This Week's Scripture Readings

Scripture Reading #1 (11:00 a.m.):

Genesis 15:1-6

- ¹ After these things the word of the LORD came to Abram in a vision: "Fear not, Abram, I am your shield; your reward shall be very great."
- ² But Abram said, "O Lord GOD, what will you give me, for I continue childless, and the heir of my house is Eliezer of Damascus?" ³ And Abram said, "Behold, you have given me no offspring, and a member of my household will be my heir."
- ⁴ And behold, the word of the LORD came to him: "This man shall not be your heir; your very own son shall be your heir." ⁵ And he brought him outside and said, "Look toward heaven, and number the stars, if you are able to number them." Then he said to him, "So shall your offspring be."
- ⁶ And he believed the LORD, and he counted it to him as righteousness.

Scripture Reading #2 (8:30 & 11:00):

Galatians 3:15-29

- ¹⁵ To give a human example, brothers: even with a man-made covenant, no one annuls it or adds to it once it has been ratified. ¹⁶ Now the promises were made to Abraham and to his offspring. It does not say, "And to offsprings," referring to many, but referring to one, "And to your offspring," who is Christ. ¹⁷ This is what I mean: the law, which came 430 years afterward, does not annul a covenant previously ratified by God, so as to make the promise void. ¹⁸ For if the inheritance comes by the law, it no longer comes by promise; but God gave it to Abraham by a promise.
- ¹⁹ Why then the law? It was added because of transgressions, until the offspring should come to whom the promise had been made, and it was put in place through angels by an intermediary. ²⁰ Now an intermediary implies more than one, but God is one.
- ²¹ Is the law then contrary to the promises of God? Certainly not! For if a law had been given that could give life, then righteousness would indeed be by the law. ²² But the Scripture imprisoned everything under sin, so that the promise by faith in Jesus Christ might be given to those who believe.

²³ Now before faith came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the coming faith would be revealed. ²⁴ So then, the law was our guardian until Christ came, in order that we might be justified by faith. ²⁵ But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a guardian, ²⁶ for in Christ Jesus you are all sons of God, through faith. ²⁷ For as many of you as were baptized into Christ have put on Christ. ²⁸ There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither slave nor free, there is no male and female, for you are all one in Christ Jesus. ²⁹ And if you are Christ's, then you are Abraham's offspring, heirs according to promise.

Stewardship Campaign for 2022

To fellow members of FPC-C:

I would like to update you on the status of our current Stewardship Campaign for the 2022 Budget. As of 12/22/21, we have received 88 pledges (13 of which are new pledges) for a total amount of \$503,033.18 or an average of \$5,716.29 per pledge. This is about 84% of the total pledge income needed to balance the 2022 Operating Budget. To date, there are still 22 pledging units (~\$86,700 in potential revenue) who made a commitment for the 2021 budget but have not, as of today, responded to the 2022 budget campaign. Those that have already made a commitment have done so generously, as witnessed by the average dollars per pledge. However, if we are to have any hope of balancing our 2022 Budget, we need the financial support of all of our members. I would encourage those who have not responded to prayerfully consider continuing your financial support of the church. If you intend to pledge, please submit your pledge as soon as possible so that we may finalize our 2022 Budget. I continue to pray (and hope that you do also) for the welfare and programs of our church.
