2018 Activities and Accomplishments:

- 6. May 20, 2018: Senior Recognition Sunday for FPC graduating high school seniors. held at 10 AM in the Narthex. Pineapple Sherbet Punch were served. Approximately 100-125 members partook of the refreshments.
- 7. June 10, 2018: Congregational Picnic Potluck Luncheon at 12:30 in the FLC gym. Catered by Chicken Express for the entrée. Side dishes and desserts provided by church members. 72 members attended. Bible Quizzes were placed on each table for participants to check their Bible knowledge and to promote conversation and fellowship.

- 9. August 12, 2018. Congregational Back-to-School & Rally 'Round Your Team Potluck at 12:30 PM in the FLC Gym. Hot dogs and Sloppy Joe's were prepared by the Fellowship committee. School classroom décor was furnished by Liz Kessler. 80 people attended.
- 10. October 28, 2018: Fun Fest for Children in FLC Fellowship Hallway at 4: PM. Provided punch and cookies.
- 11. New Organ Dedication Reception at 10:15 AM in Narthex following organ recital by our organist Nadine Wilkinson. Raspberry Punch and cakes were served.
- 12. December 16, 2018. Children's Christmas Pageant Cookie Reception at 10:30 in the FLC Fellowship Hallway. Cookies, Candies, Savories, hot cocoa and Cran-Raspberry Punch were served. 100-125 in attendance.
- 13. December 24, 2018. 7 PM Christmas Eve Service Cocoa/Cookie Reception following the worship service. 140 attended the service and most stayed to have fellowship afterwards.

Most of the events required members of Fellowship to assist with decorating and setting up tables the day before the event. They also prepared and provided food that was needed as well as serving such at the time of the event. And, of course, there was always the inevitable clean-up!

Accomplishments 2018:

- Held "First Steps" Prospective/New Member Orientation class on January 7, 2018. A second "First Steps" event was scheduled for June 9, 2018; however, no prospective or new members were able to attend this class. At each orientation class, Dr. Green was present to give an overview of the Christian faith, the Presbyterian tradition, and the mission and ministries of FPC Conroe. Numerous "church involvement' opportunities were explained to the participants by the leader of each ministry. Potential new members filled out "Time & Talent" forms and were encouraged to join any or several of these activities.
- Each new member was paired with a mentor (church member) to provide an instant connection to the church.
- Attendance sheets from each worship service were collected for recordkeeping.
- Birthday cards were sent monthly to children at Presbyterian Children's Homes and Services.
- The Welcome Center in the Narthex was maintained for the 9:00 and 11:00 a.m. Worship Service.

All FPC Members were informed by word, mail, and phone calls. Pictures were scheduled and taken. MISSION MINISTRY ANNUAL REPORT 2018 JANUARY 8, 2019

PURPOSE AND OBJECTIVES:

Our Mission Ministry is dedicated to serving God, putting our faith into action, spreading the Gospel with generosity and compassion, and helping those persons with physical, spiritual, emotional, and hunger issues in our local community and throughout the world.

Our objective continues to be developing hearts for Mission at FPC Conroe.

We do recognize that our congregation's dedication to mission work goes well beyond the scope of this Mission Ministry. FPC members dedicate their personal gifts directly to mission work. We also provide gifts and financial support from other sources such as The Mission Sewing Group, Presbyterian Women, Women of the Word, memorial giving, some Small Groups and Sunday School classes, and all the other volunteers who provide their time and financial support to the underserved at the Conroe House of Prayer (homeless), the Salvation Army Soup Kitchen, Family Promise (homeless), and The Human Trafficking Project.

Presbyterian Day School Annual Report 2018-2019 Director: Janet Klem

Purpose: The purpose of Presbyterian Day School shall be to minister, educate and nurture preschool and Kindergarten children of the church and the community through a weekday program with a Christian emphasis. The school's concern shall be for the total development of each child, spiritually, creatively, emotionally, intellectually, physically and socially. In addition, we strive to help each child grow in independence and social development, considering his or her own unique abilities and talents.

Student and Staff Population: Currently Presbyterian Day School has approximately 130 students and 23 staff members. We have openings in our Kindergarten classes at this time, and a couple of spots in our Pre-Kindergarten, but are currently full and have waiting lists in our Toddlers, Twos and Threes. Teachers must complete 24 hours of continuing education yearly, required by state licensing. All staff will be complete by March 1, 2018. Director is required to complete 32 hours of continuing education yearly with an emphasis on leadership, management and business skills. This requirement has been completed. Substitute teachers are also required to complete 24 hours of training yearly.

