

Humble Beginnings Sunday, March 9, 1939



It was the height of the great depression. Conroe, a rural logging community, was still struggling to find its identity. A small group of faithful Christians met together in a High School Auditorium.

At that unlikely time and in that unlikely place, they each pledged to support and to participate in the work of a new congregation—the First Presbyterian Church of Conroe. Through their sustained work and the blessings of God, and through the work of successive generations, the congregation continues this mission today. And is preparing to carry this ministry into the distant future.

From humble beginnings, the First Presbyterian Church of Conroe has been committed to the great work of a Christian community, the work of worshiping God, providing opportunities for education, caring for the diverse peoples within our community, and maintaining a physical presence in Montgomery County.

Worship

From its humble beginnings, the First Presbyterian Church of Conroe has upheld the Biblical Faith of the Reformed Tradition. The style of music and the dress of participants has always reflected its time, but the Biblical foundations of worship continue even today.

The congregation is also moved by the deeply held value of inviting others to participate in worship with us. Some of this is reflected in the church's locations—from the school auditorium, to the original sanctuary near downtown Conroe, and now on North Loop 336 West. The congregation has also used technology to reach into the community—from radio broadcasts of the worship services to live-streaming on the internet.

Education

In the 1830s, Presbyterians came to Texas as missionaries. They travelled great distances and endured unimaginable hardships. Their writings tell us that the most compelling reason for the journeys was to create an opportunity for their children to receive an education.

In the 1930s, the First Presbyterian Church of Conroe was organized in the auditorium of a public school. The importance of supporting education is deeply woven into the identity of the church. Countless members have volunteered as tutors and mentors. The congregation has hosted English as a Second Language (ESL) classes that were opened to the community.

Today, FPC is home to the Presbyterian Day School (PDS), one of Montgomery County's premier providers of early childhood and preschool education. Each year, more than 100 children (toddlers through kindergarten) and their families are blessed through the work of the PDS teachers and staff.

The church's commitment to Christian Education is seen in the wide variety of programs, events, and activities. Childcare is provided free of charge for families attending church activities, the Youth are actively engaged in Bible Studies and mission projects. Presbyterian Women Circles (small groups) and Bible Studies are open to the congregation and the community.

Caring for Souls

The responsibility to care for others is deeply woven into the identity of the First Presbyterian Church of Conroe. The decision to move the church to its current location was driven, in part, by a compelling desire to be located close to people who would be here in the future.

Within and from these walls, the congregation works tirelessly to support others in need. Working in partnerships with others, the church hosts *Family Promise*, a program helping homeless families transition to being housed. We collectively prepare and serve more than 14,000 meals each year. We prepare quilts for distressed children, provide Christmas gifts for seafarers, and much more.

The congregation also cares for its own family as well. This support is visible through organized programs; including Stephen Ministry, small groups, and home-communion teams. This support is lived out in life-long friendships and partnerships. The First Presbyterian Church can be known for our love for God and our love for each other.
