

Scripture Reading #1 (11:00 only):

Proverbs 10:27-32

- $^{\rm 27}$ The fear of the Lord prolongs life, but the years of the wicked will be short.
- ²⁸ The hope of the righteous brings joy, but the expectation of the wicked will perish.
- ²⁹ The way of the Lord is a stronghold to the blameless, but destruction to evildoers.
- ³⁰ The righteous will never be removed, but the wicked will not dwell in the land.
- ³¹ The mouth of the righteous brings forth wisdom, but the perverse tongue will be cut off.
- ³² The lips of the righteous know what is acceptable, but the mouth of the wicked, what is perverse.

Acts 9:1-12

- ¹ But Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest ² and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any belonging to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem.
- ³ Now as he went on his way, he approached Damascus, and suddenly a light from heaven shone around him. ⁴ And falling to the ground, he heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting me?"
 - ⁵ And he said, "Who are you, Lord?"

And he said, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. 6 But rise and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do."

⁷ The men who were traveling with him stood speechless, hearing the voice but seeing no one. ⁸ Saul rose from the ground, and although his eyes were opened, he saw nothing.