2018-2019 Accomplishments:

Over the summer, we were able to retile and paint the boys and girl's restroom. This gave the restrooms a nice fresh improvement.

Playgrounds were well maintained. Two new playground climbing pieces were added to the toddler playground. Bright red and blue awnings were added to the large playground. One awning covers the swings and the other awning gives the children a space to picnic or gather for classroom activities. These additions to the playground, as well as the bathroom improvements, were funded through money raised by "Fiesta", our annual fundraiser.

PDS continues to offer Spanish, Music and Movement to our Toddlers-Kindergarten. Our Kindergarten and Pre-Kindergarten classes receive Art and Science on Wednesdays.

We continue to have "Praise and Worship" with FPC Music Director- Brandon Folts on Wednesday mornings. On Sunday, November 11, our Kindergarten and Pre-Kindergarten children participated in the Veteran's service at 11:00am and sang some of their praise and worship songs to the FPC congregation.

EZ Care is still our computer program we use to keep our information organized and updated.

Facebook is being monitored by staff member Janice Kuhl. This source of media seems to work well with our families.

PDS partnered once again with the Montgomery County Sheriff's Department for the second annual "Blue Elf" toy drive. We collected enough toys from our families to fill two large boxes. What a wonderful way to teach our children the gift of giving and helping out children who are less fortunate in their own community.

We continue to sponsor a child through Compassion International - Philanthropy Project

Scholastic Book Fair continues to be a huge success for our day school. This year the money we raised will be used for classroom/teacher needs. Our parents and children love shopping for books.

Lonestar Community Center of Montgomery will once again be our venue for our "Fiesta 2019" Fajitas and the traditional sides will be served, as well as a salsa/chip bar. We will place an announcement in the "The Link" to invite and encourage FPC participation. Save the date- **Friday, March 1**st.

FPC children and PDS Kindergarten delighted the congregation this year with our traditional Christmas Pageant on December 16.

PDS curriculum and special programs continue.

- PDS is still offering Spanish and Music/Movement to all children.
- Science Lab continues on Wednesdays for Kindergarten and Pre-Kindergarten
- Art is provided to our Kindergarten and Pre-Kindergarten on Wednesdays.
- Kindergarten and Pre-Kindergarten teachers received training over the summer on our "Super Kids" curriculum, which is a huge PDS Kindergarten tradition.
- "Happily Ever After" has been a success in our Pre-Kindergarten reading readiness program. Teachers were trained to use the entire program during this school year and found it to be very successful in the classroom.
- Paul Evans (Master Gardener) volunteered again this year to teach our children about gardening. He has come up this year to plant seasonal vegetables with all classes. Our children love "Farmer Paul".
- Kindergarten continues to visit P-6 Farms for their annual field trip.
- Kindergarten celebrates 50th day of school with the 4th annual "sock hop" Everything from root-beer floats to the bunny-hop.
- DRA (Developmental Reading Assessment) continues in Kindergarten.
- "Kinder Camp" is still part of our Kinder program. Teachers and students meet in the summer prior to the start of the school year. Children, teachers and parents enjoy this time for introductions.
- Special programs are still an important part of PDS. We start the year off with "Blessings of the Back Backs "continue with Donuts with Dad for Kindergarten and Pre-Kindergarten, Fellowship Mall/ Open House(this year we added a bake sale and raised money for our scholarship program), Fire Truck visit for Fire Prevention Month, Scholastic Book Fairs, Thanksgiving programs and Feasts for Pre-Kinder and Kindergarten, Christmas Program and participation in FPC Christmas Pageant, visit from Santa, FPC Gingerbread House Event, Storyteller and Pajama Day, Texas Cowboy Hoedown and Pony Rides, Mad Science Week and Science Fair for Pre-Kinder and Kindergarten, Wonders of the Woodlands, Patty the Puffin / Dental Health Month, Vision and Hearing Screening provided by Conroe Service League and Conroe Noon Lion's Club for Pre-Kinder and Kindergarten, Parent Appreciation Breakfast, Staff Appreciation Luncheon provided by our wonderful parents, Mother's Day Luncheon- Kindergarten, and a Basketball program led by Coach LaTaunya.

"Stay and Play", our afterschool program, is still under supervision of Kathy Haines.

"Wiz Kids" is still a popular program at PDS, Director/ Gwen Henderson and teacher/Trish Meadors. Offered on Wednesdays to Pre-Kinder and Kindergarten only.

2019 Goals and Objectives

Continue to work with Kim White/Director of Christian Education to invite and welcome our families to come and worship at FPC. Information about the church was included in the registration packets this year.

