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Update from the Commodore

First of all, if you are not already aware, we did have a bit of bad news over the winter concerning our clubhouse. Apparently, the dishwasher had been operated sometime in December and sprung a leak. It went undetected until early January at which time, Joe Rodriguez, with help from his co-house chairs, Steve Hurbanek and John Allen, made repairs. But, damage to the facility was sustained and an insurance claim for repairs was initiated. Our contractor, Servpro has been at the clubhouse since February 17th performing remediation and restoration activities. Unfortunately, the repairs have resulted in the cancellation of the St. Patrick's Day party and will require the Commissioning to be rescheduled after repairs are complete.

The implementation of the annual billing policy combined with the transition to credit card billing has been largely successful. Although some members still prefer to pay dues by check, the use of credit cards has streamlined the billing process and improves predictability for club financials. Please consider transitioning your annual dues payments to credit card next year.

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Our social scene led by Ginger Vallaster and Linda Schrum has been amazing! I hope you all have seen the pictures and updates being provided by Ted Brockman on our website and CFYC Members Facebook page. Don't Miss the Blessing of the Fleet

The Cape Fear Yacht Club will sponsor the 2020 Blessing of the Fleet at 2 p.m., Sunday, March 15th at the Southport Waterfront (Please try to arrive by 1:30 PM to allow for lining up logistics and safety guidance). The Southport Historical Society cannon, THOR, will fire a round to initiate the ceremony. The Blessing Boat Flip Flop, a 36 foot Tiera sports fisherman, skippered by Dave Weigel, will be anchored near the city pier.

All boats, power and sail, big and small, pleasure, commercial, Coast Guard, paddle and kayaks are encouraged to participate in this annual event.

Boats are to gather between Marker 18 in the Cape Fear River and Marker 1 in the ICW monitoring Channel 78.

A safety boat will assist with lining all vessels up in order and then the procession will proceed past the Blessing Boat to receive a blessing and flower.

The Blessing of the Fleet is a tradition that began centuries ago in Mediterranean fishing villages. The blessing from Rector Eric Mills, St. Philips Episcopal Church, and Chaplin of the Cape Fear Yacht Club, is meant to ensure a safe and bountiful season. For

decades it has been embraced by U.S. yacht clubs to mark the beginning of the season. The Blessing is free to all and all are welcome

Cruising into 2020

The Cape Fear Yacht Club with the support of Plastic Ocean Project and Duke Energy will conduct an Earth Day Cleanup event at Dutchman Creek Park and Boat Launch on April 18, 2020. This community event will take place from 9:00AM-12:00PM and be followed by a BBQ and Open House at the Cape Fear Yacht Club located across from the park.

Participants are asked to bring their own bucket or use "multi-use" collection bags in order to minimize plastic impact to the environment. Cape Fear Yacht Club requests participants with small watercraft (dinghies, kayaks, paddle boards) to cruise the shoreline to retrieve floating plastics, styrofoam and trash.

In case of inclement weather, this event will be held the following day on April 19th from 9:00AM-12:00PM.

Updated Social Policies

One of the initiatives discussed by the Board of Governors was to ensure that our various social events provide a positive cash flow to the club. We simply cannot have social events dipping into our club reserves. To that end, several social policy changes are being implemented to assist event organizers in meeting that goal. They are outlined as follows;

-Improved Event Administration: A) The club will be implementing steps to ensure that event participants and guests are properly registered when they arrive at the clubhouse. This will take the form of a sign-in desk and issue of some type of identification that registration has been completed (hand stamp, wristband, etc.). This is particularly important in some of our larger events where it is nearly impossible to control the flow of participants in and out of the event. B) In order for event organizers to have a predictable budget, they must understand how many folks can be expected for a specific event. The clubhouse also has physical constraints that limit the number of folks that can be reasonably served at one time. To this end, the board has adopted a 7-day cancellation policy for all events unless otherwise

specifically stated. This means that if you RSVP for an event (Evite or otherwise) you will be charged for the event unless you cancel at least 7 days in advance of the event date. This way, organizers have the opportunity to allow additional participants if

registration is full, or to make changes in the event amenities based on participation numbers. Again, this works towards ensuring a positive cash flow.

-Better control of Bar Expenses: All participants will pay their event fees and bar expenses via a credit card on-file or one provided to the bar at registration. Occasionally, participants have left events without settling up with the club.

This requires that members track down individuals after the event for payment. This is not how any other establishment works, and the club is no different.

It is understood that some of these changes are a departure from how the club has done it in the past, but this is all done to ensure the viability of the club and ultimately build the value of membership
