
³ "I am Joseph!" he said to his brothers. "Is my father still alive?"

Presbytery Grants Awarded to Missions and PW Projects

FPC recently received two Presbytery of New Covenant grant awards of \$2,000 each. These grants help support some of our key mission projects. Since 2016, the Outreach grant has been awarded to FPC six times, and the Lynn Johnson Social Justice grant has been awarded five times. The countless volunteer hours of our church community and their additional donations of money and items are the fundamental resources, with these grants augmenting those efforts, all in the name of Christ and for the Glory of God.

Outreach Grant. The focus of funds from this grant is on the Conroe House of Prayer (CHOP), Salvation Army Soup Kitchen, and Family Promise of Montgomery County. Efforts are aimed to mitigate problems associated with the poor, homeless, and family displacements due to difficult life circumstances. The desired outcome is provision of basic needs for people without stable food supply and lodgings, bringing them into a caring Christian organization/community. Lynn Johnson Social Justice Grant. The focus of funds from this grant is on sex-trafficked/abused girls and boys, typically from ages 12 to 18, who are overcoming the trauma and emotional damage of sex slavery and/or abuse and seeking to reconstruct their lives through healing interventions and a safe place to recover, as well as placement with highly specialized foster or adoptive homes. Other efforts to support this challenged population, such as educational support and special events and assistance for them, also are supported by the grant funds. This project is supported by PW Circles, the Missions Ministry, and other members and volunteers in our church community. Please direct any questions to Sally DeStefano (936) 217-1333.