Be willing to offer classes and make changes in our program when the needs in our community is necessary.

Encourage more FPC members to attend "Fiesta", our annual fundraiser.

Place monthly PDS stories and announcements in FPC "The Link".

Teachers shall be willing to teach the principles of a Christian Day School.

Classes (3's-Kindergarten) attend Chapel on Tuesdays and Thursdays to learn about the Bible and about the love our Father in Heaven has for all of us.

The Presbyterian Women's Team is comprised of the officers and circle leaders. Team meetings are held monthly except December, June and July. Three circles meet September - May in the morning and one in the evening to accommodate working women. The 2018-2019 Presbyterian Team year is from June – May.

Honorary Life Membership was awarded to Ann Kate and Ann Johnson in May 2018.

2018 Activities:

- Circles held monthly meetings for devotion and Bible study September May.
- Gatherings are held in the fall and spring and are open to women of the church and their guests. The April 7, 2018 Spring gathering featured an informative and light-hearted program by Linda Crum on blue birds. The October 18, 2018 Fall Gathering was a mini day retreat led by Rev. Dr. Nora Fitch, Senior Pastor at St. Thomas Presbyterian Church, followed by a worship service and communion. Dr. Nancy Dawson was the accompanist and Marty Taylor led voices lifted in praise. Several visitors from other congregations attended. Annetta Rose provided lovely table decorations and favors for both events.
- Baptismal boxes for infants and children baptized in the church are provided, led by Martha Haines.
- Monthly birthday celebrations are held at the Conroe Health Center, with each circle providing assistance in serving and singing. Brandon Folts, Music Director, generously provides his time with song and keyboard to make this a memorable time for residents.
- 105 Seamen's boxes were packed and delivered to the Houston International Seafarer's Center in late November. Items for the boxes were provided by the circles and others in the congregation, led by Susan Buckley. The Mission Sewing group provides knitted caps for these boxes.
- Days for Girls is an on-going service project that provides resources, materials and time to make kits of reusable feminine hygiene items for the international non-profit organization. Shirley Dukes leads this effort for our church.
- Monetary and prayerful support is provided to MOPS (Mothers of Pre-Schoolers), led by Kim White. This group
 equips moms to achieve their potential as mothers, women, and leaders in relationship with Jesus and their
 church. Circle members help with the nursery during meeting times.
- Benevolence Giving includes the Spring Gathering Birthday Offering (\$379 in 2018), which benefits women and children mission projects. The Fall Gathering Thank Offering, which totaled \$395 this year, is distributed 1/3 to Presbytery and 2/3 to a local charity selected each year. The local gift in 2018 was provided to The Montgomery County Women's Center to help women and their children who have escaped abusive domestic situations.
- Ongoing support to helping victims of sex trafficking is provided through Freedom Place, located in Montgomery County. Sally DeStefano leads this effort, which includes teaching life skills to rescued girls and coordinating

- delivery of donations from various individuals from our church. The church donated 50 upholstered chairs to Freedom Place for its school and meeting rooms.
- Fellowship of the Least Coin is collected each month during circle meetings and sent to Presbytery to support education for women through grants.
- Our women participate in many aspects of church life including Family Promise, Salvation Army Soup Kitchen, Meals on Wheels, Wednesday Night Live, Mission Sewing, Vacation Bible School, and other Christian outreach activities.
- Circles have adopted various areas of the church for regular special TLC deep cleaning. They also wash the sanctuary shawls on a monthly basis.
- Funeral/Memorial receptions at the church are offered and provided if desired to families, both members and non-members. Circles provide cookies and punch for receptions.
- Esther Circle retired this year and its remaining members were welcomed into other circles with open arms. Esther Circle has been a vibrant part of our PW fellowship for over 40 years.
- Women new to the church are personally contacted and welcomed.

Wednesday Night Kitchen Crew 2018

The Wednesday Night Kitchen Crew consists of approximately sixteen members who enjoy providing a good meal and an opportunity for fellowship for our church family.

The Wednesday Night Kitchen Crew cooked dinner for fourteen Wednesday Night Live meetings for a total of 851 individual meals. Several times Family Promise was included. In addition to that, several meals were sent to homebound members every week.

The Wednesday Night Kitchen Crew also helped in the kitchen for the Chili Cook-off and the youth fund raiser dinner. Individual members also manned the kitchen for the Sew-a-thon and various other church and Fellowship committee activities including the Presbytery Meeting. Several days were spent cleaning the kitchen. The Crew also provided many staple items and supplies for the kitchen including a new set of tablecloths.
