Volunteers Needed!

In planning for the future of the Cape Fear Yacht Club, the Board of Governors is looking for one or two people to step up to fill the shoes of **Fleet Captain** and **Youth Sailing Director**. These positions are most important roles within the CFYC. Currently Rich Alt holds both positions as Fleet Captain and Youth Sailing Director, but due to other commitments is looking to have someone(s) mirror him to learn the ropes and take over. Rich is not going anywhere and will provide all the educational materials and background on both positions for as long as the new appointees want.

- 1. The position of **Fleet Captain** (a voting member of the Board of Governors) is primarily an administrative position as many of the sub-positions are filled with knowledgeable club members. This position oversees:
 - Asset management of a fleet of 12-Opti's, 12-420's, two skiffs (used as safety boats for YS), a 21' Catalina, storage trailer(s), and equipment/parts.
 - Race Committee & Protest Committee (sponsored sailboat racing inactive at this time, but may be resurrected)
 - Flotillas (July & December)
 - Fishing (tournament(s)/social event; inactive at this time)
 - Cruising; chaired by Don Feather
 - Kayaking/Canoeing/SuP Group (group currently formed but without a dedicated leader)
- 2. The YS Director's position is both administrative and hands on. It does require the office holder to spend a good share of 6 weeks (June-Aug) with the young instructors, students, and a great bunch of skillful club volunteers each day, Monday-Friday, for the six weeks of the program. While that may sound on the surface to be a daunting prospect, Rich and the other volunteers will be there to make the transition as smooth as possible.

This position oversees the following:

- Youth Sail Program (a 27+ year old program that is tried & true with well documented lesson plans and teaching tools, and works with Club volunteers.)
- Liaison with Oak Island Parks & Rec. in hiring youth instructors and student registrations
