. There is no magical feeling. Praying, reading your Bible, witnessing and getting baptized are obeying God's commandments. We are doing what God told us to do. Baptism is a command. For example: if your parents told you to take out the garbage - you do it. We don't get special feelings for doing it. We're just being obedient. Ask your pastor about getting baptized.







Many people do not know much about the Holy Spirit. Most people think the Holy Spirit is a "spirit" or ghost. Some think the Holy Spirit is a force like Star Wars.

What does the Bible say the Holy Spirit is? Here are some questions we will try to answer.

Who is the Holy Spirit? Where is the Holy Spirit? What does the Holy Spirit do?

Who is the Holy Spirit?

- 1. The Holy Spirit is God. Matthew 28:19, "Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the $n_{_}$ of the Father, and of the Son, and of the $H_{_}$ $G_{_}$:"The Holy Spirit is not greater or less than God the Father or God the Son. That is why it says "name" not "names" One God in three persons.
 - **2.**The Holy Spirit is a person.
- **a.** The Holy Spirit is called the Holy Ghost, Spirit of truth, Spirit of God, Comforter, Spirit of the Lord, Spirit of Christ, Spirit of adoption and some other names. The Holy Spirit is always referred to as He, Him or His. John 14:16 17, "And I will pray the Father, and he shall give you another Comforter, that he may abide with you for ever; ¹⁷ Even the S______ of truth; whom the world cannot receive, because it seeth him not, neither knoweth him: but ye know him; for he dwelleth with you, and shall be in you." You would not call your dad an "it" but "him."
- **b.** He has a personality. You can grieve Him, lie to Him and resist Him. *Ephesians 4:30 "And g____ not the holy Spirit of God, whereby ye are sealed unto the day of redemption."* Remember to talk to Him. Most people have forgotten to talk to the Holy Spirit.

Where is the Holy Spirit?







world h you." Learn to be separate from the world. Do not
talk bad like the world does, act bad like the world does, dress bad like the
world does. Live like God wants us to. Be separate from the world's sin.

cup of the Lord, and the cup of devils: ye cannot be partakers of the Lord's
table, and of the table of devils."
We need to separate from anything that is used by the devil.
There are many things that are controlled by the devil: Rock'n
Roll, country, pop and rap music, magic, dancing, drinking,
smoking, drugs, swearing, TV, bad movies We should never do what
the devil does. Be separate from the devil.
3. Our Flesh. The part of us that does wrong things or sins is our
flesh. No one had to teach us to sin, it is natural. If we do not
control ourselves from sin, it will take us over and control us.

If you are going away from something, you must be coming close to something else. We must separate ourselves from the world, the devil and our flesh and get close to God.

Here are some things we need to separate ourselves to God.



 - We should work instead of play.
 - We should try to learn instead of always wanting to be entertained.
 - We should obey instead of being rebellious.

We should pray that God gives us good attitudes like Jesus had.

3. Separate our life to God. Mark 12:30, "And thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy h_____, and with all thy soul, and with all thy m____, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment."

Every part of our lives and talents should be controlled by God. Find something you can do for God.






...Yield yourselves unto God,...

Romans 6:13

The word "yield" is a small word with a big meaning. It means "to submit to or, give way or place to, to comply with." We must learn to give God all of ourselves. First, we have to understand what we are made of when God created us. Just like an egg with three parts (the shell, white and the yoke). We are a 3-part being (Body, soul and spirit). We must learn to give God every member or part of ourselves. Many things have 3-parts like water, ice and vapor; Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and many others. We need to yield our body, soul and spirit to God. God told us to love Him with all three parts of our being in *I Thessalonians 5:23, "And the very God of peace sanctify you wholly; and I pray God your whole s______ and s____ and b____ be preserved b_____ unto the coming of our Lord Jesus Christ."*

We need to yield all of ourselves.

I. Our body needs to be yielded to God. I Corinthians 6:19, "...know ye not that your body is the t_____ of the Holy Ghost which in in you..." Our body is called the flesh in the Bible. It includes our appetite and what our body needs to survive. It is very important that we take care of our bodies for God. It is very hard to serve God when we are unhealthy and sick. Eat right and do not eat junk food, for your body is the temple of God. To take care of the body, we have to take care of it with physical things. Our body is important to God, so make sure we wear modest clothing. God hates nakedness.

- our ears should be listening to preaching, teaching, singing and God; not wrong types of music (Rock'n Roll, Country and Rap), dirty stories and backbiting. Keep the earrings on women not men.

2. Our hands and arms

- our hands should be used for working, cleaning, cooking, serving, handing the Bible skillfully, playing an instrument for God; not fighting, stealing, touching the opposite sex before mar-

riage and writing ungodly things. Our arms and other places should

never have tattoo's on them. Leviticus 19:28, "Ye shall not make any
c in your flesh for the dead, nor p in your flesh for the dead, nor p
any marks upon you: I am the LORD."
3. Our feet and legs
- It is always proper for women and men to cover their legs and
thighs no matter how hot it gets. (That would go for the shirts also. Keep
your shirt on!)
- Make our feet pure by giving out the gospel and by staying out
of wrong places such as dances, bars and casinos.
B. The clothes that we wear over our bodies need to be modest.

wear a shirt and pants. God hates nakedness.

nakedness. Modest clothing is not tight.
II. Our soul needs to be yielded to God. Psalms 86:2, "P
•
my soul;" Our soul is the core of our being. We call it the heart some-
times. Our soul longs for God and spiritual things of God and why we exist
for God. This area of our being called the soul is ignored by many. The way
we take care of our soul is by feeding it spiritual things: Reading our Bibles ;
Praying; Witnessing; Going to Church; learning about God; Loving
God; Singing spiritual songs, hymns, psalms and Obeying God's Word.
III. Our spirit needs to be yielded to God. Psalms 51:10, "Create in me
a clean heart, O God; and renew a r spirit within me. "Our spirit
is our feelings, emotions and mentality (the way we think). We need to pro-
tect our feelings and our mind from wicked things. The
body heals quickly but the mind heals very slowly. Watch
what we do with our mind and emotions. We take care of CARELESSNESS
our spirit by feeding it emotional and mental things as IS DANGEROUS
thinking on eternal things and pondering ideas.
A. Watch what you put in your mind with bad music, bad movies,
fantasies, daydreaming and bad books. Matthew 12:35, "A good man out of
the good treasure of the h bringeth forth good things: and an
evil man out of the evil treasure bringeth forth evil things."
B. Stay away from dating now and when you're older. It
leaves emotional scars. God does not want our minds to be
" c from the simplicity that is in
Christ." II Corinthians 11:3
C. Learn to keep your mind active by studying the Bible. II
Timothy 2:15, "Study to shew thyself a unto God, a
workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of
<i>t</i> ."

We are servants to whoever we yield to and obey! Try to be servants of **God** and not servants of the **Devil**!




