Lee's daughters designated the Mission Sewing Group as the recipient of any donations that were given to the church in her name. As such, the sewing group decided to make the quilt and raffle it off. The proceeds will be donated to The Forever Fund, in memory of Lee. The winning raffle ticket will be drawn at the 2020 Sew-a-Thon, which will be held on February 29th. 

The next step will be for the niche holders to choose which niche(s) they will own. When the method for choosing the selection is confirmed, the niche holders will be notified and a certificate or ownership, including the niche location, will be provided. If you have not yet seen the columbarium, you are encouraged to do so. It is beautiful piece of art and not only fills its intended purpose, but also brings another lovely addition to our already beautiful facility.
