- Each 4D participant is paired with an advisor for individualized support throughout the program.
- Our 4D curriculum is shaped around the goals and needs of cohort participants.
- Each cohort involves participants from multiple Northern Plains reservations.

The purpose of AIEF is to support American Indian, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian students in achieving their dreams of completing a post-secondary education. Our AIEF is a growing, nationally recognized program that goes above and beyond in supporting its scholarship students. Through AIEF, we seek out students of all ages who are focused on their educational goals, and who also demonstrate the ability to make positive changes in their lives and communities. We increase opportunities for students to access college funding for tribal or non-tribal colleges, universities, and vocational/technical schools, by providing scholarships and college grants, networking services and non-monetary support for scholarship recipients. This includes classroom supplies, mentoring, personal contact through email and phone calls, scholarship/fellowship resources and holiday care packages.

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Product Highlights



When you hear the words “hand sanitizer,” “dog beds” and “liquid hand soap,” usually the proper image of that product pops into your mind, right? But, did you know that there are multiple uses for these items? Google and Pinterest are wonderful resources to search for these kinds of ideas and knowledge.

There are 31 uses for hand sanitizer alone that don’t involve sanitizing hands! For instance, you can use hand sanitizer to clean make-up brushes, get stains out of clothes, or use it as deodorant in a pinch. I was amazed at all the things this little bottle of hand sanitizer can do.

Our dog beds also have diverse uses. You can use them for their intended purpose or you can get creative. For example, they could be used for a bathmat, a chair cushion or even car seat covers.

We generally have large quantities of liquid hand soap here in our distribution center.
