Tenth Annual Sew-A-Thon

More than 100 people participated in the 10th Annual Sew-a-Thon on Saturday, February 23rd. There were 60 women sewing. Others tied quilts, ironed, cooked, decorated, set up, and cleaned. Gary Weinburger and Bill Harshbarger set up all the extension cords, so that no circuits were overloaded. Other men ironed, helped with decorating and carried sewing machines in and out for the women. Shirley Dukes and her cooking team prepared a delicious lunch; preparing the same menu that was served at the first sew-a-thon. Thanks to Trader Joe's, Wal-Mart and Sam's for their generous donations for the meal.

This was a banner year for the Sew-a-Thon. Quilters Quarters donated a \$50 gift certificate for the "Silent Auction". The "Silent Auction" raised \$1,251 and the Country Store brought in \$327.90. Another \$281.02 was donated to the Mission Sewing Group. That totals \$1,859.92 for the operation of the sewing group. The congregation generously donated \$580 to the

local chapter of "It's My Very Own Bags of Love", along with many, many items to go in the bags.
