
PDS Teams with FPC for a Special Presentation

First Presbyterian Church Members Contribute to the Community In Generous Ways



More than 14,000 meals a year are served to the needy and hungry in Montgomery County by the members of First Presbyterian Church - Conroe. The primary recipients of this mission are guests of the Salvation Army, the Conroe House of Prayer, Family Promise of Montgomery County and clients of Meals on Wheels. Many church volunteers are involved in these and other efforts, some for many years and others more recently who are new to our church. Our youth also participate in these activities. The Feed the Hungry mission is a vibrant exam-

ple of how the Body of Christ can regularly reach out in love to those less fortunate, to provide a warm meal and caring fellowship.

Salvation Army. Lunches are provided every Monday to needy men, women, and children by 4 to 5 FPCC cooking teams who arrive at 9:00 a.m. to cook, serve, and clean up. Between 110 and 180 meals are distributed on what is jokingly referred to as "Meatball Monday" for the traditional menu served.



Conroe House of Prayer. On the second Tuesday every month, FPCC provides breakfasts to 50 to 75 people gathered for a sing-along, sermon, and full breakfast. The 4-6 member cooking team bring food already prepared, and serve it to men, women, and children of all ages. This program for the needy and homeless includes not only food and spiritual nurturing, but also warm blankets and clothing.



Family Promise. Several times a year for one full week, FPCC members host families who would otherwise be homeless. Volunteers provide transportation,

food, meal preparation and service, as well as hosting for dinner. Other volunteers "sleep over" with the guests in our Family Life Center, serving



breakfast snacks the next morning before the families leave for school, job search, and other activities to help them become self-supporting. We are blessed to have a facility with showers, separate sleeping areas, play areas, and a commercial kitchen that serves the needs of these families.

Meals on Wheels. For more than 25 years, FPCC members have helped provide hot meals and other food every weekday morning to shut-ins. Other services such transportation, referrals, and pet food are also extended to these "stuck-at-homers."
