The readings invite us to decide about our choices in our lives, fidelity or alienation from God. Shortly after God's people arrived in the promised Land, Joshua became their leader who gathered the people together to renew their Covenant with Yahweh. The people were going far from God and were reluctant to realize His presence with them. In the same way, Jesus is asking his disciples and His followers to accept Him, a living bread from heaven.

His listeners responded, "This is a hard teaching, who can accept it?" And they started going away because they were not ready for the demands of true discipleship. These demands are hard to believe for people who live in an exterior religion which is limited to material freedom. Jesus did not call his followers who were leaving to come back. He did not say, "You misunderstood me. What I said I meant symbolically." He knew they heard him clearly, and they understood him perfectly. Now it was a choice for the apostles and people to leave or follow him wholeheartedly. On this, Peter replied, "Master to whom shall we go? You have the word of eternal life." He did not say what Jesus was saying any better than those who were leaving Jesus, but as he said, we have come to believe and are convinced that you are the holy One of God. The words he uttered are of the spirit. These require disposition of faith in order to be understood. They transform us and make Jesus the center of our lives.

We believe the real presence of Jesus in the Holy Eucharist and when we participate in the Eucharist, we are not only reminded that Jesus died for us, but somehow we are united with the saving power of Jesus' loving and perfect sacrifice of Himself to the Father. When we participate in the Holy Mass, we place our own lives on the altar, along with all the things we suffer and the things for which we are grateful. In love, we offer ourselves to the Father along with Jesus.

Let us be deepened in our faith in the Holy Eucharist and to become the Eucharist for others.
